

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good afternoon and welcome back to Glanford Park for this afternoon's encounter, our final before Christmas at home.

It was disappointing and frustrating last time out here, as we lost to higher league opposition in the FA Trophy. The first half, we weren't at the races and the two goals that we conceded epitomised the night to be honest, with two individual errors. We were better in the second half, and created a lot of chances, but the damage had already been done, and we didn't manage to take any of them.

It was a test of where we are at. Solihull aren't fourth in the league above for no reason. It showed across the pitch. It's where we want to be, and shows the work we have to do.

It is, though, just one defeat, and against higher league opposition. Each time so far this season when we have been disappointed with a result, the boys have responded and gone on a run, and we want that to be the case again this afternoon.

We were frustrated not to have that opportunity in midweek, with the rearranged trip to Blyth Spartans being called off again through a waterlogged pitch. It's frustrating to prepare for the game and be ready, but it gives the players another full week of training to prepare, recover, and be ready for this busy festive period. We had a contingency plan in place in case the game was off on Tuesday, and got the lads in training straight away once we found out, so we still managed to get some good work into the players.

Chorley will be a tough test. It's our first reverse fixture of the season, and it was a tough 1-1 draw at their place back in September. It ended up being a good point in the end having conceded just after half-time and losing Will Evans to a debatable second yellow card.

We must emulate the performance and clinical edge that we showed in the Hereford game to get something out of this game, setting us up for the busy festive period.

For many supporters, this will be the first time you've been back to Glanford Park since the stadium was brought back to the fans. It is the first time in the league that we are able to celebrate that. As I've said previously, what's been done by Michelle and the Board in such a short space of time is incredible. see every day what the club means to the fans, to the Board and to the staff behind the scenes, and it's up to us as players and coaching staff to continue the positive work on the pitch to really make this a season to remember.

With this our last home game, and my last set of notes before Christmas, I'd like to wish you all a very Happy Christmas. Boxing Day is a family football day across the country, so I hope to see as many of you as possible at Glanford Park as we aim for a late Christmas present against Farsley Celtic.

Now, let's aim for an early Christmas present. Get behind us as always, as we strive for another important three points on the way to our goal this season.

Our club, our home, ours once more! United we Stand!



Scunthorpe United is delighted to welcome goalkeeper Maison Campbell

# to the club on a one-month loan from York City.

The 20-year-old shotstopper is highly-rated by the Minstermen and signed a two-year contract extension in the summer, having joined from Mansfield Town two years ago.

Campbell has made one appearance so far for York this campaign in the Vanarama National League, stepping in for the injured David Stockdale away at Aldershot for the second half, where he kept a clean sheet.

He also played in the North Riding Senior Cup at the start of November too, featuring for the Minstermen away at Guisborough Town.

Earlier in the campaign, he had a one-month spell at Marske United in the Northern Premier League Premier Division this season, featuring twice for the Seasiders during that stint. Last month, he joined Northern Counties East Premier Division side Knaresborough Town for more match experience.

Campbell arrives at Glanford Park for a busy festive period as back-up to Ross Fitzsimons following Aaron Chapman's departure a couple of weeks ago, and was in the squad for last weekend's Isuzu FA Trophy encounter against Solihull Moors.

# FOCUS ON... WILL EVANS

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to Will Evans, as we approach the halfway stage of the campaign...



Playing 23 of the 25 of the Iron's games in all competitions so far this season, defender Will Evans is enjoying life at his new club following his summer move from Boreham Wood.

The 32-year-old spoke in the interview of his enjoyment of the style of football United play, and how it suits his personal game, first reflecting on his personal campaign so far: "I feel like I've been fairly consistent with my performances. I feel like I've formed good partnerships with both Boycey and Max. I would have liked to have scored a couple more goals, and be a bit more clinical in front of goal. As a team, we've defended well, so I feel like it's been pretty good overall."

With just one goal to his name so far in claret and blue, it hasn't gone unnoticed that Evans possesses a ferocious

shot on goal, and he feels as though it's only a matter of time before one of those thunderous strikes hits the back of the net.

"I do like to have a shot. The lads would back me up with that, especially in training. I do feel like they're getting closer.

"I think I need to ask Jacob for a few tips and have a practise session with Butts, so he can help me because he's definitely got the technique down to a tee. He's a phenomenal player. As a club, and as a teammates, we are very lucky to have him. Even from my point of view, seeing him perform on a weekly performance, is a pleasure. What he can do with a football, on a football pitch, is incredible."

Evans was part of the Vanarama National League's best defence last season with Boreham Wood, and has transferred those defensive attributes to his new side, alongside his new teammates, building a so-far successful term.

"It's my job to keep the goals out, at the end of the day, so it's been pleasing. It always

It always gives us a platform to build off. Obviously, the less goals you concede, the more likely you are going to win, especially with the way we play.

"Compared to Boreham Wood, it's a completely different style of football, so it's pleasing from my point of view to have kept the clean sheets up since moving here.

"It's a lot more possession-based here, so it's a lot more enjoyable for me. I'm a lot more involved, we build up from the back. It's a lot better for me, as I like to get on the ball and play. It's something the gaffer wants from us from centre-halves. Everyone has to be confident and comfortable on the ball and be able to play.

"We've just got to take it in our stride and do as much as we can all over the pitch. It's not just keeping clean sheets, it's creating opportunities for the midfielders and strikers as well."

The Iron come into the game off the back of no game in midweek, with the encounter against Blyth Spartans falling victim to a waterlogged pitch for the second time.

With an inkling that the trip up north would be cancelled, Jimmy Dean's players were summoned for training, with the week therefore treat like a full week's training.

"We trained on Tuesday after the game was called off, so it was a good opportunity to get minutes in on the training pitch. It's always an advantage to do that. We always take those opportunities when they come. It's good for the group to stay on top of fitness levels, and it's given us the chance to focus on this game sooner."

With almost half the season now passed, and this game against Chorley being the first reverse encounter of the season, Evans gave his take on what he feels the team have learned by being in this division, and how they can take this forward into the second half of the






Finally, our 12 days of Christmas initiative has proved to be a big hit. From signed prints, framed shirts, and offers in the shop, our

# MIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES FATHER CHRISTMAS TIME WOMBLING WOMBWELL AND AN IMPISH CHRISTMAS

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

A century ago, Scunthorpe United and the loyal band of supporters were on the verge of the Christmas festivities, and the local shop had gifts galore for all and sundry.

Within about a week, the homes would be made up with home-made coloured paper chains, and mother would be thinking about the all-important homemade Christmas pudding. Kid throughout the district were on the brink of breaking up from school, and dreaming of what Father Christmas was going to slide into the Christmas stocking, perched at the end of the bed. If it was like last year, it would be some nuts and an orange.

In Theodore Road, United's secretary, Harry Allcock, always put on his bike clips, at 10-to-nine in order to cycle the quarter of a mile on his Raleigh bike. He was going by Henderson Avenue, through the official's gate, then up the creaking wooden stairs, to his office at the Old Show Ground. Wearing horn rimmed spectacles, a trilby had and raincoat, Christmas was a busy time for him. There were three matches up to Boxing Day still to arrange and fulfil all requirements of the football club that was his heart's passion. The next on the agenda was scheduled on December 22nd 1923 at Wombwell, in the mining belt of Yorkshire, on the other side of Doncaster.


It was Harry's job to secure all travelling arrangement, whether that be for tickets via the LNER train service, or charabanc bus from a local company. A check with Charlie White, United's trainer was essential to make sure the clean kit was in the wicker basket, and securely with the team on arrival. Then there were the most important of guests at the match,

and they were the Club's directors. They would be in charge of team selection, and Harry had to convey the news to one and all as to who was in the first eleven playing at Wombwell, and which of the reserves were left at home to meet local opposition in the North Lindsey League, which was the and Foster.

The Directors needed to make some adjustments to team affairs on this occasion, the first consideration was in the halfback line, where injury had caught up with Millson, and reserve team player Wilson was promoted for the time being. This was to be the only change of direction from the side that had beaten Castleford 3-1, on the previous Saturday. Thus the team sent out to do duty at Wombwell was as follows: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Hargreaves, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Wilson, halfbacks; Slater, Haythorne, Burkinshaw,

Kitchen, and Foster, forwards.

The length of daylight was at a

minimum at this time of the year, and the Scunthorpe United contingent made an early start to reach Wombwell, so the ninety minutes would not encroach on the dead of night around four o'clock. It was cold, and miserable in smoky Yorkshire when they arrived, and the Scunthorpe players knew that their opponents would play with muscle and take no prisoners. It was why United had the likes of Oscar Hargreaves in the back quarters, and the Joe Kitchen, who was as strong as an ox, and had played at the highest level, in the forward line.

The Wombwell visit was the first time the Nuts had travelled away from home in the Midland League for three months. Rain had fallen in the morning, but sunshine prevailed at kick-off, but a strong wind was blowing which would not assist any neatly played football, nor would a distinctly uneven pitch. The handful of Scunthorpe followers noted two former Scunthorpe United men in the home eleven, in the shape of Retford and Talbot. The claret and blue visitors chose to have the wind

The game that ensued was spoilt as a spectacle by the wind, and both sets of men had difficulty in controlling it throughout. It was Christmas Day three days

opening presents, the sporting member left mother in peace to attend to that special dinner, whilst the rest cleared off to football. The treat on offer was the visit of the Junior Imps of Lincoln City Reserves, for which Haythorne was banished forever from first team matters, and Raby installed in a shuffled forward line. There was good news in the halfback section, because Ernie Millson was fit to come back in place of young Wilson.

Unfortunately, it cannot be said what

happened on that Christmas afternoon, because the local paper did not print a report too many details. What can be gleaned is that the usual whiff of Christmas cigars was in the air, similar to that of cannabis in Amsterdam!

However, there was an almighty cheer at some stage in the ninety minutes, as Raby hit the only goal of the match, for Scunthorpe United. A 1-0 result made Christmas that much better.

And so to the Boxing Day encounter, at Sincil Bank, where about 2,000 hardy souls saw the Nuts play with even greater vigour, and come home with a 3-1 advantage. Raby hit the first, good old Joe Kitchen scored the second, before the Junior Imps clawed one back. Victory was secured when Burkinshaw crashed in the third, to conclude the scoring.





# OUR VISITORS HODAY

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



# A BRIEF HISTORY

Chorley began life as a rugby club, before switching to association football in 1883. Known as the Magpies since the 1890s because of their distinctive black and white striped shirts, the club have played in six different leagues during an 140-year existence.

After a series of friendly matches against Wigan, Preston North End and Blackburn Rovers in the 1880s, Chorley joined the Lancashire Junior League in 1889. The following year the league became the Lancashire Alliance, where the Club played through 1894 before leaving to join the Lancashire League.

They also competed in the Lancashire Combination and Cheshire County League before becoming a founder member of the Northern Premier League in 1968. Promotion as champions of the NPL in '88 resulted in The Magpies highest finish on the English football pyramid the following year (17th in the Football Conference), before they succumbed to relegation back to the NPL in 1990.

After the brief spell in the fifth tier, Chorley slipped slowly down through the divisions and flirted with relegation to the North West Counties League. Then, with the appointment of Garry Flitcroft as manager in 2010, the club began a remarkable revival.

Two promotions in four seasons saw the Magpies, roared on by an average crowd almost five-times higher than during the Noughties, catapulted into the National League North after a final day victory at Buxton in April 2014 secured a second NPL championship crown.

In what was to be Flitcroft's last season in charge, the club almost made a triumphant return to the Football Conference losing the NLN play-off final 3-2 to Guiseley in May 2015.

Assistant manager Matt Jansen took the reins that summer, and although the Magpies missed a play-off berth in 2015-16, they returned the following season only to lose a second play-off final. This time in front of over 8,000 fans at FC Halifax Town.

Yet another play-off appearance was booked in April 2018.

However, Harrogate Town edged the semi-final 2-1 with an injury time winner. The defeat was Jansen's last game in charge.

Assistant Jamie Vermiglio took over the day after Jansen departed and led the Magpies to National League North play-off success 10 months later, returning the Club to the fifth tier of English football with a 4-3 penalty victory over Spennymoor Town at Victory Park.

The Magpies' return to non-league's top table lasted just one season, as covid put pay to any hopes of survival with eight games of the season cancelled.

A further COVID-hit season in the National League North followed, with the season abandoned in February, before a rebound campaign in 2021-22 ended with a play-off berth for the fifth time since 2015.

Experienced right-back with over 100 games for Blackburn Rovers under his belt. Joined from Bradford City in 2020; has also played in MLS. Capped twice for Wales as a teenager.

## 3. Mark Ellis

Experienced central defender with over 400 competitive league appearances, largely in the EFL. Signed in July 2023 having been released by Barrow in the summer, following loan spells with Solihull Moors, Torquay United and York City.

# 33. Justin Johnson

Age: 27

Nationality: Dutch Position: Winger

A livewire winger with outrageously quick feet.

He signed for Chorley following a brief trial last summer after hitting 12 goals for Stalybridge Celtic in the Northern Premier League during the 2021-22 campaign.

The Dutchman was originally with Manchester United before stops in Scotland and Cyprus. His previous clubs are Dundee United and Hamilton Academical in Scotland, York City in England and Othellos Athienou and Akritas Chlorakas in Cyprus.

Johnson was born in the Hague, South Holland, and started his career as a youth player with Sparta Rotterdam. After moving to England, he joined the Manchester United Academy, but was released and joined the football academy at the Manchester College. From there, he joined the youth squad of non-League club FC United of Manchester.

# 4. Scott Wilson

Manager's player of the year last season after a terrific debut campaign saw the former Burnley youngster make 44 appearances for the Magpies before being voted into Vanarama's 'Team of the Season'. A central defender - also played for Barrow and Curzon Ashton.

5. Harvey Smith

Bristolian central defender now in his fourth campaign with the Magpies after signing from Bristol City in August 2020. Recently made his 100th appearances for the club.

# 12. Jack Moore

Signed for the Magpies on loan from Blackpool in early August. Came through their academy and had a short spell on loan last season with Chorley too before being hampered by injury.

# 16. Adam Blakeman

Closing in on 300 appearances for the Magpies, across two spells. A full back with a wand of a left foot, 'Blakes' was a member of the club's 2019 National League North play-off-winning squad. He started his career with Bolton Wanderers.

# MIDFIELDERS

# 6. Joe Nolan

The 21-year-old played 43 games for his hometown club last season after originally signing non-contract terms in August 2022 - a permanent contract followed in December. A product of Blackburn Rovers.

# 7. Billy Whitehouse

Workhorse winger who's barely missed a game for Chorley since signing after a successful trial in May 2021. Made his EFL breakthrough with Doncaster Rovers as a teenager before being snapped up by Leeds United.

# 8. Mark Calveley

Played 130 times for Chorley in three full seasons to date after joining from Curzon Ashton in the

summer of 2020. Originally came through the ranks at Port Vale, enjoying loan spells with Leek Town and Nuneaton along the way.

# 13. Ollie Shenton

A technically gifted midfielder who played a major part in Chorley's historic FA Cup run during the 2020-21 season.

He has made over 100 appearances for the Magpies since joining from boyhood club Stoke City in the summer of 2020.

# 14. Carlton Ubaezuonu

Summer signing from league rivals Farsley Celtic. Played nearly 40 games for the Celts last season after making the move from Irish football in 2022.

# 17. Rhys Fenlon

Signed for the Magpies on a permanent deal in the summer of 2023. Rhys previously had a stint with the club on loan in the 2022-23 season. He came through the youth ranks at Accrington Stanley, Manchester City and Burnley before signing permanently with Accrington Stanley as a professional in 2020.

9. Jack Sampson

A target man who joined the Magpies for a second time after leaving AFC Fylde in February 2022. His first spell was a loan one from Macclesfield where he scored six in 16 games. He has also played for Southend United, Accrington Stanley and Morecambe, along with a successful three-year stint at Southport

Signed for the Magpies in September 2023, the Zimbabwean international has plenty of experience in English and Scottish football. The 28-year-old had a trial with the club in the summer of 2018-19 before signing for Hamilton Academical.

# SATURDAY. DECEMBER 23RD -

The Iron are next on the road for their final encounter before Christmas, taking on Buxton in the first away reverse fixture of the campaign.

Technically the third match between the two sides this season, the first was abandoned in stoppage time at the end of the game at Glanford Park before the replayed game took place a few weeks later.

#### THE STADIUM

Buxton is the home of bottled Peak District water and Silverlands - the highest football ground above sea level in England at 1,000 feet, and one of the oldest.

The ground is one of the best in the league, holding up to 5,200 spectators with an impressive 500 seater main stand on the half way line with some standing either side.

Opposite is the Scratching Shed or 'Shed' as it is known with covered terraced standing. Behind the goals, there is uncovered standing at one end and the Railway End Terrace at

the other. On trips to Buxton, away fans are often in the Shed and the open end behind the goal.

## BY CAR

78 miles from Glanford Park, it will take approximately one hour and 40 minutes to journey from the Iron's stadium.

It is the fourth shortest trip of the Iron's season.

- > Follow M180, M18 and M1 to A617 in Derbyshire
- > Take exit 29 from M1 to Mansfield / A632 / Matlock
- > Continue on A617 before taking the roundabout to A619
- > Continue forward on A619 before turning right onto A6020
- > After 9.6 miles, turn right onto The Duke's Drive / A6
- > At the roundabout, take the first exit onto Dale Road / B5059
- > There's a slight right onto Peveril Road before a left turn onto Clifton Road and a right turn onto Silverlands, with the destination on your right

#### CAR PARKING

There is limited car-parking space at the ground for disabled visitors.

#### ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Buxton railway station is also nearby, but it is a short steep walk uphill from there to the ground. There is an hourly direct train service from Manchester Piccadilly to Buxton departing Manchester at 8 minutes to the hour. The return trains depart Buxton at 22 minutes past each hour.

#### FACILITIES

Facilities include a bar, small club shop, and a food hut which sells the usual burgers, hot dogs, chips, teas and coffees all at reasonable prices.



#### TUESDAY, DECEMBER 26TH, 2023 - 1PM KICK-OFF

The first of back-to-back meetings against the side, with an earlier kick-off, the Iron welcome Farsley Celtic to Glanford Park on Boxing Day.

Sat in 14th place with 29 points from their 21 games played, the side jumped three places following their dramatic victory in midweek over Curzon Ashton when they turned a 1-0 deficit into a 2-1 win in the 94th and 97th minute.

The side are undefeated in six games unbeaten in the league, with their only defeat in the last seven coming in the FA Trophy against Radcliffe Borough. Prior to the win over Curzon Ashton, they registered two home goalless draws over Spennymoor Town and Hereford in what was a run of four home games on the trot.

Last month, they got back-to-back wins over Boston United and Buxton, although they've previously suffered defeats to Darlington and TICKETS FROM Alfreton Town.

The side were tipped to struggle in pre-season, but they defied the odds with their early campaign form, winning two and drawing three of their opening five games of the season, with the victories coming against Rushall Olympic and Bishop's Stortford.

Ahead of facing the Iron twice over the festive period in the space of four days, the side are due to be at Banbury United this afternoon before hosting Gloucester City on Saturday, December 23rd.
