

At full-time, hospitality area bars remain open, as well as the Iron Bar for all supporters.



SCUNTHORPE UNITED v CHESTER

THE IRON SINCE 1899

MIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES UPS AND DOWNS CLOSE ENCOUNTERS WITH COUNTY AND WOMBWELL Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

A century ago, the merry month of March had arrived, and with it, the gusting winds of the lion that roars in at this time of the year, as winter is thankfully ear for the steelworker's team, and the Nuts could have no complaints. Then, on the first day of the month was the much anticipated visit of the Gainsborough Blue Boy to the Old Show Ground. Despite the racy conditions and disappointing attendance, United had a brilliant first half and stole the precious points. A 3-0 score line was all due to the smart thinking of centre forward Raby, who was having a brilliant season in punting the ball into the opponents net.

thinking of retreating back to the frozen North.

The first week of March 1924 was particularly windy, and had a cold edge to it. Chimney pots around the expanding steelworks town had smoke being blown away at right angles by the strength of the wind. Grit from the works was always in the air, and many a red eye was caused by some flying grit from this direction.

At his office, within the bowls of the Old Show Ground, Harry Allcock, United diligent secretary, would have peered through the top of his horn rimmed glasses and looked at a piles of money, bagged in copper, three-penny bits, and silver, that was in denominations of sixpences, shillings, two shillings, and half crowns. It was the takings from last Saturday's gate, against Gainsborough Trinity. Harry was a devout Methodist, and a curse never left his lips, but his mutterings said that there was not the usual mountain of cash, following a Gainsborough derby encounter. The truth was that many folks kept away from the Old Show Ground because of that howling gale.

During the next five days, Scunthorpe United had a pair of fixtures with Rotherham County Reserves. The first of these was at the Millmoor Ground, which, although abandoned by the present Rotherham United, still languishes at the side of the Doncaster to Sheffield railway line today, as a monument to memories of great football times. United assembled, on March 8th 1924, represented by the following team: Reynolds, goalkeeper, Bradbury and Franklin, fullbacks;

Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks, Broskom, Burkinshaw, Raby, Green and Foster, forwards. The notable absence being Kitchen for the first time, through having influenza.



The weather at Rotherham over the past week had been pretty wet and miserable, and had taken its toll on the Millmoor pitch, which resembled a ploughed field. It was to make neat soccer impossible, and during the first forty five minutes it was the defenders of both teams that had their say first. At the interval no side had registered. In the second half it was Wild who gave County the lead, but knew little about it, as the ball entered the net via his back! It was not until the dying moments of the match that a deserved equaliser came for the Nuts, from an accurate shot from Burkinshaw, but Raby, with several smart efforts close to scoring, was the pick of forwards. 1-1 was the final score.

The last seven days had been a busy time for Scunthorpe United, as two Saturday games were a sandwich to an away visit on the Monday. The first match was against a plucky Wath Athletic, whose defence doggedly fought to reduce the Nuts to a single goal, without reply. On the following Monday, the Nuts lined up at Denaby, and became the Yorkshire club's twelfth victim. The 5-1 reverse amounted to a thick

Scunny, and this was to play a part, on thirty minutes, for the only goal of another tight encounter. This arrived with the referee's silver pocket watch showing thirty minutes, and came from an unlikely source. Bradbury, United's right fullback must have felt like he was having a nose bleed after venturing so far up the field. Nonetheless, he just gave the ball a punt, and blinded by the bright sun in his eyes, the County Reserves keeper made a complete mess of catching the ball, and it drop behind him, into the gaping net. Thus it was three out of four points from the two close ties.

Unfortunately, money was a little bit tight in the pockets of the Scunthorpe public, and only a small attendance was scattered around the Show Ground perimeter fences, at kick-off time. It cannot be said if Wombwell had played in mid-week, but there certainly appeared to be some heavy legs in the home team.

As a spectacle, the climax of the first forty five minutes was the thought of a hot Bovril, not the entertainment. The stars of the Scunthorpe eleven were in the first six numbered shirts, where John Wogin was a safe pair of hands in goal. The forwards were very much off colour, and off target.

Johnnny Wogin made a welcome return, in goal

could play again. Kitchen was still under the weather, and, understandably, an unchanged team trotted onto the park, which at Scunthorpe was in slightly better condition that Millmoor. At least the sun was out at sunny Thankfully, Harry Allcock did not need to get the maps out for the next match, two days later, on Saturday March 15th 1924, because the Natty Nuts were at home again, on this occasion Wombwell were the Midland League visitors. However, Reynolds was indisposed, and replaced by the popular, and experienced John Wogin in the goalkeeper's green jersey, while Kitchen was again fit, and took over from Burkinshaw. Retford and Talbot were two former Nuts in the opposition team.

Nil to nil at the break, but then came the solitary moment of joy for home fanatics. A shuffled forward line found Broskom hitting the cross bar, but Raby pounced on the rebound to score. 1-0 was a good result after a disappointing match.







A BRIEF HISTORY

2010 will undoubtedly go down in the record books as one of the most momentous years in the history of football in Chester for both the wrong and the right reasons, thankfully with the latter being the most significant.

The local Council granted the lease of the former club's ground, the Deva Stadium, to the new club and the management team of Neil Young and Gary Jones was appointed. Seven days later the first five players were signed.

The side would achieve

were rewritten – most wins (33), fewest defeats (3), most points (107), most goals scored (103), best goal difference (+71) and also the longest unbeaten run (30 games).

It was a different story in the following season, with the side relegated out of the league at the death, only to be reinstated weeks later due to an expulsion.



Senior football had been played in the City for 125 years, a feat that was celebrated by fans at a packed event in June, but the year had started with the former club failing to fulfil a fixture and ultimately being expelled from the Football Conference. The final nail in the coffin arrived in March with the company being wound up in the High Courts following an action brought by HM Revenues and Customs. In many ways this was a relief, something akin to a wounded animal finally being put down.

back-to-back promotions and, having given the fans near heart failure in that first season the management and players decided to make things a little easier second time around with not only another promotion but a title secured in front of a crowd of 5,000 plus on Easter Monday with three games to spare! With 100 points gained 102 goals scored and only 29 conceded over another incredible season the journey continued.

Life in the Conference North would

The side staved off relegation until 2017-18 when they were sent down to the National League North, with COVID-19 curtailing a decent start three years later as they looked to mount a return.

Calum McIntyre took charge after an extremely impressive spell in charge of Runcorn Linnets. His first season in charge saw the Blues finish in third place in the

MANAGER Calum McIntyre

Calum was appointed as Chester FC Manager in May 2022, their seventh permanent managerial appointment since reformation. McIntyre was the club's full-time Academy Head Coach since 2016 until his appointment, and has also performed a variety of roles across the first team coaching staff – being involved in over 140 first team fixtures under three different management teams. It was in June 2020, when he took his first step into permanent senior management with Northern Premier Division One (West) side Runcorn Linnets.

GOALKEEPER

1. Wyll Stanway

Wyll joined the Blues in January 2022. The stopper arrived at the Deva Stadium from Lancaster City. Stanway started that season at Holker Old Boys, keeping six clean sheets in 12 appearances, before making the step up to the Northern Premier League side. He made 11 appearances Chester FC during 2021-22. Stanway started each of the final five games of the campaign and kept four clean sheets in the process. Wyll spent the 2022-23 campaign out on loan at three different clubs, the latter of which seeing him win Championship gold with Macclesfield.

10. Elliott Whitehouse

Age: 30 Nationality: English Position: Midfielder

Elliott Whitehouse made his stay at Chester FC a permanent one in June 2023. The midfielder's loan spell from Scunthorpe United at the back end of the 2022-23 campaign was short – making just seven appearances – but his impact was a hugely successful one.

Whitehouse scored three times as the Blues finished



3. Joel Taylor

He made his return to Chester FC in May 2023. The left-back was a hugely popular figure at the Deva in his first spell. Taylor initially arrived down CH1 in the summer of 2019 and had a crucial impact in his only full campaign with the club – being named CFU Player of the Season for 2019-20 and was also selected in the Vanarama National League North Team of the Season. Joel made 48 appearances before moving up a division to sign for Chesterfield. third in the National League North and his presence was a positive one both on and off the field. Following his departure from the Iron, Calum McIntyre was quick to approach Elliott and sign him up for the 2023-24 season.

Previously in his career, he's played for the likes of Sheffield United, York City, Alfreton Town, Lincoln City and Grimsby Town, also representing England "C" on two occasions, scoring once. While with the Imps, he helped them to promotion and scored the only goal, winning the EFL Trophy in 2018.

4. Declan Weeks

Joined in September 2020 following three seasons at Kidderminster. He made 93 appearances while at Aggborough, scoring six goals and contributing an impressive haul of 18 assists from the centre of the park. The former Welsh Under-21 international began his career at Wolves.

5. Harrison Burke

Highly-rated centre back Harrison signed his first senior contract with Chester FC in October 2020. Burke's rise was meteoric in 2021-22, impressing in the first half of the campaign on loan at Clitheroe, before returning to the Blues to make 19 appearances – with his first goal for the club being named Goal of the Season. in the loss at Spennymoor but impressed in his first four games. It was then announced Glendon had signed up for the immediate future with the club, despite interest higher up the pyramid. Glendon started his career at Manchester City and Captained their Elite Development Squad – as well as playing for England at Under 16 and Under 17's level. The talented central midfielder is now into his fourth season as the Club Captain. go on to spend the remainder of the campaign with the club, impressively contributing seven goals and seven assists in 26 league appearances.

11. Adam Thomas

Adam joined the Blues in May 2022 and was Manager Calum McIntyre's first new signing. The Liverpool-based wide man is a National League North winner with Stockport County back in 2018-19, before moving on to Curzon last summer from the Hatters. Thomas made 28 league appearances in 2021-22, scoring six goals, including a brace in the Nash's 3-0 win over the Blues back in August 2021 at the Deva. Thomas scored seven goals in 13 league starts for the Blues last term, making a total of 35 appearances across the season.

6. Matty Williams A central defender that is comfortable on the ball, Williams signed a professional deal with Accrington Stanley back in 2019 and had separate loan spells with

Exciting young midfielder Reece signed his first senior deal with Chester on his 18th Birthday in January 2023. Daly joined the club at the age of 16 and caught the eye throughout the U18's FA Youth Cup run in 2022-23 from Extra Preliminary Round to Second Round Proper – scoring five goals in seven matches.

That was a 1-0 home defeat against Buxton, with the side registering four wins and five draws in their last nine, convincingly beating third-placed Chorley away from home, seeing off other play-off hopefuls Scarborough Athletic 3-0 on home soil.

Amongst the draws, they've been held by Peterborough Sports and Hereford, current occupying fourth place on 59 points, just six behind the Iron, although having played a game more.

Consistent all season, particularly at home, their only blip this campaign came during six away games in a row in all competitions.







Fans are able to pay cash at the corner ticket booth between the Britcon and Mortz Stands, which opens 90 minutes before kick-off.


