First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...

In having Michelle take ownership of the football club, we have someone you will all know quite well with her having a long standing relationship with the football club. She is a local businesswoman who has the best interest of the club at heart and will work tirelessly to get things right, and back on track. We were very disappointed with the second half performance last week, after feeling we deserved to be ahead at half-time. Today represents an opportunity to put that right, and get back to winning ways in front of what will be a bumper crowd.

"There are a lot of challenges and problems to overcome, but David has taken no fee for the club, and wiped all monies that he personally invested to enable this deal to happen. I wish him and his family all the best for the future, and I hope he finds some peace away from football.

"I'd also like to acknowledge the



efforts of Simon Elliott, who has massively assisted in getting this deal over the line. There is now a lot of work to do behind the scenes to get our great football club back on track, and that work starts immediately with the fantastic team we have working for us, starting with the appointment of a new board."

ZERO-TOLERANCE POLICY ON THROWING OBJECTS AND THE USE AND CARRYING OF PYROTECHNICS

Scunthorpe United Football Club would like to remind supporters about a zero-tolerance policy with regards to throwing objects, as well as the use and carrying of pyrotechnics at both home and away matches.

Ensuring the safety of our supporters, players and staff is always of paramount importance to Scunthorpe United Football Club and the throwing of objects and lighting of pyrotechnics at football stadia is very dangerous and a serious offence. Any supporter identified to have committed such an act will be banned by the club and also subject to the possibility of criminal prosecution and football banning orders.

Scunthorpe United will continue to work closely with the police and football authorities to stamp out this, and other types, of spectator misconduct.

We would also like to remind supporters that if there are incidents of this nature reported, then the FA have the power to impose serious financial penalties on the club which will almost certainly impact on its playing resources.

In addition to the organic traffic to the page from people from across the world donating, the page is sure to have had an abundance of traffic, with numerous people refreshing the page in sheer disbelief of just how much money was being pledged. Within hours, the page reached

five figures, and within 24 hours the site had hit a figure that was only imagineable beyond the wildest aspirations just that one day before.

From the very poignant donation of £1,899 from Ian Sharp, to joint Grimsby Town owners Jason Stockwood and Andrew Pettit - the Iron's fiercest rivals - pledging £500 each, to the United gaffer's son Jimmy Dean Jr putting £100 of his birthday money in. From player Jacob Butterfield adding £500, to the hundreds and hundreds of supporters, not just of Scunthorpe, but multiple clubs across the globe adding what they could, it was hard to not have a tear rolling down your face as the very meaning of "United we Stand" emerging.

The impact this gesture has had on the staff at the football club has been massive. We

cannot quantify just how much it has meant to us all to see the whole of football come together.

Of course, we weren't the only SUFC to get their takeover this week, with Southend United also announcing their change of ownership just 24 hours before ours. Another fantastic football club with a rich history, and another that has dropped from the EFL. We've had some really competitive meetings with the Shrimpers over the years. 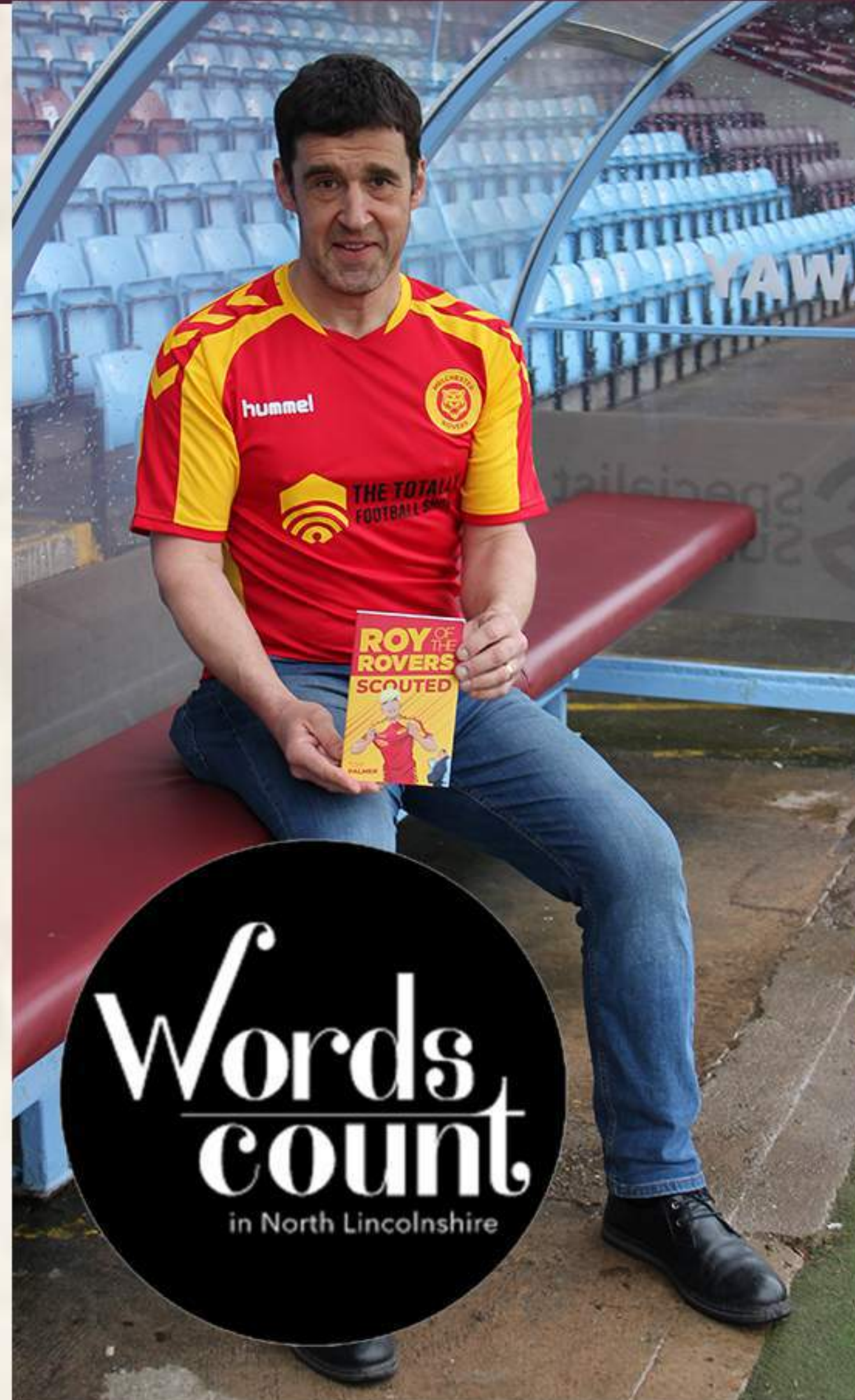
Scunthorpe United Reading Stars

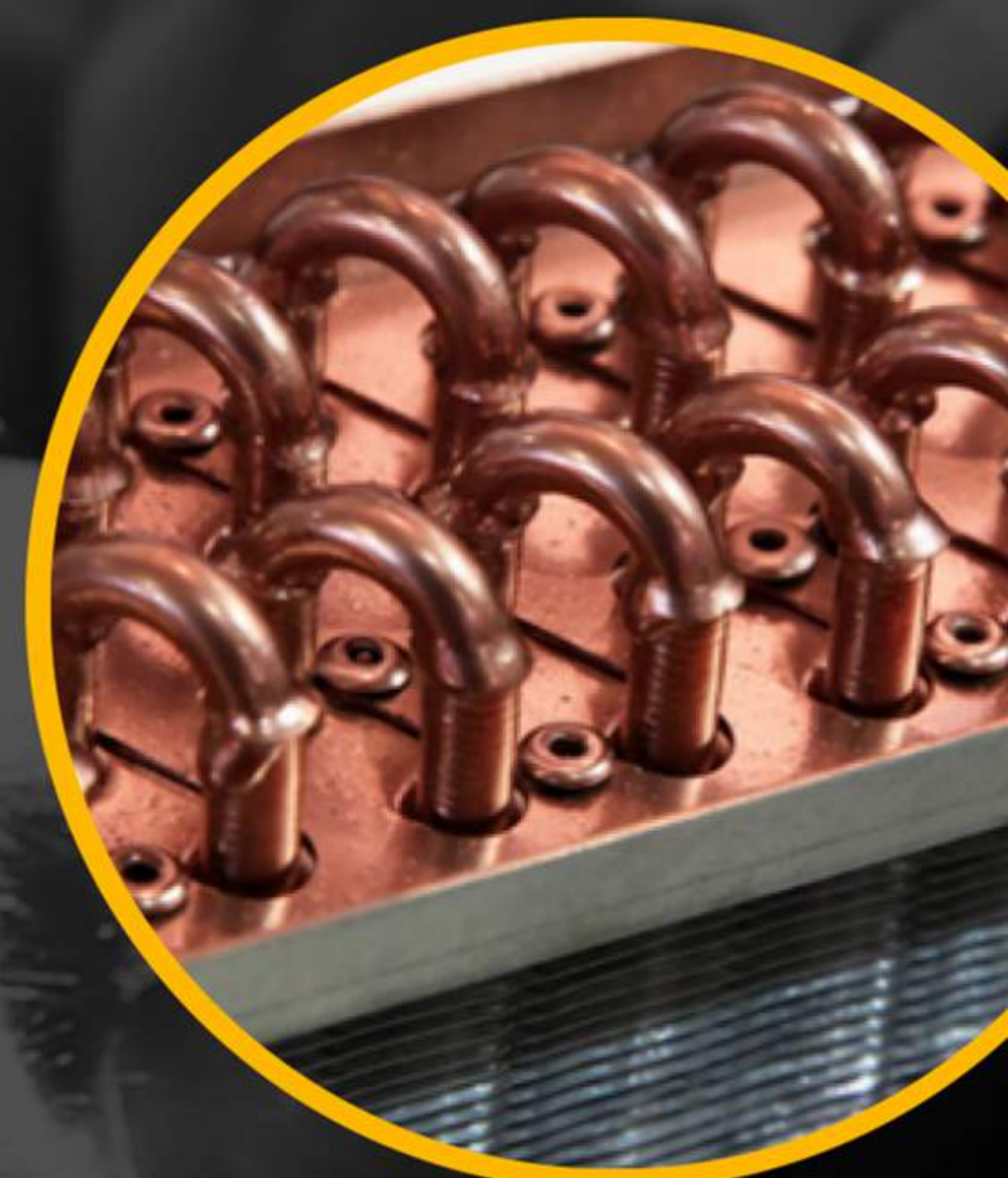

Summer signing Ross Barrows' 28-day recall option was activated during September, with the defender returning to Jimmy Dean's ranks after an impressive stint at Ilkeston Town. He made six appearances and scored once while with the Robins.

Barrows made his Ilkeston debut in the first game of the season as his side faced predicted strugglers Marske United away from home. In this fixture, Barrows featured for the full 90 minutes and helped his side take a 3-1 win back to Derbyshire.

Barrows was selected in the starting XI again for the following Tuesdays 4-0 thumping of Gainsborough Trinity in which he played another full game. But by far Barrows' best performance in a Robins shirt came during Ilkeston's 6-1 demolition of Workington in which he picked up a goal and on top of that the man of the match award.

This game was then followed by a disappointing 1-0 loss away to FC United of Manchester in which Barrows racked up another 90.

Since returning to the Iron, the former youth player made his debut off the bench at Chorley before making his full league debut for the club last weekend against Buxton.

MARCUS CARVER

After joining the Iron ahead of the 2022-23 season, the striker made 20 appearances in claret and blue last campaign and since the last addition he's been thoroughly enjoying his football at fellow National League North outfit and initial strugglers Southport.

Under new boss Jim Bentley, Carver has excelled over the course of September earning himself five goals which have contributed to the Sandgrounders recent rejuvenation.

Going into September, Southport were bottom of the National League North table and only managed to amass one point from their five August fixtures, in the form of a 0-0 draw against Brackley.

Going into the month with plenty to prove, Bentley's men have more than impressed with Carver leading the line - firstly, defeating Hereford 1-0 courtesy of a magnificent Carver strike to sink the Bulls.

Looking to build on the momentum of their first win of the campaign Southport stringed together a further two wins against Scarborough and an impressive 4-1 dispatching of promotion hopefuls King's Lynn in which Carver scored a hat-trick. Next, a disappointing 3-0 defeat on the road to lower league side Morpeth Town in the Emirates FA Cup could also be seen as a blessing as in their last outing they claimed a valuable point in a 0-0 draw against highflying Tamworth at the Big Help Stadium.

HARRISON POULTER

Promising first year professional Poulter has been gaining valuable minutes of first-team action over the course of the season whilst on loan at Gainsborough Trinity.

September seems to have turned a corner of late for the Holy Blues, following the departure of Iron Hall of Famer Neal Bishop, who was replaced by another United ledged in the form of League Two promotion-winning, and record breaking, manager Russ Wilcox.

Having been ineligible for the Emirates FA Cup, Poulter missed the side's two games in the competition. This was soon followed by another game that the deadly striker Poulter wasn't used in as his side were again defeated by an in-form Morpeth outfit.

Following the defeat, Bishop resigned from his position that was filled via Wilcox in the days that followed. Poulter found himself as an unused substitute for Wilcox's first game in charge, however his side gained three points with a comfortable 4-1 victory.

JOSH ROBERTSON

Creative midfielder Robertson has accumulated over 90 minutes of action over the course of September for Northern Premier League strugglers Marske United, in a month where the Seasideers have been defeated four times and won once Robertson's agile style of play has been a bright light for his side when featuring primarily off the bench.

Robertson was ineligible to feature in the Emirates FA Cup over two fixtures, with a 3-0 victory over Ossett Town followed up by a 4-1 defeat against Lancaster City.

Robertson made his first appearance of the month against Matlock, but was substituted at half-time as former Hartlepool manager Graeme Lee searched for an answer to Matlock's onslaught with a triple substitution, however his side was inevitably defeated 5-0 on the day.

Following this, Marske were handed two further defeats as Robertson was a used substitute in both fixtures, playing 10 minutes as his side were defeated 2-1 by an in-form Marine outfit, and a further 15 minutes in Marske's 4-2 defeat against Whitby.

THE CORNER TURNED?

MORE YORK HAM AND UP FOR THE CUP AGAIN

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

One hundred years ago the seasons at Scunthorpe were changing, as summer warmth and shirt sleeves gave way to autumn and a jumper and jacket. Followers of the Nuts had felt a cool breeze from the first four competitive matches, with only two points gleaned, from visits to York and Gainsborough, when the performances were not too inspiring. Losses at home to Denaby, and 4-1 at Notts County gave shivers down the spine for devotees of the Club.

However, there had been an upturn in fortunes during the past fortnight, as a visit by Sutton yielded two points from a 2-1 result, and an improved display. This was followed by a 5-1 FA Cup beating of Grimsby Rovers in the Preliminary Round of the Cup, but this was expected against weaker opposition. The question in supporters minds was could the improvements be maintained for the visit of York City to the Old Show Ground, on September 29th 1923.

The Directors of the club were in no mood to radically change the personalities in the team, and the same eleven that represented the Nuts against Grimsby Rovers was selected. However, at the last minute Reynolds was unavailable, and the ever reliable stalwart, John Wogin, took the gloves. Thus the adjusted line-up consisted of the following: Wogin, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Hargreaves, full backs, Skull, Forbes and Blenko, half backs, Meredith, Burkinshaw, Kitchen, Raby and Foster, forwards.

The match against York City commenced with a reasonable sized crowd, in which a number of City supporters voiced their approval at the visitors thrust at

the visitors thrust at the Scunthorpe goal, but Hargreaves and Skull were alert to cut out any danger. However, the visitors were frustrated when the Nuts took the lead on fifteen minutes. Meredith dodged past Wood on the right side of the park, and place the perfect pass on to the head of Raby, who nodded gratefully a smart goal. York almost equalised before half time, but for nimble work in catching the ball by Wogin.

After half-time, the gathering clouds closed in on the Old Show Ground, putting the light into partial darkness, and on fifty three minutes York equalised in the gloom. Rippon took the ball past Hargreaves and Bradbury, and although Wogin block the initial shot, Elliot rushed onto the over-spill.

This setback only pressed the Nuts into further action, as their

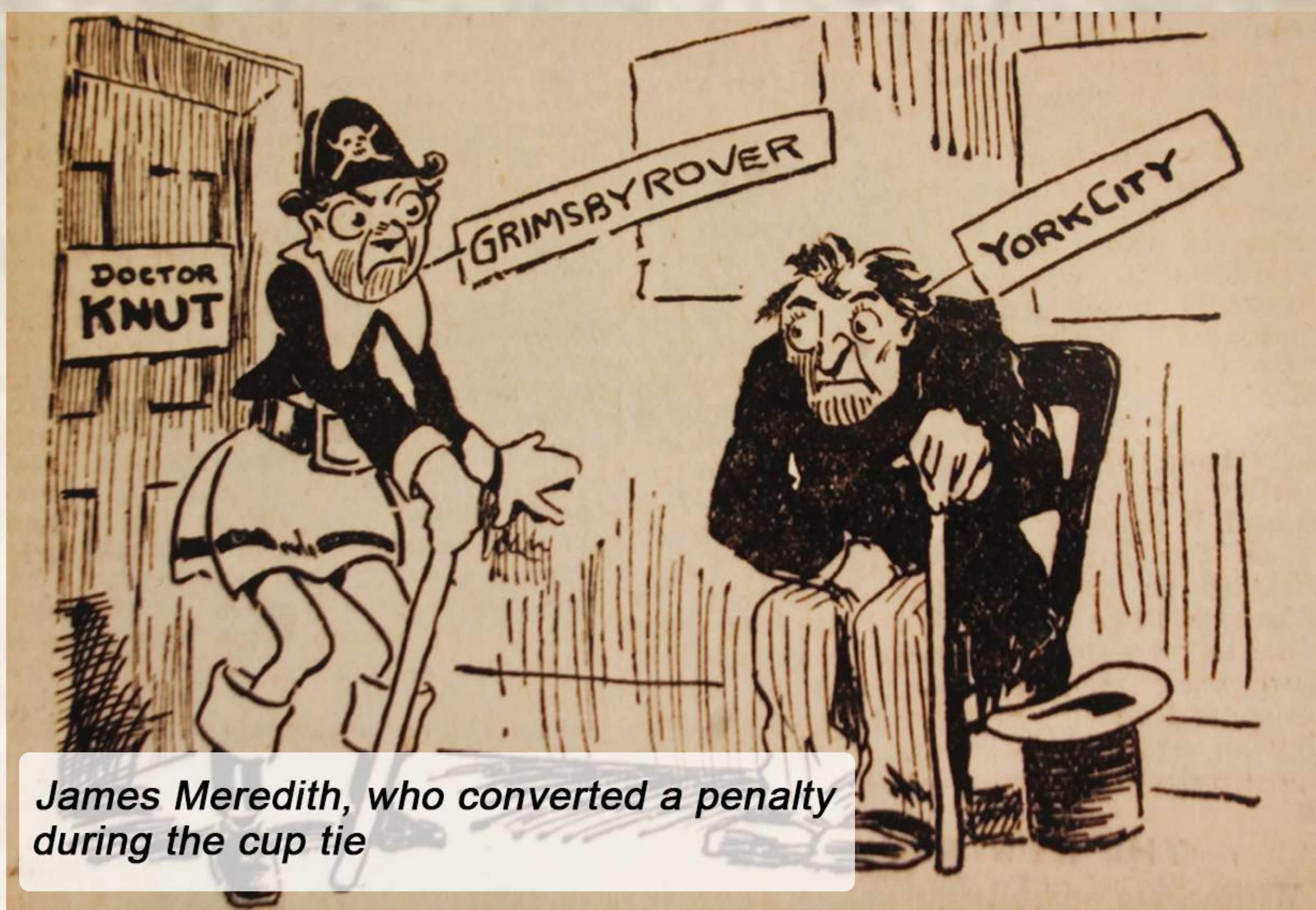
Kitchen opened the scoring after 20 minutes and then ten minutes later Scunthorpe scored the other four goals in seven minutes. Kitchen obtained the sec-

as their forwards buzzed like busy bees round the City target. They had a confident appeal for a penalty rejected, but immediately after, on the hour, restored the advantage. Meredith supplied to Kitchen, for perfectly headed goal.

By this time York City's brave men were fading fast. Jimmy Forbes added a third goal, moments later, cheered on by the expectant Scunthorpe band. There would only be one team that was going to score again, and indeed this final one, almost on the final whistle, was the best. It was created by the men in midfield, and a neat through ball was cottoned onto by Joe Kitchen. Boot, in the City goal, came racing out, and at the vital second, Kitchen lifted the ball over his head, and into the net. At 4-1 the early season misery was beginning to be forgotten.

Sadly, this was to be the last United supporters would see of favourites Jimmy Forbes and Jack Meredith, because Blackpool came knocking on the Old Show Ground door to offer a cheque for their services. This meant changes for Saturday's forth coming Cup-tie against

A BRIEF HISTORY

Brackley is a small but growing Northamptonshire market town of around 15,000 inhabitants situated between Northampton, Milton Keynes and Oxford. The nearest point of reference for many people would be the Silverstone motor racing circuit and Formula One has a big presence in the town as base for the world champion Mercedes team.

Founded in 1890 Brackley Town was, around the turn of the century, a prominent side in the local area. At one time the name of Tottenham Hotspur appeared on the fixture list, London being a short journey away on the newly opened Great Central Railway.

In 1974 the club moved back to the North Bucks League and this coincided with a move to the current St James Park ground. A small clubhouse and changing rooms were built and within three years the major step up into the Hellenic League was made.

The 1992-93 season ended with the ignominious distinction of having the worst playing record of any senior side in the country. It

was only the fact that others did not have the required facilities for promotion that they were spared relegation.

With finances at full stretch however, the club was forced into voluntary liquidation in February 1999. It was saved at the last minute to ensure that the season was completed. The "new" club finished bottom of the Southern Section and were therefore demoted back into the Hellenic League.

The 2003-04 season saw an exciting run-in and the championship shield lifted on the last day of the season and with it promotion back to the Southern League.

2011-12 saw arguably the most successful season in the club's history to that point culminating in winning the Southern League Premier Division and a second Senior Cup victory. The team lifted the Southern League shield at a jubilant St James Park after a 6-0 thrashing of St Albans City.

The first season in the Conference North began with a 4-1 win at Altrincham to announce the arrival of Brackley Town at Step 2 and

saw the side make it all the way to the play-off final losing by a single goal to FC Halifax Town at St James Park.

2017-18 would see Brackley lift the FA Trophy and finish third in their most successful season to date, while the side continue to be a real threat to make it into the National League Premier Division for the first time in their history, narrowly missing out in the play-offs after finishing as runners-up last season.

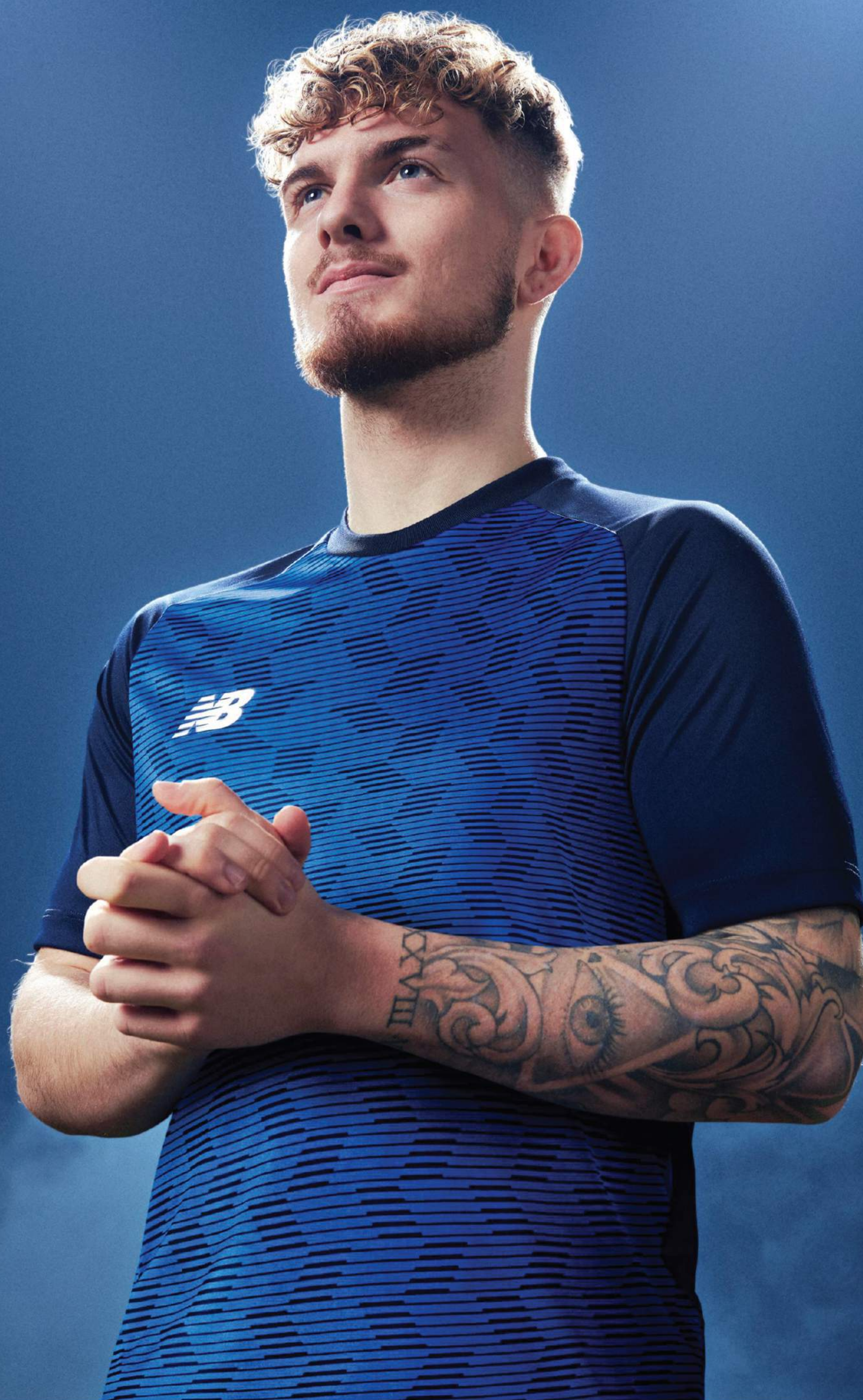

ON THE ROAD CHESTER



SATURDAY, OCTOBER 21ST - 3PM

There's a break for the Iron next weekend, as the away fixture against Boston United has been postponed following the Pilgrims' progression in the Emirates FA Cup.

As a result, the Iron's next game is in two weeks time as the side cross the border to face Chester at the Deva Stadium. Last season, the side finished third in the Vanarama National League North, but lost out in the play-offs as sixth-placed Kidderminster Harriers were the side elevated to the next level.

THE STADIUM

The stadium opened in 1992, two years after the closure of Chester City's Sealand Road stadium.

In the intervening two seasons, the club had played at Macclesfield Town's Moss Rose stadium. The name Deva comes from the original Roman name for the fort Deva Victrix, which became the city of Chester.

The stadium straddles the England-Wales border at Sealand, on the outskirts of

Chester. The stadium initially had a capacity of 6,000 before the away end was converted to seating, and now holds 5,400.

Restrictions have been placed on the stadium and, as a result, the capacity has been temporarily reduced.

BY CAR

161 miles from Glanford Park, it will take around two hours and 20 minutes to journey to from the Iron's stadium.

> Take Doncaster Road/A18 to A1077

> Take M180, M18, M62, M60 and M56 (Junction 20A) .

> Take the A540 exit towards Hoylake / Chester

> Continue on Parkgate Road across the roundabouts before taking the second exit onto Deva Link (A5480), with the destination on the left following a right turn.

CAR PARKING

There is plenty of car parking available at the ground, at a cost of £2 per car.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Chester Railway Station is over two miles from the ground, so either a taxi or public transport would be the advised method.

If you want to go by public transport then take the Railink bus to the bus exchange and then the Number 10 which runs along Sealand Road.

If walking, there are a number of pubs en route to the ground, although there are fewer as you get closer and closer to the stadium.

FACILITIES

There is a Social Club at the ground that does admit away supporters, for an entrance fee of £1.

However the Club is on the small size (having a capacity of 120 people) so can quickly get full.

There are not many drinking outlets near to the ground so it may be advisable to drink in Chester City Centre before the match, although this is a good 20 minute walk away from the ground.

SPENNYMOOR TOWN

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 24TH, 2023 - 7.45PM KICK-OFF

The Iron next host a league fixture in midweek towards the end of the month in the first of Tuesday-Saturday back-to-back encounters on home soil.

It will, as for many teams this season, be the first encounter between the two sides competitively, as we welcome the Moors to North Lincolnshire.

Moors are competing at the highest level in their history after promotion in April 2017. An opening day victory over giants Stockport County set the tone for the campaign that followed, which saw Moors occupy a play-off berth for most of the season. Coupled with a run to the quarter-finals of the FA Trophy, it was a memorable year for those in black and white.

So far this season, the side have enjoyed a really strong start and sit above the Iron in third position with 20 points from their opening 10 games.

Starting the campaign with a 3-0 away win at Banbury, their sails were lowered a week later as they were humbled 4-1 at home to Tamworth. They'd be straight back on it with three wins in a row, beating Southport (5-1), Peterborough Sports (2-0) and Bishop's Stortford (1-0) before a defeat against Blyth Spartans and draws against Chester and Warrington Town.

They have also beaten Hereford and Buxton, but lost to Marine in the Emirates FA Cup following a replay.
