

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to midfielder Alfie Beestin as he looks for a run of games following injury...





Undoubtedly it's been a frustrating couple of years for midfielder Alfie Beestin. Now the Iron's longest serving professional player, he's been at the club through the lows the side have endured over the past few seasons, but he's also had to encounter his own drastic negatives in that time.

Plagued by injury over the last couple of years in particular, the 26-year-old would arguably be one of the standout players in the Vanarama National League North on his day, but the midfielder hasn't had too many opportunities to show that so far this season, with the hamstring injury suffered last season continuing to hamper him so far this.

"The physios have been great with me, and got me back on the grass quicker than I thought. I was a day away from going back into full training, and I went for a little sprint and felt it. While wanting to be part of the renaissance of the team, the 26-year-old also has to battle with himself, as his own critic.

"I always expect the best from me. My aim is always to be the best player on the pitch and in training. If I'm not doing that, I'm hard on myself, maybe too much. I think you've got to do that "It's been our aim to finish top since the start of the season, and that's not going to change. We know we've got a good enough squad to win every game. We're always going to believe we're good enough to win the league. We go into each game believing we can win, and that's got to be the mindset.

"It shows what the club is all about. We have amazing support for this level. To have over 5,000 fans on a Tuesday is unbelievable. We need their support more than ever now, so if they can keep coming out and supporting us, that will give us more belief that we can win this league."

Iron midfielder Tom Pugh has been recalled from his Ioan to fellow Vanarama National League North side Hereford.



In his first month out on loan at Edgar Street, Tom made seven appearances (five starts, two from the bench), scoring one goal and adding one assist, along with man of the match accolades.

That loan spell was extended for a further month in December, the midfielder has made a further six appearances for the Bulls, fast becoming a fans' favourite.

On January 10th, it was announced that his loan spell would be extended until the end of the season, with the Iron activating the 24 hour recall on Monday morning.

Technically gifted Iron winger Dion Sembie-Ferris has been recalled from his Ioan spell at fellow Vanarama National League North Peterborough Sports. The 600 tickets allocated to the lron for our away trip to face Scarborough Athletic on Saturday, February 17th (1pm kick-off) sold out in a little over an hour.

Pugh had scored in consecutive games for Hereford in the last week, first converting a free-kick against Torquay United in the Isuzu FA Trophy before an impressive long range strike against King's Lynn Town.



The Iron's away league clash against Darlington was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch. Since his arrival at United in the January of 2023 Sembie-Ferris has made a total of 15 appearances in North Lincolnshire, which includes six starts and a singular goal, which came against Darlington. His latest appearance in claret and blue came in midweek on his return.

After returning to the club where he first player under Jimmy Dean, Sembie-Ferris had been integral in the Turbines recent surge up the league standings and during his time with sports made 13 spirited appearances scoring four goals and thoroughly enjoying his football. Tickets went on sale via Scarborough at 5pm last Sunday evening, with all tickets snapped up a little over an hour later.

A large group of Scunthorpe fans have bought tickets in the home end. These supporters have been emailed to let them know their tickets will be void and will not scan on entry.

The encounter was called off by match referee Melissa Burgin 15 minutes prior to kick-off with both teams on the pitch warming up ahead of the encounter.

As soon as we have a new date for the fixture, we will announce, with a date not yet set by the two clubs and the National League. Due to his excellent form under the management of Michael Gash and Luke Steele, Sembie-Ferris loan agreement saw its 24 hour recall activated on Monday evening hence making him eligible for Tamworth on Tuesday.

Our hosts expect the game to sell-out and no further tickets will be issued at this time.


NIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES THREE ON THE BOUNCE TIME TO ASPIRE, AND THE LINCS CUP Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

North Lincolnshire was approaching mid-winter one hundred years ago, and mothers in the town were hard at work, stoking the fires to ground in Hull, when the Natty Nuts took on the Tiger Cubs of Hull City Reserves. This proved to be a far sterner test for the Scunthorpe visitors. However, a determined defence kept the Tigers' claws away from the Nuts goal, and Raby scored two individual goals, both from breakaways. Another 2-0 advance, and although Raby was hitting the headlines, it was Reynolds, the Scunthorpe custodian, who had three clean sheets to his name in the great assist in the glory.

keep the family warm.

Evidence of this was seen in the belching smoke emitted by fires from each and every orange chimney pot. This was supplemented by more smoke, every time a steam locomotive sauntered along the LNER railway, heading towards Cleethorpes or Doncaster. In the early part of the last century, fog during the winter months was not uncommon, and the white ghostly blankets were referred to as pea souper fogs. They could have damaging effects on the football matches at the Old Show Ground, as players peered desperately in the hope of seeing a colleague with the mud encrusted ball. Despite this handicap, referee rarely postponed a fixture.

Thus the Nuts were back at home on February 2nd, 1924, and the question was, could they aspire to beat the Spirites of Chesterfield, a difficult opponent, who would expect to entertain Scunthorpe United, at Saltergate, a week hence? The Directors making team selections had the happier task of a choice of all squad members, as suspensions, cold and injuries had all come to a positive conclusion. They decided to select the strongest options,

despite some fine performances from promoted reserve players. Thus United emerged from the dressing rooms with the following representation: Reynolds, goal keeper; Bradbury and Hargreaves, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Clark, Kitchen, Raby, Green and Foster, forwards.

A century ago January was ebbing away, and the Nuts had found some encouraging form, although in one case their joy was at the expense of the Atlas of the Midland League, Rotherham Town, who were holding up the entire table from the bottom position. At Clifton Lane, the Nuts had gathered two precious points from a hat-trick from Raby, who was hitting a purple patch in scoring goals. A week later, at the Old Show Ground, Rotherham Town put up a far better performance, but could not match the agility of the entire Scunthorpe team. Once again it was Raby who was the architect of their downfall, and a 2-0 celebration was enjoyed by the supporters with claret and blue favours.

This match was to prove to be one that Scunthorpe United supporters would talk about for many years to come. The man who worked hard to give the Nuts the advantage was Joe Kitchen, who put in a double shift to ensure his team won the points. It was he who made the first goal, his terrific shot rebounding back to him off the mid-point of the upright, from which he regained control of the ball, and laid off a perfect pass for Green to dash onto for a simple tap in past the marooned visiting keeper. On twelve minutes, the lead was increased. This time the ball came in from the left, from Foster, and Kitchen sent a bullet header into the flying net.

On the last Saturday in January, a good following of Scunthonians was present at the Anlaby Road

At 2-0 United were cruising, but then can the sickening incident





which is an unfortunate part of the physical game of football. Oscar Hargreaves was back in the side after a questionable suspension, and on thirty minutes he went for a ball with McIntyre, the Spirits' right winger. At the moment of impact, Hargreaves leg was broken in three places between ankle and knee. The man was in abject pain, and ambulance men took quite some time before he could be removed to the comfort of hospital. This incident put a curtain on the interest of both sides in the game, and the 2-0 score remained until it was the result. Sad to relate, this was a career ending incident to a brave Scunthorpe United

Midland League warrior.

On the following Thursday, the Scunthorpe team had a date at Blundell Park, in the Lincolnshire Cup, but the full Mariners first team assembled against them. It was difficult enough extracting Midland League points from the Junior Mariners, and so this task was a bridge too far. A gallant effort was not enough to stop Carmichael, the Grimsby goal scoring ace, from giving his side a 2-0 passage into the next round of this competition, but the Lincoln City captain would lift the trophy later that year.

Chesterfield was a difficult place to gather any points from, and they were no strangers to being Midland League Champions. On this occasion, Chesterfield made a number of changes to the team that Scunthorpe had subdued. They were always in the ascendancy during the 90 minutes, and the Nuts needed a strong set of defenders to repel the Saltergate attack.

The game was surprisingly won by the visiting Scunthorpe lads, who needed a defender to crash the ball home. Not only did the Nuts beefy centre half Richard Ashmore take the defensive honours, but in one of his advances up the field, he was able to squeeze out a Chesterfield fullback, and crack the ball into the net with the meat of his boot. The goal came just before the interval, but it still meant some dogged defending by the visitors, before the rewarding 1-0 result went onto the record book.

The devastating incident to Hargreaves gave Franklin the opportunity to step back into the limelight, where he had capably stood in, before. However, the eleven men that appeared at Grimsby, which included Franklin, showed one change on the right wing, for the visit to Chesterfield. The trial was given to a player named Mathews, who hailed from the Rotherham district, but he was not to be selected for duty after the one game.







A BRIEF HISTORY

Research has discovered that the original Rushall Olympic Football Club was founded at least three years earlier than had previously been thought with editions of local newspapers found to contain match reports about the Olympic dating back to the 1893-94 season. Aldridge pit) played on the field behind the Miners Arms Public House in Rushall - changing in the pub and enjoying a pint after the game. The team, then playing in old gold and black stripes, was a "good 'un", and won various honours along the way. moderate success in the West Midlands (Regional) League Premier Division, with a highest finish of fifth place achieved in season 1988-89 and a League Cup Final appearance in 1982. However, time moved on, and for the start of the 1994-95 season the club began a new era when it

However, even earlier records have indicated that football in the village of Rushall was already being played on a regular basis at least 20 years prior to that time and in fact the opening game for the newly formed Walsall Town team was against a Rushall side at the Chuckery Ground, Walsall on the 3rd October 1874. Indeed, so many players turned up that it was decided to field a 15-a-side format, with the surplus Walsall men being "loaned" out to make up the Rushall team.

After winning the Walsall & District **Amateur League Second Division** Championship in 1952-53, and later the First Division Championship in 1955-56, the club eventually gained promotion into the strong Staffordshire County League (South) for the start of the 1956-57 season - and made an immediate impact by winning the Second Division title at the first attempt. Following promotion into the First Division, the club later won three back to back Championships between 1960 and 1963 - but Rushall Olympic's real glory season came in 1964-65 when the club clinched the Staffordshire County League (South) First Division Championship for the fourth time in five years and also won the Lichfield Charity Cup, the Sporting Star Cup and the Walsall Senior Cup.

was named as one of the twenty founder members of the Midland Football Alliance.

More recent, last season proved to be a defining moment. After securing a second consecutive play-off spot in the Southern League Premier Division Central , the Pics overcame runners-up Coalville Town with a dramatic 4-3 penalty shoot-out victory, before travelling to tackle Nuneaton in the final where a crowd of over 3,500 gathered to see another intense affair that saw Olympic again triumph 4-3 in a penalty shoot out following a goalless draw, seeing the side promoted to Step 2.

As research continues, the early years of Rushall Olympic will slowly be uncovered, but it is known that a thriving club certainly existed just after the First World War, up until the mid-1930's. During this period the team (many of whom worked at the local



The Iron quickly return back to the Attis Arena next weekend, hosting Curzon Ashton for their latest encounter in the Vanarama **National League North.**

The side have enjoyed a strong first half of the season and sit in seventh position in the league table, having attained 47 points from their 29 games so far. They head into their game this afternoon six unbeaten, with three wins and three draws to their name.

Coincidentally, their last encounter was against the Iron's opposition today, with a 2-2 draw being played out at Rushall Olympic last weekend. Prior to that they emphatically beat King's Lynn Town 4-0 away from home before enduring two draws against Boston United and Farsley Celtic.

Indeed, they went on a four-game winning streak, including three home wins in a row in league and cup, but preceding that they lost four in a row, including three in a row at home.

It was early on in the season when the two sides met in Curzon, with the hosts edging the encounter by the odd goal in what was Scunthorpe's first defeat of the season. It continued the hosts' unbeaten start, and they would continue that for a further game before being edged out by Tamworth and then Chorley.


