First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Welcome back to Glanford Park as our attentions turn to the Emirates FA Cup encounter against Brackley Town, three weeks ahead of welcoming the same side in the league.

This is an important fixture. I told the players in the build-up to the game that we are treating it like a league fixture. It's a competition we want to do well in. We'll be playing to win the game.

The only way the tie we've got could have been harder is if it was away from home. When the draw was made it was first versus second, and that's a testament to the side that they are. It's a difficult tie, and I know quite a few of the players there. They'll be well-drilled, organised and it'll be a nother team where they'll be hard to break down. We've got to embrace that challenge.

There'll be one or two changes for this one, but in the main, I don't think there's loads wrong. Last Saturday wasn't a great performance, looking back at it. It had been a hard week building up to that game. We'd play 90 minutes with 10 men in the heat at Alfreton and we expelled a lot of energy against South Shields on the Tuesday. Last Saturday again, it was so hot. It's not an excuse, we should have been better, and we've got to react positively to that now. We also need to give credit to Buxton. They did a good job on us.

Looking back at the game last week, the penalty they got wasn't a penalty, and I'm even more adamant now I've seen it back on the replay. I could see from 50 yards away what the

player was doing. Taking our penalty in those conditions was not ideal either.

We've had confirmation that the game has got to be replayed, we've got to get on with it, and so have Buxton. We will be an awful lot better when that game is replayed. We have to be.

We've been a little bit of thin on the ground in fixtures prior to last weekend, and we'd played four games in quick succession, so having the week to prepare for this game has been really beneficial. In training, we've looked really fresh, so I hope we'll impact the fixture well.

We're expecting Alfie Beestin to return to full contact on Monday, which is a huge positive. Callum Roberts had his operation on Thursday, Jason Law is progressing well and Michael Clunan is as he was.

The only fresh one for this week is Reagan Ogle who will be out for a couple of weeks following an impact injury last weekend.

It's an intercostal cartilege injury, but we have Ross Barrows back from Ilkeston and we have Michael Kelly available.

We can't be anymore grateful for your support. We're the most privileged football team in the league. You are amazing.

With regards to recent incidents, when bottles come onto the pitch, you hurt us. We get reprimanded off the pitch, and can get fined. On the pitch, when we're chasing games, it can kill any sort of momentum that we might have. Please refrain from doing it. It's one or two out of 4,000, but it's still important, and dangerous. Everything on the pitch is going so well, we don't want this to spoil it.

THROWING OBJECTS. AND



Scunthorpe United Football Club would like to remind supporters about a zero-tolerance policy with regards to throwing objects, as well as the use and carrying of pyrotechnics at both home and away matches.

Ensuring the safety of our supporters, players and staff is always of paramount importance to Scunthorpe United Football Club and the throwing of objects and lighting of pyrotechnics at football stadia is very dangerous and a serious offence. Any supporter identified to have committed such an act will be banned by the club and also subject to the possibility of criminal prosecution and football banning orders.

Scunthorpe United will continue to work closely with the police and football authorities to stamp out this, and other types, of spectator misconduct.

We would also like to remind supporters that if there are incidents of this nature reported, then the Football Association have the power to impose serious financial penalties on the club which will almost certainly impact on its playing resources, and the frequency in which these incidents have taken place this season now make this a real possibility.

Following the abandonment of the Vanarama National League North fixture between Scunthorpe United and Buxton on Saturday, September 9th due to adverse weather, it has been determined that the fixture will be rescheduled in full.

The matter was considered thoroughly, with the outcome decided in line with National League regulations and previous occurrences of this nature.

A new date for the game will be announced by the clubs in due course.

We take a look at Brackley Town as they arrive at Glanford Park for the first of back-to-back encounters against the side in league and cup...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Brackley is a small but growing Northamptonshire market town of around 15,000 inhabitants situated between Northampton, Milton Keynes and Oxford. The nearest point of reference for many people would be the Silverstone motor racing circuit and Formula One has a big presence in the town as base for the world champion Mercedes team.

Founded in 1890 Brackley Town was, around the turn of the century, a prominent side in the local area. At one time the name of Tottenham Hotspur appeared on the fixture list, London being a short journey away on the newly opened Great Central Railway.

In 1974 the club moved back to the North Bucks League and this coincided with a move to the current St James Park ground. A small clubhouse and changing rooms were built and within three years the major step up into the Hellenic League was made.

The 1992-93 season ended with the ignominious distinction of having the worst playing record of any senior side in the country. It was only the fact that others did not have the required facilities for promotion that they were spared relegation.

With finances at full stretch however, the club was forced into voluntary liquidation in February 1999. It was saved at the last minute to ensure that the season was completed. The "new" club finished bottom of the Southern Section and were therefore demoted back into the Hellenic League.

The 2003-04 season saw an exciting run-in and the championship shield lifted on the last day of the season and with it promotion back to the Southern League.

2011-12 saw arguably the most successful season in the club's history to that point culminating in winning the Southern League Premier Division and a second Senior Cup victory. The team lifted the Southern League shield at a jubilant St James Park after a 6-0 thrashing of St Albans City.

The first season in the Conference North began with a 4-1 win at Altrincham to announce the arrival of Brackley Town at Step 2 and saw the side make it all the way to the play-off final losing by a single goal to FC Halifax Town at St James Park.

2017-18 would see Brackley lift the FA Trophy and finish third in their most successful season to date, while the side continue to be a real threat to make it into the National League Premier Division for the first time in their history, narrowly missing out in the play-offs after finishing as runners-up last season.

As a player, Cowan (now 42) plied his trade for a number of teams in the non-league circuit including Braintree Town, Canvey Island, Nuneaton Borough and AFC Telford United, amongst a number of others, also representing EFL side Shrewsbury Town. He returned to Nuneaton for another stint, ending at Telford where he also started his coaching career. He was appointed as manager of Brackley in May shortly after their play-off final defeat.

Former Kidderminster Harriers 'keeper, Danny kept goal as Brackley won the FA Trophy in 2018 and has been an ever-present with over 260 appearances for the Saints. He kept 28 clean-sheets in the 2021-22 season, earning him the National Game Goalkeeper of the Season award.

Age: 30

Nationality: English

George signed in pre-season 2022 from National League Chesterfield after four seasons at Solihull Moors and short spells at Leamington and Gloucester City. George, 30, featured for Chesterfield in the FA Trophy tie against Saints in December 2020, the National League side winning on penalties.

9. Danny Newton

Age: 32

Nationality: English
Position: Striker

Born in Liverpool, Danny started at Hinckley United, Nuneaton and Barwell before a short stay at St James Park under Jon Brady, making eight appearances, seven from the bench.

Successful spells followed at Leamington and Tamworth before joining League Two Stevenage where he scored 22 goals in 115 appearances.

One season at Solihull Moors was followed by another National League season at Boreham Wood playing with Lee Ndlovu before re-joining Saints ten years after first departing SJP.

He scored a further 16 goals last term and is nearing his century of strikes for the club.

A long career has seen him near a total of nearly 500 appearances, with 142 goals to his name with him now in his 14 season.

3. Riccardo Calder

Age: 27

Nationality: English

Graduate of the academy at Aston Villa, Riccardo joined Brackley in pre-season 2022 from Rushall Olympic after loan spells at Scottish Premiership side Dundee, Doncaster Rovers and Lincoln City before turning out 33 times for Inverness Caledonian Thistle and further short spells including at Kettering Town. As a defender or midfielder Riccardo made a real impact in his first season at SJP.

5. Alex Gudger

Age: 31

Nationality: English

FA Trophy winner with Kevin Wilkin's 2018 Saints side Alex moved on to National League Solihull Moors but returned to St James Park for the 2023-24 season.

15. Tyler Lyttle

Age: 26

Nationality: English

Join the side after spells at Rushall Olympic and Sutton Coldfield among others. He started out at Bristol Rovers making his league debut against Leyton Orient in 2015. Son of Nottingham Forest defender Des Lyttle, Tyler brings attacking intent to his defensive role.

7. Cosmos Matwasa

Age: 24

Nationality: English

Cosmas joined Brackley in August 2022 from Stamford making his debut at Gloucester City. A lightening quick winger, Cosmas made a big impact in National League North in his first season and re-signed for the current campaign, despite being a target of many clubs, including the Iron.

8. Alfie Bates

Age: 28

Nationality: English

Coventry-born midfielder Alfie re-signed for the new season after initially joining in January 2023 following time at Walsall where he made 49 appearances in League Two. He then played in the top division in Finland before returning to the UK to come to St James Park for the second half of the 2022-23 campaign making 19 league appearances.

4. Shepherd Murombedzi

Age: 28

Nationality: Zimbabwean

Having started at Reading, the former Torquay, Hayes & Yeading and Chester midfielder is approaching 200 appearances for Saints. Versatile but most effective in central midfield, Shep is crucial to Gavin Cowan's plans this season.

14. Morgan Roberts

Age: 22

Nationality: Welsh

Northampton-born winger Morgan made his debut for his home-town team in May 2018. Loan spells at

AFC Rushden & Diamonds, Banbury United and Brackley led to a move to the Puritans in 2021 where he scored 20 goals in 42 appearances before moving to Swindon Town.

The Iron were involved in the first-ever penalty shoothout in the FA Cup against Rotherham United back in November 1991. The full-time score was 3-3, with Scunthorpe losing 7-6 on kicks from the penalty mark.

With a tough run of fixtures coming up, aside from facing the Iron twice, they also host Curzon Ashton next weekend, while they aren't scheduled to face current table-toppers Tamworth until November.
