

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good afternoon, and welcome back to the Attis Arena for this afternoon's game against Tamworth.

I extend my welcome to everyone associated with the Lambs. They've had a monumentally positive season so far, following their promotion to this division last season. They're on a tremendous run of form, and we will have to be at our very best to get anything this afternoon.

Our last couple of results have been disappointing, with the five points we've dropped seeing today's opposition take over at the top of the league, and then go eight points clear, with an additional midweek fixture that we don't play until next month. Today's game represents an opportunity to reduce that gap.

Against Boston United here last time out, we were disappointed to concede late on to drop two points. It's a game we should have been out of sight of in the first half, with a really strong, positive start, but the second half saw them come back into it and get a point in added time.

At Brackley Town last weekend, the performance was not acceptable, it's as simple as that. We are still in good form when you look over the last few weeks and months; we've won six, drawn two and lost one of the last nine games, and each time we've lost a game, the lads have always given us a response, and it's up to us all as a collective to ensure that happens again this afternoon. It will not be easy.

This afternoon, we are still without key players, who have done so much for us so far this

season. Danny Whitehall serves the final of his three-match suspension, and will definitely be a big miss, as will Jacob Butterfield who suffered concussion last time out here at the Attis Arena. We obviously know that Danny will be back in contention for Tuesday's trip to Darlington, but we hope Jacob will be too. Both being out today represents an opportunity for someone else to come in and stake a claim for a starting shirt. Danny Elliott has lead the line in the last couple of games, and got two goals against Boston in the process.

Despite freezing temperatures and frozen training pitches, we've still managed to get work into the players this week. A big thank you to John Leggott College who are allowing us to use their brand new 3G facility, which is outstanding, and it's really appreciated for us to have this partnership with them,

Today is another day where we need a big Attis Arena atmosphere. The ticket sales have been fantastic, and

Tamworth will be backed in numbers today too. We need to make home advantage count. The support we've had all season has carried us through countless times, and we will need that again. The players will need to be on it to get anything out of the game, and you as the supporters will also need to be on it to push the players through this battle.

We must take great strength from our home form, we are nine games without defeat, winning eight of those, and we set a new club record for winning eight in a row here. Playing at home has to remain a fortress.

FOCUS ON... KIAN SCALES

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to midfield warhorse Kian Scales, who has made a big impression so far...



One of the early contenders for player of the season, right from the campaign's get-go has to be midfielder Kian Scales.

Largely an unknown quantity, Scales' arrival among a sea of new signings could have seen him labelled a squad player looking to make a career for himself following a loan spell at Farsley Celtic at this level, where the side only just staved off relegation on the final day. Leaving Bradford City, where he'd been for much of his youth was another big move for the 21-year-old, but he's taken to North Lincolnshire like a duck to water, and has a lot to thank his success to the work he did prior to pre-season even starting.

"To leave Bradford, it was tough. I'd been there since I was young, but when this opportunity came up, I knew how big of a club it was. I knew

how big of a club it was. I knew I wanted to come here. The gaffer put his goals for the season in front of me, and it's something I wanted to be part of. It was an no-brainer.

"In the off-season, I worked hard. I knew it was going to be a big season for me personally because I knew I had to make impressions. It's a new club. I came in as fit as possible, and that was probably one of the reasons I got 90 minutes in the first pre-season game. I took my chance from there."

Having played a defensive role at his previous club, it was an arrival of unknown for Scales, as he looked to forge his career away from the Bantams.

"I didn't really know how it would go. I'd played the majority of last season at Farsley as a right-back or right-wing-back, so I didn't know what role I was brought in as. Midfield is what I would say is my strongest position. I just thought if I had a good off-season and hit the ground running, I could get people

talking about me and playing me in the positions I wanted to play. I always want to do my best.

“Since I’ve come here, I’ve really enjoyed it. The gaffer has given me a lot of minutes, and I’ve loved playing in front of the crowd. I think, as a team, and individually, we’ve done well. We’re close, but not exactly where we want to be, especially with the recent fixtures. We’re in touching distance, but we can definitely get there. We’re all looking forward to this game.”

As previously mentioned, Scales’ involvement in the team has often seen him labelled as the unsung hero, or doing the dirty work, while the attackers and defenders regularly take the plaudits for the moments of brilliance. While he wants to add more goals to his name than just the one he got against South Shields (pictured), he’s also content with the workmanlike job he is executing week-on-week.

“It’s a team game, and we all have to do our jobs. I know what my job is, and it’s similar to Clunes (Michael Clunan). We win the ball back, and try to play forward, and glue the full team together from the middle of the park. Whether that makes me unsung, I don’t know, that’s for the fans to decide. There’s the likes of Butts (Jacob Butterfield) who has scored five or six worldies, and everyone sees that. He’s been unreal this season, and big goals too in games we’ve needed it. It’s something I would like to add to my game, but I enjoy doing what I do; rattling around, making tackles and getting stuck in.

“As a midfielder, some might say it’s better to get an assist, but I’d rather score! It’s a big thing to make a goal happen though. It’s part of the job, and that’s what being a midfielder is all about.”

The buffers did threaten to thwart his impressive start to the campaign when he found himself with a red card inside the opening minutes of the away clash at Alfreton, but his tenacious work



continued, with the midfielder swiftly finding himself back in the team following his three-game ban.

“It’s one of the things I thought about straight away when I did get sent off. I thought it might take me a while to get back in the team. We were flying and doing well, so rightly so. I let myself down with getting sent off and if the team was doing well, it would be kept the same moving forward. To get back in straight away gave me confidence, and it probably took me a couple of weeks to get back up to speed. I tried everything to stay up with it, but deep down you know it’ll take one or two games to get back exactly

where you want to be.”

Fresh in the mind is Scales' return to former club Farsley Celtic over the course of the Christmas period, where the Iron picked up maximum points at the Attis Arena, and then at the Citadel in front of a record crowd.

“It's a good club, and I'm thankful for what they did for me. It's led to me coming here. I really enjoyed the Christmas fixtures, playing them and seeing old faces. We picked up two wins, which were massive. We always thought the away game would be tough.

The fans packed it out and it was class. It was scrappy, but we came away with three points.”

His role in this Iron team is vastly different to the one he was asked to do last season while with the Celts, but so is the ambition, with his former club looking to stay in this division rather than being promoted from it.

“Obviously I enjoy playing football, that's all I want to do. I would never mind what position I play, but I do feel you get more out of me in certain positions than others. Even the team, last year, we were struggling and near the bottom. With the budget we had there and everything going on behind the scenes, we did unbelievable to stay up on the final day. This season, it's the complete opposite. We want to be at the very top, and that's just how it is with different ambitions.”

The Iron's ambitions for this weekend is simple; beat the league leaders. Following a couple of disappointing games, Scales says it's the perfect fixture.

“It's been tough, especially with the Boston one. We thought we could have seen it out, and it would have been a massive 2-1 win. They were a good

side, and they did cause us problems. It was in the last minute that we conceded, and it did hit heavy. We try our hardest to keep them out, but it wasn't meant to be. Following that up with Brackley, and results going against us, it has been a tough week, but that's football. There's ups and downs, and there'll be plenty more before the end of the season. What a time to put it right on Saturday. How many times has it changed already this season? Fair play to Tamworth, people thought they might fall off it. We've always had the view if we keep doing what we're doing, we'll get where we want to be and that's still the case. If we do play our best stuff, there's plenty more twists and turns, and we will get to where we want to be.

“It's an individual game. It's a big game, but that's why we're involved in football. We want to be part of those big games. First versus second, it's massive. It doesn't decide the full season, but if we could get the win, it would put away the bad week we've had, and put us back on a bad run.

“Playing at home, everyone has loved it. We've picked up some really good results, scored a lot of goals, and we haven't conceded many at all. It's been really good. We enjoy playing at home, and the results show from it.

Sometimes, we've had to dig in.

We've got the crowd there, and it helps massively. We had a week where we had two 1-0s in a row, where we weren't particularly good, but to get six points from them was great, and hopefully we'll see the benefit of them come the end of the season.



MIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES UPS AND DOWNS

ROUNDS WITH ROTHERHAM AND TIGER CLUBBING

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

The cold winds of a North Lincolnshire winter were blowing across the Old Show Ground, in January 1924, where there were plenty of draughty places in those days.

During the 1920's, the Old Show Ground had stands along two sides of the length of the pitch. On the Henderson Avenue, west side, the new stand, which replaced the structure burned down by a devastating fire, only gave shelter to those in the three sections under its cover, and did not stretch the full length of that side. There was a wooden stand, dating back to 1912, on the east side, which gave seated cover, but either ends behind the goals were exposed to the elements, and frequently, a heavy rain coat and an umbrella were vital tools of football.

During the Christmas period of 1923, Scunthorpe United had had moderate success, with a double over Lincoln City Reserves, ruined by the loss of four points, thanks to Mexborough inflicting similar pain on them. The team had also found some solace in a victory at Oakwell, against a tough Barnsley Reserves, where away victories were as common as a Church of England Pope! Their last match, on January 12th, 1924, had been at Rotherham Town, and although the Town club was going through tough times, there could be no denying that the Natty Nuts had played up extremely courageously to take all points.

The match at Rotherham had seen a couple of the team changes, but this did not upset the cohesion of the team. Thanks to some splendid defensive work, and a super hat-trick from Raby, a 3-0 result boosted the Nuts in the Midland League table. To add a cherry to the top of the cake, it was the same struggling

Rotherham Town team that disembarked at the Old Show Ground, seven days later.

In the Board Room, the Directors had the difficult choice of sticking with the same team or making changes. Burkinshaw, their regular inside right was still unavailable, and the only change decided upon was to bring in Green into the forward line, from second team duty. Therefore, the team to represent the Club consisted of the following players: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Franklin, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Clark, Kitchen, Raby, Green, and Foster, forwards. Rotherham arrived with a number of alterations, particularly to the forward line.

The attendance at the Show Ground on kick-off time was only moderate, and because the Scunthorpe captain won the toss, they asked the visitors to face a bright but weak sun in the first period. In the early stages, it was

Rotherham Town who caused the major threat, and had two chances to give the home defenders cause to chase down. However, on twenty minutes it was the Nuts who took the lead with a superbly worked team effort. Skull picked up the initial ball on the right, in his own half. He fed it to Clark on his wing, and a jink of the shoulder saw Clark beat his man, and offer the ball to Kitchen. Joe Kitchen looked up, progressed with the ball deep into opposition territory, then he crossed it for Raby to hit first time into the back of the net.

In the second half Rotherham tried hard to gain parity, and were putting up a far better show than at Clifton Lane, the previous week. The Scunthorpe defence held firm, and late in the day the lead was stretched beyond the visitor's grasp. It was Kitchen who did the spade work by hitting the post, but when the ball rebounded back into play, Raby made sure of the goal, although in truth Kitchen was in a position to convert, if not his colleague had not been alert. 2-0 was the final satisfactory result.

The next date for the Nuts on

The return match between Scunthorpe United and Rotherham Town took place on the Old Show Ground this afternoon. In view of the Town's lowly position there appeared to be every prospect of the United adding to their stock of points. The visitors made a number of changes, mostly in the forward line. The teams were:—

lin pulled up the visiting right wing smartly with an overhead kick. Wainwright had later to deal with a troublesome centre from Foster, but whilst he only made a partial clearance, relief was forthcoming when Kitchen was penalised for offside. An advance by the United in which the ball was passed from the right wing to the other extreme, saw Foster finish with a good centre, from which Raby went

Kitchen's place, and that was the only change from those on duty, in beating Rotherham.

At the start of the game, the terraces had a heathy attendance for this Midland League

keeper's body.

The second half continued with the Tiger Cubs having more of the ball, but the Nuts keeping them away from the danger zone. It was said that the visiting defence worked tirelessly throughout, with great credit. While the ball was generally being kept in the Scunthorpe half, Raby again seized it, and raced through, scoring another goal, similar to his first. This second strike made the Hull players lose heart, and from there on the initiative changed hands, and the Nuts had the more attacking mood. They tried hard to increase the lead, but at the end of play a 2-0 score still yielded the points.

The journey home on the Humber Ferry boat, over to New Holland was that much more of a comfort for the Scunthorpe supporters that had visited the port city for the game, also improving their position in the Midland League table.

The headlines of the Rotherham Town fixture

match, with plenty of claret and blue favours in evidence. City won the toss, and it was soon apparent that a heavy pitch would be a factor in this match, with mud a contributing element to the proceedings. Play during the first half was fairly even. Despite some pressure, it was the Nuts that tamed the Tiger Cubs by taking the lead on thirty minutes. Raby was the architect and scorer. He picked up the ball in his own half, teased past a full-back, and hit a shot which bobbed under the City reserve

the 1924 calendar was on January 26th over on the far side of the River Humber, at the Anlaby Road ground at Hull, to face the Tiger Cubs of Hull City. Although Hargreaves had finished his suspension, a cold prevented his return to the defence, while a similar illness ruled Kitchen from his usual place. There was better news of goal scorer Burkinshaw, who took

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



A BRIEF HISTORY

It is nearly nine decades since, in the summer of 1933, a football team in Tamworth was just a dream until the lovers of the beautiful game worked together to set up a new club in the town.

The demise of Tamworth Castle FC left the town with no senior level football club, but a campaign involving a town businessman and the local newspaper set the wheels in motion to form another club, and so Tamworth FC was born. The original ground on which the team played was next to the now demolished Jolly Sailor pub, and from 1934 onwards The Lamb became the club's new home, where they remain to this day.

The club played its early football in the Birmingham Combination, and the Birmingham League (now the West Midlands League) in the 1950s, but it wasn't until the 1960s that the club achieved notable success with two league championships and numerous victories in the League Cup, Birmingham Senior Cup and Staffordshire Senior Cup. The club also reached the First Round of the FA Cup on two occasions, and

on the second of those occasions they progressed to the Second Round by virtue of a 2-1 victory over Torquay United at The Lamb.

These were good times indeed for Tamworth FC, but it wasn't to last. Despite gaining entry to the Southern League in 1972, the club's fortunes went on a dramatic slide as the 1970s proved to be as cruel as the 1960s had been kind. Attendances fell to record low levels; The Lamb fell into disrepair and it became a major effort just to keep the club alive. In 1984, a consortium of local businessmen including the current Chairman Bob Andrews took the club over and set about restoring it to its former glory. Tamworth returned to the West Midlands League and gradually found their feet again, winning the Championship in 1988 and regaining their Southern League status after a four year hiatus.

The following season Tamworth progressed to even greater things reaching the final of the FA Vase, and, on 6th May 1989 in front of a Wembley crowd of 26,487 (the record attendance for the Vase final at the 'old' Wembley), they played out a 1-1 draw with Sudbury Town and won the replay

3-0 at Peterborough four days later to give the club, and the town, possibly its finest moment ever.

During the summer of 2016, Chairman Bob Andrews oversaw the multi-million pound replacement of The Lamb's 80+ year old grass pitch with a state of the art artificial 3G surface, one of only a handful of similar surfaces in the top two tiers of the non league pyramid at the time. It completely changed The Lamb from being a one team venue into a facility for the club's burgeoning youth and academy sides as well as bringing the community into a popular hub for local football.

After a shuffle of his pack in the summer of 2022 Peaks' squad made it a Southern League Premier Central campaign to remember with promotion to the National League North for 2023-24 cemented on the final day.

An strong aerial threat, Cullinane-Liburd re-signed for his hometown club in the summer of 2023 having featured a number of times in 2020-21 before lockdown halted football at the Lambs level, and he joined higher league Brackley Town where he enjoyed successful campaigns.

19. Liam Dolman

Defender Dolman started his youth career with home-town club Northampton Town in 1999 and signed for the Cobblers in 2005. In 2009 he moved to Kidderminster Harriers and after spending time on loan with Corby Town joined the Steelmen in 2010-11. The following season Liam was with Banbury United, then spent two seasons at Daventry Town before spending 8 seasons with Andy Peaks at Rushden and Diamonds, travelling to the Lamb with the new Tamworth boss in the summer of 2022.

6. Callum Reilly

Reilly started his footballing career at Birmingham City as a youngster and joined their scholarship programme at aged seven. He was given a first team squad number in January 2012 and made a 60 of appearances for the Blues. Played





ON THE ROAD DARLINGTON



TUESDAY, JANUARY 23RD -
7.45PM

The Iron are set to face lower table languishers Darlington for the third time this campaign under the lights of the Blackwell Meadows stadium.

The encounter against the Quakers will be the 94th game between the two sides, of which Scunthorpe have won 40 of the historic ties, with Darlo winning 31. In the two previous fixtures this season, the Iron have triumphed on both occasions firstly winning 4-0 in mid-August in the league, and then proving victorious again by winning 2-0 in the Isuzu FA Trophy second round.

THE STADIUM

With a capacity of 3,281 (of which 588 are seated), Darlington are renowned for their passionate fanbase that has seen their club's unfortunate demise not too dissimilar to Scunthorpe.

Following their formation in 1833, the Quakers played their football at Feethams; this was until plans were formed for the

team to move into the 25,00-seater Darlington Arena, but unfortunate circumstances led to the club being forced into administration and hence moved into the new Blackwell Meadows ahead of the 2012-13 season.

BY CAR

199 miles away from Glanford Park, Blackwell Meadows is an estimated 1 hour and 40 minutes away when travelling by car.

> Take Doncaster Rd/A18 to A1077

> Take M180, M62 and A1 to Bridge Road/A66 in North Yorkshire

> Continue on Bridge Rd/A66 before finding the stadium on your second right.

CAR PARKING

There is some parking available at the ground which costs £5 per car. Continue past the stadium entrance towards Darlington, then turn right at the next mini roundabout and there is street parking available alongside the park. It is then around a 10-minute walk to Blackwell Meadows.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Darlington Railway Station is located one-and-a-half miles away from Blackwell Meadows. There is a possibility to either take a taxi from the station, or embark on the 30 minute walk to the ground. As you come out of the main railway entrance, you will see Hogans Bar on one corner. Keeping the bar on your left and proceed straight along Victoria Road. Go straight across at the next roundabout continuing along Victoria Road. At the next larger roundabout take the first exit by Sainsburys onto the A167 (Grange Road) towards Northallerton. Follow this road for around one mile. After passing a park on your left you will reach the ground entrance further down on the same side.

FACILITIES

For fans there is a clubhouse at the ground itself which is opened to supporters of both clubs. There is a lack of other pubs near to Blackwell Meadows. In fact the nearest bars and pubs are located one mile away in Darlington town centre, which is around a twenty minute walk away. Some of the picks of these are some of those that are listed in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide, such as the Number Twenty 2.

RUSHALL OLYMPIC

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 3RD, 2024 - 3PM KICK-OFF

The Iron return to the Attis Arena for their first encounter of February 2024, as Scunthorpe are set to face National League North lower table languishers Rushall Olympic.

The reverse fixture between the Iron and the Pics took place in late August where United came out on top with an impressive 3-0 win, which was sealed courtesy of a stunning Tyler Denton volley in the game's latter stages.

Despite Liam McDonald's sides league position, they've been no stranger to picking up a number of valuable points on the biggest stage. Notable results include victories against Chester and South Shields over the Christmas period either side of back-to-back encounters with promotion hopefuls Tamworth which ended in narrow 2-1 defeats on both occasions.

Amongst the Rushall ranks is former Scunthorpe midfielder Sam Mantom who joined the club for his second stint in Amber ahead of the 2022-23 campaign in which the Pics gained promotion from the Southern League central Division. Mantom made 34 appearances in claret and blue across a two-year period, scoring two goals, before departing for Southend in 2018.

Last week, they emerged victorious in a seven-goal thriller, jumping ahead of their opposition Spennymoor Town to 17th in the process, winning 4-3. Danny Waldron, the league's top goalscorer, notched another two to add to his growing collection, with the Pics now on 33 points from their 28 games.
