Good evening and welcome back to Glanford Park for the second time in three days as we have our first game under the lights of the competitive season.

Tonight is another chance to get three points. I thought that the performance on Saturday was really good. On another day, we win comfortably. If we get the second goal, we might have run away with it, but I know that's ifs and buts. We didn't. We switched off from a second phase of a set piece and I said how I felt about that in my post-match press conference on Saturday.

The game had that feel, it wasn't dead. We needed that second goal, with it being my old club. We've watched it back and put it back into the players. The positives are with the performance. We looked really fluid on Saturday, we moved the ball really well and we moved it quickly and were down to one or two touches. At times, they struggled to live with us, but we just didn't kill the game.

We weren't clinical enough in front of goal, but we have to remember it was just the second game of the season. These kind of things happen, but we earned a draw and hopefully we will put some of those chances away this evening.

Tonight is another opportunity for us. The boys seem in a good place and I'm looking forward to

Darlington come into the game looking for their first points of the season. They lost to a good Curzon Ashton side on the opening day of the season.

They had a football match against them. On Saturday, they went a little bit more direct. It's a difficult game against a former EFL side, with a good manager and good players. They wouldn't have expected the start that they've had, but they will expect to turn it around. We have to make sure that it is not against us that they do that.

There are no fresh injury concerns ahead of this one - just the usual knocks and bruises. It's just Callum Roberts who is out. The scan is taking place today, a day later than anticipated because the surgeon was called into an emergency operation on Monday.

We want a performance better than on Saturday. We were good, but we want to build and we want to see progression. We want to put our chances away, and we want to iron a few of our creases out.

In the main, we looked like a jointed team, and if we keep to those levels, we will win a lot more games than we don't.

We're looking forward to being under the lights. They're fantastic. I think the boys felt the atmosphere at Glanford Park on Saturday. They've realised what they've got behind them and how noisy and passionate you supporters are about this football club.

We just want to give you success. I went into the bar after the game on Saturday and managed to have a chat with a few of you. There are a lot of football people in the building on a matchday and I want to be able to go up to the bar afterwards and see smiling faces. When we do that, we'll have been winning football matches.

I cannot emphasise how grateful we are for the support.

FOCUS ON... DANY WHITEHALL

We continued our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to our match winner from the opening day of the season...



If you're a striker who is going into the new season with a brand new club, the only thing you can hope for is to get off the mark as quickly as you possibly can.

Having come off the bench as a replacement for Danny Elliott just over 10 minutes into the second half at Tamworth, the former Eastleigh frontman had a chance to stake a claim for the starting shirt in attack. With the score locked at 1-1 following an early Ben Acquaye goal which was cancelled out following an assist by just one of the new FA directives to manage lost time more precisely, it wasn't just the new directive that game United a massive assist to restore parity, but the opposition in Tamworth did it for Scunthorpe, via an own goal from Matt Curley.

Enter Danny Whitehall. Super Danny Whitehall. A league debut goal for the Iron at the

first time of asking as he latched onto a knockdown from Will Evans following a free-kick into the area from fellow substitute Jacob Butterfield, to acrobatically send a bicycle kick into the net via the aid of a deflection.

The free-kick award in question yielded the umpteenth yellow card of the game, with referee Matt McQuillan following another new directive to try to stamp delaying the restart of play out of the game. Tamworth still hadn't learnt by their sixth caution on opening day.

None of that mattered at all. The performance, by Jimmy Dean's admission wasn't great and the Iron had the run of the green, something they'd not had for a long time. Three points were on the board, and Whitehall couldn't have been happier with how things panned out: "It was an ideal start for me. Obviously, I would have liked to have been starting from the start of the match, but I'm not the one that picks the team. I stayed professional, waited for my chance and circumstances played into my hands. It was a scrappy game and it was

probably a better game to come on as a substitute rather than to start it, to impact the game in that way. Thankfully, I was in the right place at the right time and was able to put it in the goal.

"90 minutes is a long time - and with the new rules in place, it's even longer, probably over 100 minutes now. There's plenty of time to score goals, whether I start a game or come on as a substitute. Whichever way the gaffer sees it happening, I'm on board with, and thankfully this time it worked out well for us."

With Whitehall and Jacob Butterfield making a positive impact at Tamworth, both were rewarded with starts against Peterborough Sports on Saturday.

Speaking prior to Saturday's game, Whitehall continued: "Hopefully I did do enough to start. It's up to the gaffer. Whichever side he picks, we are a team and we do it together. Whether it's the XI, the 16 or the 21, it's up to us to trust in what he's doing and stick together as a team."

Reflecting on the first eight weeks of his new club, Whitehall is looking to build on his debut goal for the side and add to his tally and hand-in-hand aid United to more points on the board.

"I'm enjoying my time here," he continued.

"It's a good place to be at the minute, with the rebuild that's going on and the togetheness that the gaffer has instilled in the team. It's a good group of lads. Hopefully this is just the start of a successful season.

"We can draw a lot from the Tamworth win. We didn't know about the club's away record until the gaffer told us on the Monday. He didn't want to put that extra pressure on us, but we're glad we've put that one to bed.

"That's the kind of mentality that the gaffer has installed in the squad. It won't always be going well. There will be times where our backs are against the wall, we



in that and sticking together."

There's no secret that the Iron's form on soil will be vitally important during the course of the season, with the side eager to back up the point at the weekend with a

maximum return this evening.

> "A lot of time it will be, without any disrepect to any team, their biggest game of the season. It's a fantastic stadium and many places that have an atmosphere we get through

to use that to our advantage and use that to their disadvantage. We need to use that support to spur us on to play fast, exciting football. I can only see Glanford Park helping us in that way."

Whitehall scored the winning penalty for Eastleigh last season when his former side took the points in North Lincolnshire last season. Having been in both dressing rooms, he gave an insight on what it's like to have the fans behind him and against him.

a huge difference. It's much better having them cheer for you. Both times I played in front of them in pre-season, they were fantastic. They can play a massive part. They can drag the ball into the goal, and it'll certainly be an advantage for us. It's part of the reason I signed here. When I heard of the interest, I wanted to get involved with it. I was on the phone with the gaffer for 45 minutes where I couldn't get a word in, he was that excited. It was sold from the start, and so far it's lived up to




FURTHER DIRECTOR APPOINTED





the deadline of 48 hours prior to kick-off.





The side found themselves behind after just two minutes though as Max Adamson slotted home beyond Ewan Oxborough to give Rovers the lead after a ball through from Jaiden Campbell-Ryce.

United responded well to going behind and won a penalty after 25 minutes following a foul by Chris Pooley. Charlie Burden-Whittleton stepped up and saw his spot kick saved by Jacob Bryant, but the Scunthorpe forward was fortunate the ball sat nicely for the rebound as he restored parity with the rebound.

The Iron could have gone ahead soon after but for a fine save from Bryant, but it was Doncaster who restored their lead on 29 minutes with Will Green sliding in a Harry Wood cutback.

Rovers could have lead by more at half-time, but Oxborough denied Campbell-Ryce, while Adamson twice hit the upright.

United switched goalkeepers at half-time, with Josh Murtagh replacing Oxborough at the interval and he was to be tested within minutes of the restart as Adamson sent an effort narrowly wide. On 48 minutes, however, he was to be picking the ball out of his net as Adamson made no

mistake, meeting an inch perfect cross from Pooley to complete his brace.

The fourth and final goal for the hosts came on 67 minutes when Green's corner was met by Flint and sent into the back of the net. Doncaster could have had more, with a number of chances to follow, with one standout save from Murtagh in particular coming to deny Freddie Allen what looked like a certain goal from his header.

United could have reduced the arrears on 80 minutes when an effort towards the far top corner cannoned back into play off the crossbar.



IMIDIAND LEAGUE DUTIES NEW FIXTURES NEW RECRUITS AND LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

Scunthorpe United had finished sixth in the 1922-23 campaign, a position of which not too many supporters had grumbled at, and made a crusade in the FA Cup which took in three scalps, before going out of the competition at the hands of a high ranking Midland League table of Worksop Town.


An additional bonus was in reaching the Final tie of the Wharncliff Charity Cup, where they were only just beaten, on foreign soil, by Midland League runners-up, Doncaster Rovers, who had been accepted into the Football League, Third Division North. The main blight was, of course, the fire, which had completely destroyed the West Stand.

As with all football clubs, it was never a time to look behind, but instead, to concentrate on the future, and what the Football Authorities had given to them in the way of new fixtures. The bread and butter of the Midland League was the most important aspect, because it was the main source of revenue. In 1923-24, the season was scheduled to commence, on August 25th 1923, at the Fulford Ground, against York City, a Club that had finished fourth from bottom of the pile, last term. This was to be followed one week later, when the first home match on the Old Show Ground would play host to Denaby.

In the years of a century ago, supporters of the Nuts would be keen to find out when the team would be playing the arch rivals of the Blue Boys of Gainsborough Trinity, a team of mid-table quality in the 22-23 season. For all interested parties, this would be at the Northolme in the third match on the calendar, and the return would pitch then together on

March 1st the following year.

Christmas was another time when a game up Clayfield Road, now Doncaster Road, was part of the festivities. The prospects were high in anticipation this campaign, because the Reserves of neighbours would pay a visit on Christmas Day, whilst on Boxing Day, the Nuts would visit the Junior Imps, at Sincil Bank. Although the visit of the mighty Mariners Reserves was of note, this fixture never had the same rivalry as that with Trinity, until after the war. Indeed, remember that Scunthorpe folk at this time might take in a match at Blundell Park, if they could not see the Nuts away from home. However, the Town Reserves would arrive in November, and the Scunthorpe men were due to visit the Cleethorpes based ground at Easter. The friendship of Scunthorpe United and Grimsby Town was demonstrated, when the directors of the latter were delighted to send a first team of Third Division North quality to play a friendly game, in order to open






Norman Reynolds, goalkeeper, also retained

the new West Stand, after the fire.

The custom of the 1920's was that at the end of the season a new broom swept clean, and only a few contracts were extended to the former side. Norman Reynolds had proved his worth, as a reliable custodian, and was an exception. The same went for John Wogin, who was a valuable standby, and had been part of the furniture since 1910. Shem Hill from the pre-Midland League era, classed as a utility man, was given another nod and in defence the directors could not dispense with the razor sharp tackle of left back Oscar Hargreaves. George Bradbury would accompany Hargreaves on the right side of the park, arriving from Chesterfield. Meanwhile, Frank Skull had arrived as a right half of pace and vision from Middlesbrough, and would eventually appear in



300 games for the Nuts. In the central pivot roll Jimmy Forces was released by Lincoln City, but Scunthorpe United groomed him

into a saleable asset, to swell the empty coffers. Ashmore, once of Doncaster, Crooks, from Derby, and local boy Ernie Millson would in future fill the rest of the central roles.

The task of leading the new Scunthorpe United attack was given to J. Burkinshaw from Wath. He was usually to be supported by Raby, from Clapton Orient, and Green, a local lad, but Shem Hill had to stand down as a utility man, when injury caught up with him. From time to time, Burkinshaw and Raby exchanged positions on the field, with happy effect. At outside left, Foster from Rotherham proved a valuable acquisition for the left wing, but after Meredith departed, that part of the park was

problematical, with a number of players not fulfilling the requirements.

However, the top signing of the summer months, which had every tongue waging, was that of former Sheffield United Cup Final goal scorer, inside forward Joe Kitchen, a major threat, despite his senior years. His guile, aggression, awareness and fire power of shot was plain for all to see. He was a man to attract the crowd on a cold winter's day, and time would prove his real value in goals scored. All that was needed now was the clock to tick down for the curtain to be raised on 1923-24.

IT'S A SCUNTHORPE UNITED FACT!

The 2006-07 League One fixture against Blackpool might have ended in defeat, but Billy Sharp's goal broke the club goal scoring record for a single season with 32 goals in all competitions, and results elsewhere meant the Iron were Champions.







OUR VISITORS TODAY

We look a bit deeper on Darlington's history and how they ressurrected themselves from turmoil since we last met on the pitch...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Darlington Football Club was formed in July 1883 when a number of representatives from several teams in the town met in a local grammar school and decided to form one club.

Feethams became the home for the new club, and stayed there until 2003, when the club moved across town to a new 27,000 seater arena. Feethams was leased from local businessman John Beaumont Pease in 1866 and the first turf came from the nearby cricket pitch. Two years after its formation the club ventured into the FA Cup for the first time but was beaten 8-0 by Grimsby.

Darlington were one of the original founder members of the Northern League in 1889 and went on to win the title twice in 1896 and 1900. The club turned professional in 1908 and decided to join the newly formed North Eastern League – although it would return to the Northern League most unexpectedly a century later.

After just missing out on promotion in the 1969-70 season, the club's fortunes nosedived.

Between the 1969-70 and the 1979-80 seasons Darlington had to apply for re-election to the Football League no less than five times, but fortunately every time the club was successful, probably because Darlington was easy enough to reach on the motorway and rail network, unlike other clubs such as Barrow and Workington.

The eighties saw the club in a financial mess and fans were forced to raise £50,000 in just six weeks. The fans and people of the town rallied round and the money was raised to save the club. In 1985 the team won promotion to the third division under manager Cyril Knowles and stayed there for two years. But then successive relegations followed, and in the 1988/89 season the club finished bottom of the fourth division and were relegated to the Vauxhall Conference.

Playing at Wembley had always been a pipe-dream for Quakers until 1996, when they reached the third division play off final against Plymouth Argyle. They finished fifth in the regular season after suffering only one away defeat in the league all season – they missed out on automatic promotion on the last day at

Scunthorpe.

By the turn of 2012, the club was back into administration for the third time. After overcoming several difficult hurdles and negotiating for many hours, a supporters group took control of the club with the aim of making it stable once again, but the FA ruled, despite an appeal, that Quakers should be demoted from the Conference back to the Northern League - an unprecedented drop of four divisions.







Defender Steve Foster featured for both teams during his professional career.

At the Iron between January 2006 and May 2007, he made a total of 68 appearances, scoring once, leading the Iron to a League One Championship title in 2006-07 as a stalwart in defence.

Foster signed for Darlington after leaving Scunthorpe in May 2007 and would remain there until March 2010. During that much more extensive spell up north, he would make a total of 107 appearances, scoring three goals. He played around 700 games in total in his career spanning 1992 through to 2014.



SATURDAY. AUGUST 26TH - 3PM

The Iron are on the road for three Saturdays on the bounce now. We documented our trip to Rushall Olympic at the weekend and for this edition look ahead to our visit to Curzon Ashton the following weekend.

The side finished 13th out of 24 in the National League North last season and will be looking to build on that in the current campaign. They opened the season with a commanding 3-1 win against promotion hopefuls Darlington, who visit Glanford Park this evening.

THE STADIUM

Curzon Ashton have played at the Tameside Stadium in Ashton-under-Lyne since 2005, which has a capacity of 4,000 (524 seats).

The stadium was officially opened by Sir Alex Ferguson. For the first game at the new ground, Curzon played a Manchester United XI which included Gerard Piqué, Giuseppe Rossi, Fraizer Campbell and Jonny Evans.

Outside the stadium, a statue stands commemorating three locally born footballers associated with the World Cup; Geoff Hurst (born in Ashton), Jimmy Armfield (Denton), and Simone Perrotta (also born in Ashton).

The Iron have been handed 1,500 tickets for the game, which are on sale from Glanford Park and online. 200 of those are seating.

BY CAR

93 miles from Glanford Park, Rushall will take around one hour and 40 minutes to journey to from the Iron's stadium.

- > Take Doncaster Road and A1077(M) to M181
- > Take M180, M18, M62 and M60 to Manchester Rd/A635 in Ashton-under-Lyne. Take the exit for A635 from M60
- > Continue on Manchester Rd/A635 to the destination, continuing left onto Margaret Street before turning right onto Richmond Street. Go through two roundabouts before turning left. Take the first exit at the final roundabout and the destination will be on your right.

CAR PARKING

There is a large car park at the ground which is free.

The nearest Railway Station is Ashton-under-Lyne which is located just over a mile or a 15-20 minute walk away from Tameside Stadium. The station is served by trains from Manchester Victoria and Huddersfield.

Five minutes walk away from the stadium is Ashton West Metrolink stop. This stop is on the line from Manchester Victoria and Piccadilly. Journey time from Piccadilly is just under half an hour. Trams run every 12 minutes.

Most visiting fans are impressed with the stadium, its facilities and friendliness of welcome. If you get chance then visit the Programme Shop inside the stadium, which has a vast number of football programmes for sale (many at very reasonable prices).

SCARBOROUGH ATHLETIC

MONDAY, AUGUST 28TH, 2023 - 1PM KICK-OFF

The Iron welcome back another team to Glanford Park which they haven't faced for a number of years, with Scarborough Athletic journeying to North Lincolnshire for the first time since January 1999.

In what will be United's third home game of the season, and final of August, Jimmy Dean will be looking to build on what has been a positive start to the new campaign.

A team which was promoted last season from the Northern Premier League Premier Division, the Seadogs were edged out on the opening day against the Iron's opponents at the weekend Peterborough Sports by a slender 1-0 margin.

On Saturday, Scarborough welcomed Banbury United to the Flamingo Land Stadium, with the hosts more than making up for their opening day wobble as they brushed the side away. Frank Mulhern grabbed a first-half brace, with Curtis Durose netting in the 3-0 win.

Last time the two sides met in 1998-99, it was the Iron who recorded emphatic victories in both ties. Firstly, it was a trip to the McCain Stadium on December 28th, 1998, which resulted in a 4-1 away win, before the Iron went one better on home soil just weeks later on January 30th, 1999, winning 5-1.

The season prior, both sides had met on five occasions, with two in the league, two in the League Cup and one in the FA Cup. United won three and drew one of those encounters.
