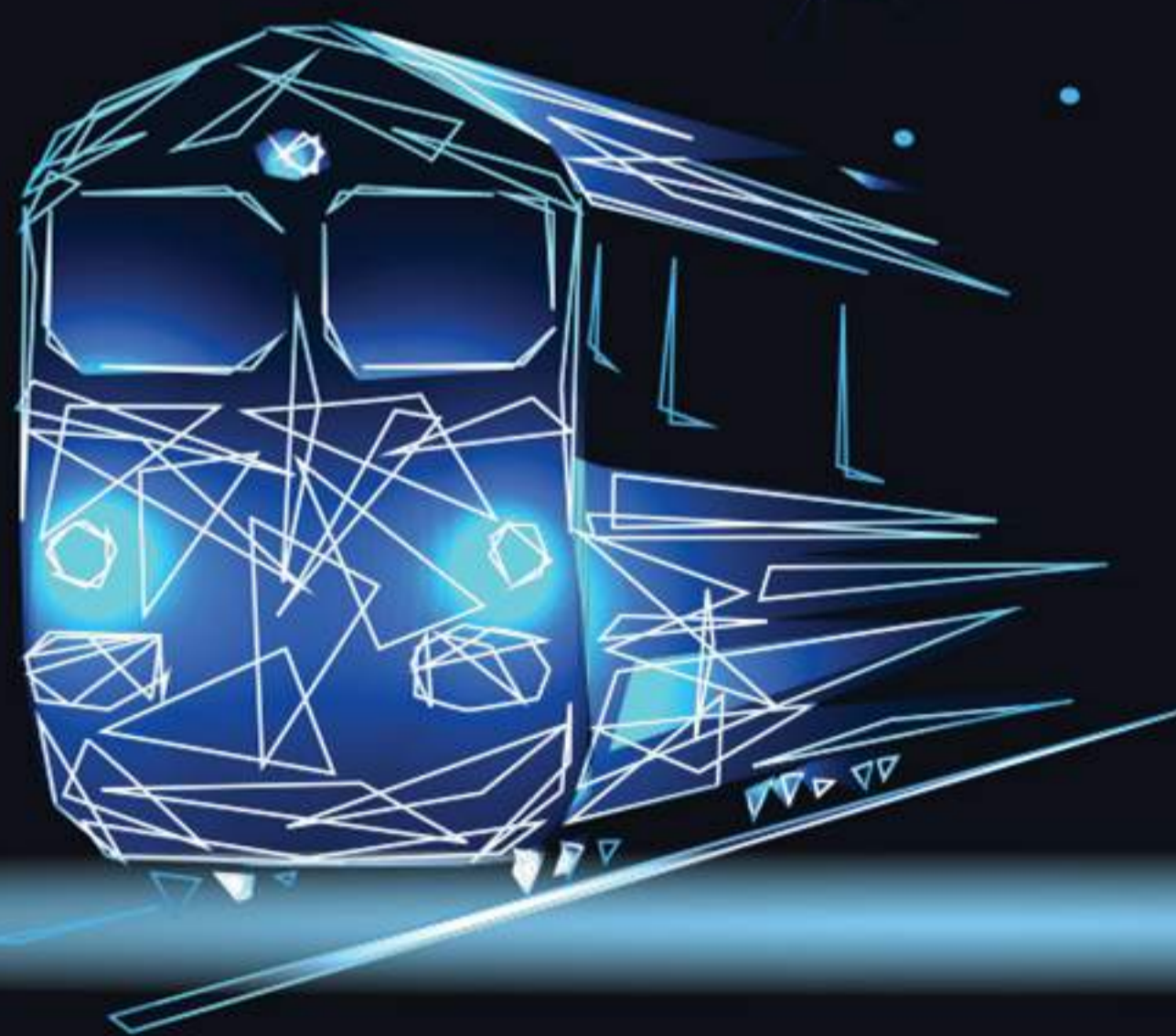
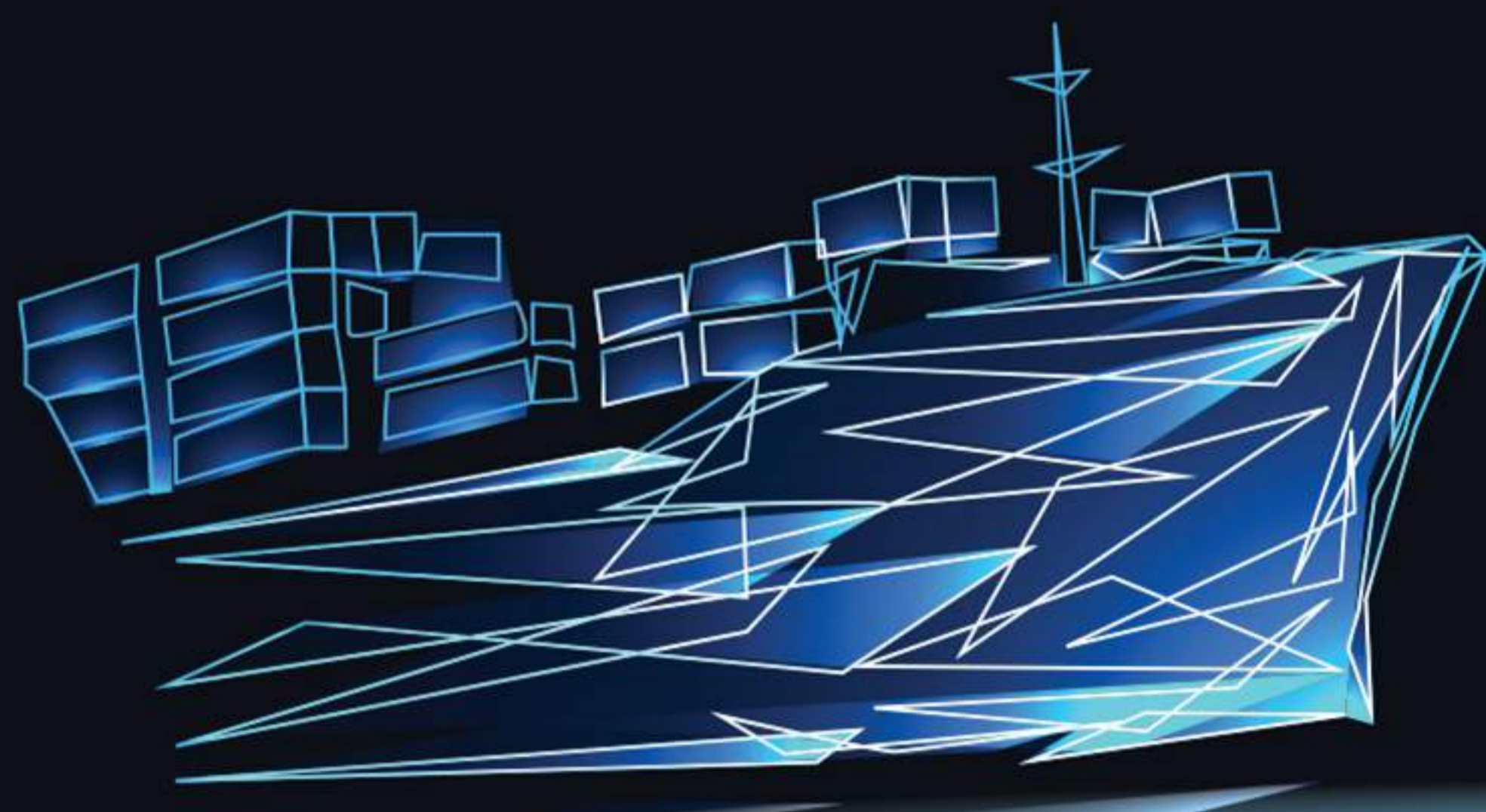

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good afternoon and welcome back to the Attis Arena as we enter the play-offs. Today's game will be a fantastic occasion. As a Lincolnshire derby there will be even more spice on the fixture, with a place in the play-off final at stake.

We ended the regular season in a positive fashion. Our last game here was a resounding 5-1 win over Blyth Spartans where we put in a good performance, scoring five good goals, and keeping that momentum going. We also experienced some silverware, winning the Lincolnshire Senior Cup for the 22nd time. We shared that winning feeling in front of 500 travelling supporters at Lincoln City, coming from 2-0 down to win 3-2, and are buoyed by the desire to experience the same in front of a packed out Attis Arena.

We made a number of changes for the cup final, and for our last league game against Gloucester City last week, and it gave some players the opportunity to get back up to speed, and others to show what they're all about and put them in my thoughts for selection this afternoon. Barring Tyler Denton, we have a fully fit squad going into the play-offs which is a real positive, and it's the kind of headaches I want to have.

With Tyler, it ended up being much more positive news than originally first feared. His season might be over, and we are gutted that he's missing the play-offs after playing such a prominent role in helping us achieve a second-placed finish, but he will only be out for six-to-eight weeks, which means he will be available to play football again in pre-season. He's a great

professional too, so I have no doubt that he will do all the right things in the summer.

Today we come up against a very good Boston United side, who will want to progress as much as we do. They'll be keen to get back to the National League, and we know we'll have to be at our very best to be planning for another game here in seven days time. We must focus on ourselves and be the best possible version we can.

To have a near-8,000 crowd this weekend will be absolutely phenomenal. We've been through an awful lot this season. We nearly lost our football club. We've come through, and we're in this moment. You've been fantastic with us all season. There may be tough moments this afternoon, but the best way you can help us is to stay positive, get behind and rally the team. We saw how it worked when we were 2-1 down against Chester. My best example is my first Saturday at home against Dagenham last season. We went 1-0 down, and the players were

looking at the floor, used to a losing mentality. There was an almighty roar from the DRE, the players lifted their heads up, puffed their chests out. The 12th man is used in a mythical context on many occasions, but here it's not. It's a real 12th man, and it makes a real difference. I urge you this afternoon to keep it positive throughout, stick behind us throughout, and only with your support can we come out of the other side.

You are amazing. It's 6,500 home supporters in a National League North fixture, and that will be for the second time this season, and it's unheard of. I can speak for the staff, the players and myself, and we're absolutely proud to represent this football club, and you as supporters.

Up the Iron!

OPEN DAY



IRON WIN LINCS CUP FOR 22ND TIME

We take the opportunity to talk to Liam McAlinden, who has returned to contention in the last couple of games after serving a three-match ban...



Scunthorpe fought back from two goals down with an inspired second half performance that was led by striker Danny Elliott who took home the matchball.

In a break from league action, the Iron were in with a chance of winning their first silverware of the season, as they were hoping to become Lincolnshire County Senior Cup champions for the 22nd time. Their opponents for the tie at Lincoln City's LNER Stadium were to be last season's runners-up of the competition Spalding United, who were taking a break from their league promotion race to try and avenge for their 1-0 defeat to Grantham Town in the final 12 months ago.

First team manager Jimmy Dean decided to heavily rotate his side for the fixture by making ten changes to the side who beat Blyth the weekend

prior. The United line-up for the evening was comprised of a mixture of youth and experience as coach Andy Butler partnered the returning Will Evans in the centre of defence. Along with this there were debuts awarded for both shot stopper Dan Langley and versatile midfielder Joe Leesley. The last notable change to the side was the inclusion of right-back Ross Barrows who was brought back from his loan stint at King's Lynn to feature.

From minute one, the Iron began to take control of the fixture with some swift play down the left-flank. As an early corner was awarded to United, the set-piece was swung into the crowded penalty area and was dominantly won in the air by Evans who planted his firm header into the hands of Tony Breeden who smothered the effort.

Five minutes into proceedings the Tulips took a surprise lead, and it was fairly deserved after a

sensational move. A deep cross from wide from Riley O'Sullivan managed to evade all defensive attempts to clear the ball and precisely land on the head of Danny Draper who powerfully nodded the ball past Langley to make it 1-0.

As time progressed Scunthorpe remained in control of possession and appeared to be attempting to tire out their opponents. However, this plan certainly wasn't going to plan as Spalding managed to double their advantage on 25 minutes. Under seemingly no pressure Bennett again broke the offside trap and teed up James Clifton in the area who rifled the ball beyond Langley to make it 2-0.

As half-time approached with Scunthorpe in hopes of gaining a route back into the game they were presented a chance to do so from a free-kick in a promising area. The only player standing from the weekend was



was loanee Kai Corbett who stood over the set-piece with a look of confidence. Choosing to shoot Corbett whipped the ball around the wall and drew a sublime save out of the Spalding shot stopper in the half's last notable action.

After a more than lacklustre first half performance, it became immediately obvious that Dean had laid into his side at the break and had given them a rocket for the second period. This was shown as within a matter of minutes when the Iron saw two efforts swept from off the line. This passage eventually led to the much-needed goal as an attempted clearance from a Spalding defender Nathan Stainfield seemed to end up in the back of his own net, however the stadium announcer awarded the goal to striker Danny Elliott. On review, full-back Barrows may well have stolen it on the line.

With Scunthorpe in search of an equaliser to restore order to the fixture they were instead met with an onslaught of Tulips corners from both sides, however nothing was to come from these opportunities as United defended bravely to keep themselves in touching distance.

With half an hour of action remaining the Iron finally managed to find a way to get the equaliser they most desperately desired. The goal would come from the penalty spot which was awarded after a swift attacking move that saw Tom Pugh drive into the area and take a tumble following an attempted tackle. Elliott would step up to the plate, bamboozling Breeden with his signature stuttered run up and dispatching the ball beyond keeper.

With the scores now level the two sides were locked in a tightly contested encounter that saw chances be exchanged. Spalding however possessed the better of the chances as



they had a close ranged free kick from Clifton narrowly miss the mark much to the relief of Langley.

With time running out and penalty's looming large, the pendulum could've proceeded to swing in either team favour and fortunately it tilted to the Iron. A long yet surging run forward from Barrows in defence led to be the perfect advertisement to cement his place in the team for future games as he weaved his way into the final third and slotted a delicate pass into Elliott. With only the keeper to beat Elliott was never in doubt to seal his supposed hat-trick.

That goal was later verified as one by Ross Barrows, who claimed a goal and an assist on his return from King's Lynn.

For the remaining 10 minutes Scunthorpe kept hold of their well-earned lead to steal the trophy from the holders and secure a 22nd cup win for Dean's side.

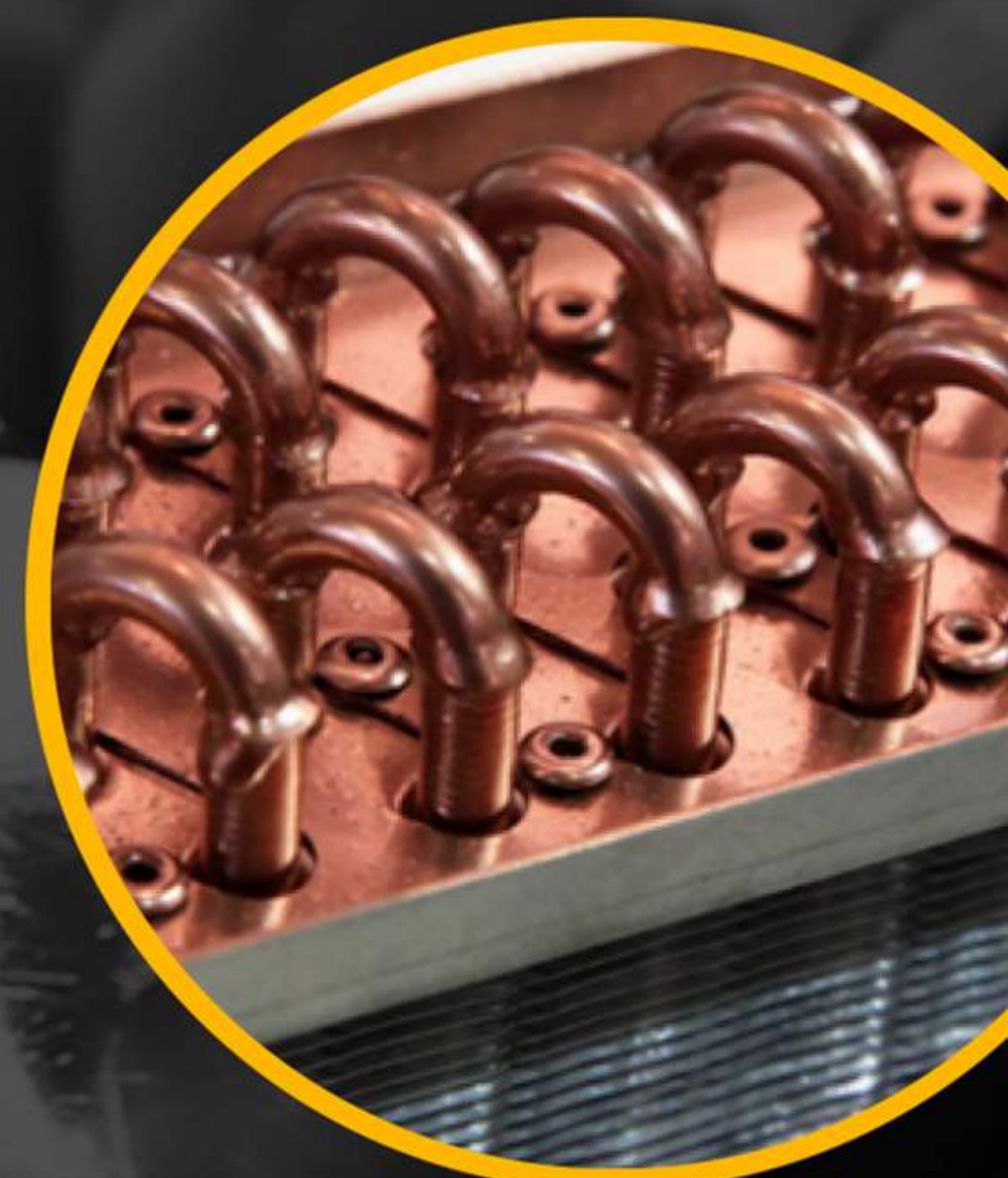

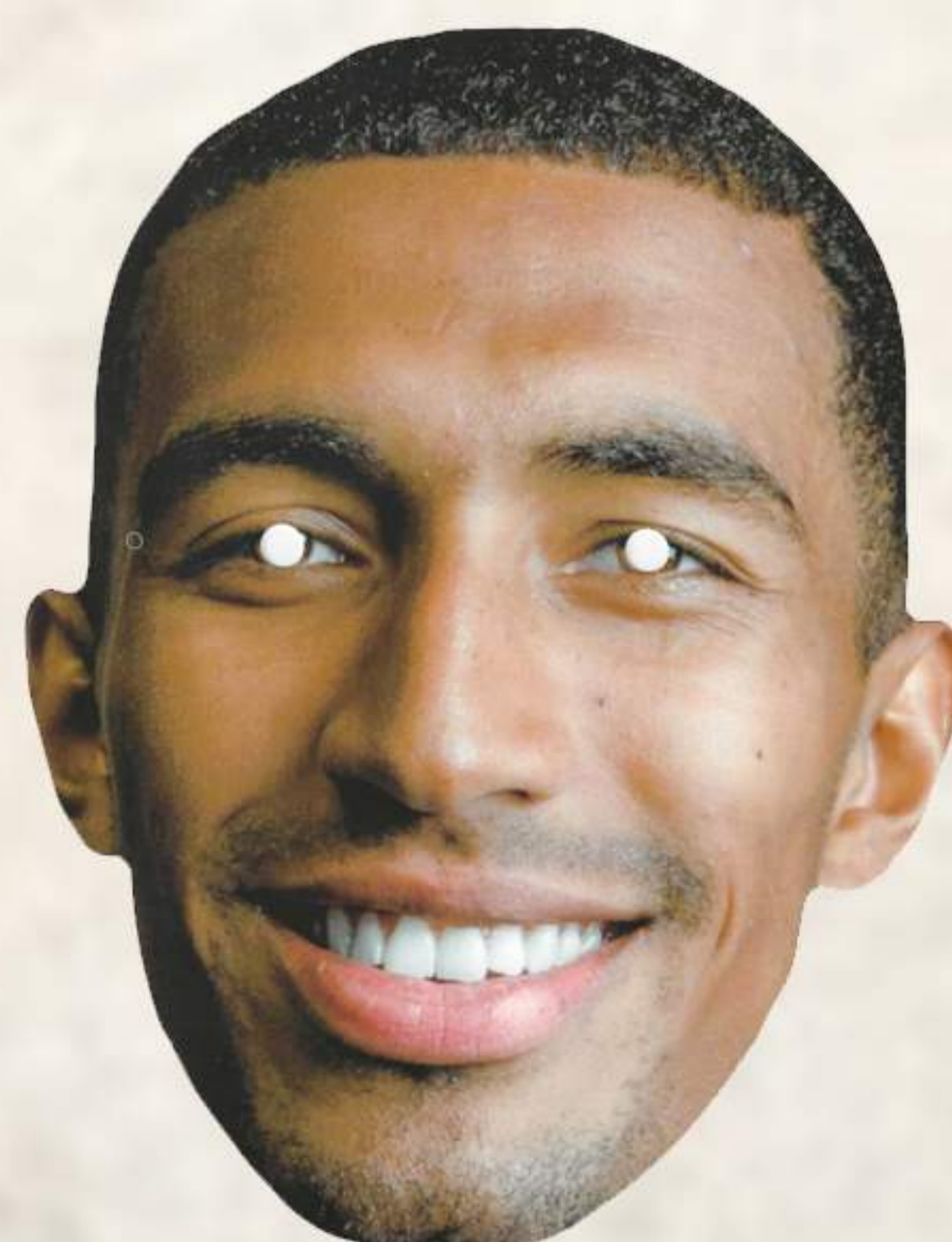
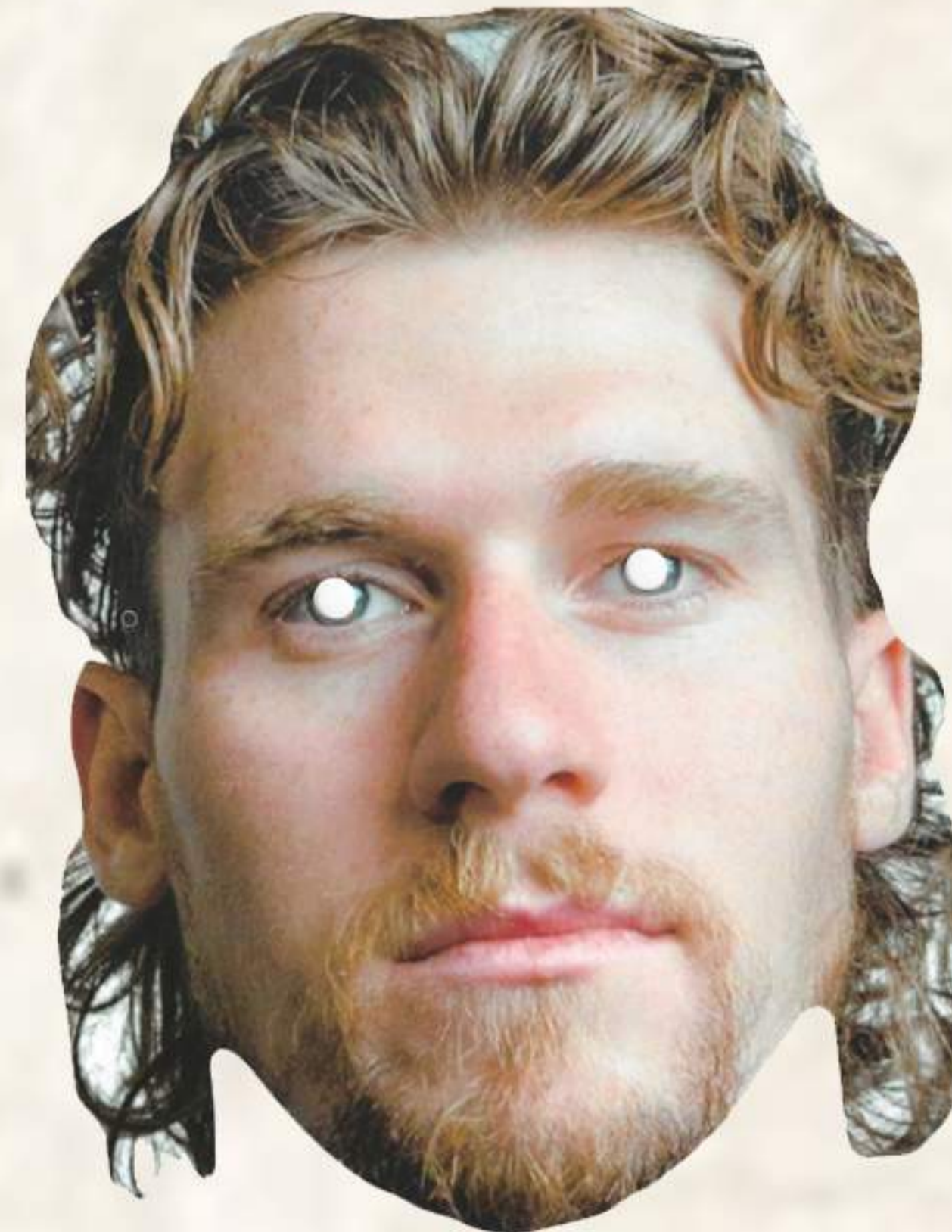

A BARON TIME

POORLY AT THE STAG PARTY

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

A century ago it was time to see the Easter Bunny hoping about, and for those who could afford it, Woolworths, at the bottom of the High Street, was selling penny chocolate eggs.

For the average family, the depression of the early part of the decade was still having a serious effect on families, and quite often the only treat might be at the Old Show Ground to watch a match. However, the directors knew money was tight, and they frequently sent out appeals for more support. Remember that only this time last year, the West Stand was destroyed by fire, and the Club came close to extinction.

Scunthorpe United only had three remaining fixtures yet to be fulfilled, and the directors had one eye on the future, and were preparing to sweep a new broom through the squad, releasing the majority, as was the tradition, then, but retaining the bright stars for future contracts. In those days the Club only had about twelve or thirteen first team players under contract, usually from late August until the first week in May. The rest of the selections had to be made up from reserve men, when injuries occurred, and these played in the Nuts North Lindsey League. This season looked as though they would be runners-up in that division.

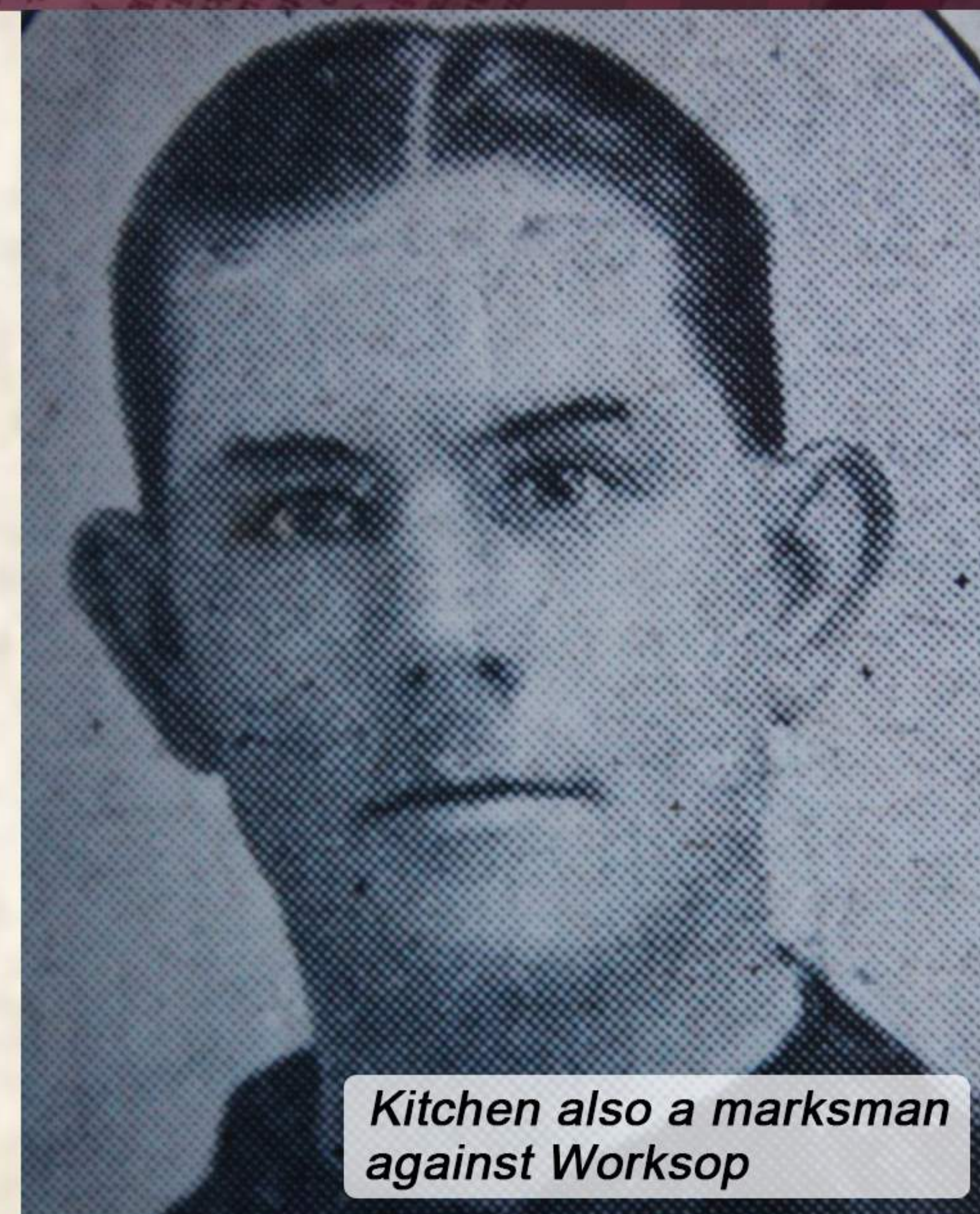
In 1922-23 season, the table revealed that Scunthorpe United were sixth in the League, still a worth effort. This campaign they were hovering in a similar position. Early aspirations had been for a better final resting place, but injuries, and a tougher quality of opposition saw results drop off into a string of defeats. After beating Boston at home on the last Saturday in March, the Nuts had failed to register another win in the

next five outings, and only had a point to show from a 1-1 draw at Castleford. On Easter Saturday, the champions of this season's competition, Mansfield Town, visited the Old Show Ground, and returned to Nottinghamshire as 2-0 victors. Two days later, potential Runners-up, Grimsby Town, beat the gallant Nuts 1-0 at Blundell Park. It may have been a baron time, but in those games the Nuts had played up well.

On Easter Tuesday, April 22nd 1923-24, Scunthorpe United had the daunting task of meeting the Stags at their own Mill Field ground. After the lengthy journey the Nuts fielded a team requiring a number of changes. Local journals did not reveal the extent of those alterations, but Franklin had to be replaced by Heselgrove at right back from reserve selection. Other casualties are unknown. The brief report of the game is supported by the 6-0 defeat. Basically the Nuts were very poorly after their Stag party. For the first Easter on record, the Nuts had no Easter

points or goals from three games.

Four days later, the not so Natty Nuts assembled at the Old Show Ground for another tough duty, against Worksop Town, who needed the two points on offer to snatch the Runners-up position from the Junior Mariners of Grimsby Town Reserves. Scunthorpe United were able to select probably the strongest squad available, and ran out of the tunnel as follows: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Franklin, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Broskom, Burkinshaw, Raby, Kitchen and Foster, forwards. These players now had a point to prove!

Those who decided to visit the Show Ground were either ardent supporters or mad, because the weather at Scunthorpe was wretched, with rain coming down in stair rods. Despite the heavy going, the Nuts got their acts together in fine style. It was as though a switch had turned them on, and they shed the shackles of the past month. The defender defended, the midfield moved and the forwards foraged in front

The weather was wretched for the visit of Worksop to Scunthorpe this afternoon. The visitors and Grimsby Town Reserves are running close for the position of runners-up, and if the United could stem their tide of success they would do the Town Reserves a good turn. The only change from the selected Worksop eleven was at centre forward. Lievesley was unable to play and Hibbert appeared in his place in that position. Lievesley it might be mentioned is the highest goal scorer in the Midland League, having 35 goals to his credit this season. Teams:—

brilliant low shot which the goalkeeper held. When Burkinshaw gave Raby an opening it was clear the latter was standing yards offside and he was pulled up.

Laws proved resourceful when he outwitted Skull and lobbed the ball into the goalmouth although Bradbury was able to clear. Following this the Worksop goal had a remarkable escape. Richardson had worked his way into the forward line and he was almost in the vicinity of the United goal when Kitchen drew Simmonke, and sent Foster away with a clear field. The latter middled the ball and it struck the crossbar. Foreman struck at the same time and

home a beauty.

Scunthorpe United continued in an attacking mood in the second period, even though Reynolds was called upon just after the break to keep the Town from reducing the lead. The home forwards was rewarded when

Broskom centred to Raby, who headed the third goal, whilst the visitors were appealing for offside against Burkinshaw.

At three goals in front, Scunthorpe United were at last showing the type of form that had brought some rosy early season success. They were not quite done with the scoring and it was Burkinshaw that was the player to make it a brace. He was able to cotton onto a loose ball,

close to the Worksop Town box, and hit the leather square with the instep of his boot. It was a 'goal' as soon as he swung his boot. For those hearty Scunthorpe souls in attendance, this made the rain running down the back of their clothes worth the discomfort. After all, there was a dry towel and a coal fire waiting for them at home.

This was a brilliant display, just for once, from the eleven Nuts who had restored the faith. The mud stained and drenched team shook hands with the opposition at the end of the 4-0 result, as steam rose from their bodies. The crowd were generous in applause. Credit the team and its performance, but Worksop were probably hard done by with a four goal deficit, in view of the tremendous effort they put in. However, today it was the day for the Nuts. Supporters just hoped the weather would improve for next Saturday, when Doncaster Rovers Res would complete the season at Scunthorpe.

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Although it was 1933 before the name Boston United first appeared, football had been played in the town since the late 1800s and, indeed, always on the same site as the York Street stadium.

The first time that a team from Boston entered the FA Cup was in 1887. In the first round they were drawn against Gainsborough Trinity and were soundly thrashed 7-0. Those early years saw some spectacular defeats in the FA Cup, including a 9-0 defeat at Lincoln City in 1890 and in the following season Grimsby Town went one better to notch up a 10-0 win.

By the start of the First World War there were two clubs in Boston, Boston Town, whose headquarters were "The Coach and Horses" and Boston Swifts, who used "The Indian Queen" as their HQ. In fact, as both the public houses were situated on "Main Ridge" and the pitch was virtually just opposite, it wasn't surprising that for the first 40 years or so that was what the ground was called. A small stand was erected in the early 1900s but other than that there were no other facilities, and the teams changed

at the back of the appropriate pub! Both teams were members of the Lincoln and District League.

After the First World War only one club, called simply Boston, emerged. After winning the Lincoln and District League in successive seasons, in 1921 the club joined the Midland League as a semi-professional side. In 1925 it went on to achieve the first Boston giant-killing in the FA Cup by beating the then-powerful Football League club Bradford Park Avenue 1-0 in the second round. The club was also achieving respectable positions in the Midland League, being runners up in 1924-25, behind Mansfield Town and again in 1926-27 behind Scunthorpe United.

The club would find major success elusive until 1954 when they appointed former Derby County goalkeeper Ray Middleton as their new player-manager. Middleton put together a squad that would challenge for honours over the next few seasons.

Season 1965-66 saw the start of the climb back to senior non-league football with a United Counties League and cup "double."

Only twice were they not involved in the championship race, winning it a record four times. Boston were the first club ever to win a NPL "treble" of league, cup and shield. United also created a record of conceding only three goals at home in league games in a whole season, 51 consecutive home and away league games without a defeat, and 64 home league games (over three years) without a defeat.

For the 2001-2002 season, the club made the decision to go fully professional. This paid dividends when they went on to clinch the Conference title and promotion to the Football League.

Their fairytale farewell to York Street did not materialise in 2019-20 as Altrincham secured a 1-0 win in Lincolnshire as the curtain fell on the Pilgrims' famous old stadium before moving to their current home.

Culverhouse began his career with Tottenham Hotspur. He found first team opportunities limited there and made just two league appearances for the club, though he did get a winner's medal in the UEFA Cup as he was an unused substitute for Spurs in the 1984 final against Anderlecht.

In management, he began as an assistant at Colchester, Norwich and Aston Villa before managing King's Lynn, Grantham and Kettering before Boston.

GOALKEEPER

1. Cameron Gregory

Gregory linked up with the Pilgrims in January 2023 - but had to wait nearly a month to make his debut after arriving with a three-match suspension to serve, amid a flurry of weather-related postponements. The former Shrewsbury Town youngster was a key reason United climbing away from danger at the foot of the National League North table - signing a new deal in the summer of 2023.

DEFENDERS

2. Jai Rowe

A familiar face to Iron supporters having left the club last season by mutual consent. Rowe ended up at Aldershot Town for the final stages of last season before penning a deal with the Pilgrims.

3. Ethan Sephton

The left-back joined Boston United from Alvechurch for an undisclosed fee in January 2023. He had sprung to prominence during the Church's run to the second round of the Emirates FA Cup. He signed a contract until the end of the 2023-2024 campaign.

ONE TO WATCH...

9. Kelsey Mooney

Age: 24

Nationality: English

Position: Forward

Former Aston Villa youngster Mooney, son of Watford legend Tommy, joined the Pilgrims in May 2023 as the club's first summer signing.

Mooney was an established National League North striker with Leamington when he sustained a serious ACL injury - returning for the latter part of the 2022-2023 campaign as the Brakes failed to stave off relegation. Throughout his career Mooney has appeared for various clubs at the sixth tier of English Football, however the forward is a familiar face at Glanford Park as he enjoyed a stint with the Iron after arriving from Hereford ahead of the 2020-21 season.

Following his departure, a year later Mooney went on to find his form in front of goal including this current campaign as he's amassed five goals in 20 league appearances under the guidship of Ian Culverhouse.

5. Michael Bostwick

Having made his name locally with the likes of Peterborough United and Lincoln City, enjoying legendary status at both clubs, Bostwick won promotion from League Two with Stevenage in 2022-2023. He also helped Boro beat Premier League side Aston Villa in the Emirates FA Cup in January 2023.

6. Tom Leak

Joining in June 2023 from promotion final winners Kidderminster Harriers. Having begun his career with Walsall, the centre-half moved on to Aggborough, from where he also spent a brief spell on loan at Alfreton Town.

23. Zak Mills

Mills made a sensational homecoming in August 2022 - six years after leaving the Pilgrims to embark on a career in the EFL. He spent two seasons with Grimsby Town, before single campaigns with Morecambe, Port Vale, Oldham Athletic and Walsall. He was twice part of the United squad beaten in the play-offs during his first spell with the club.

4. Brad Nicholson

He re-joined Boston United in the summer - having recovered from a serious ACL injury. Having arrived from Guiseley in March 2022, impressing on his debut against his previous club, Nicholson missed out on involvement in the play-offs after sustaining a serious injury against Gloucester City.

MIDFIELDERS

10. Keziah Martin

Another to join from Kidderminster Harriers in the summer. Despite not featuring regularly in the Harriers' run to promotion, he had been a mainstay of their side the previous season which included a brilliant Emirates FA Cup run, including fixtures against Reading and West Ham United.

19. Jordan Richards

Originally joining on loan from Notts County in September 2015. The son of former United defender Pedro, Richards linked up with the Pilgrims alongside team-mate Larley Sarpong. Richards made his debut against Chorley at right-back before moving into a more natural role in front of United's back four. He was subsequently loaned to Sligo Rovers in Ireland - before successful permanent spells with King's Lynn Town (under Ian Culverhouse) and Brackley Town. He re-united with Culverhouse at United in June 2023.

8. Martin Woods

Vastly-experienced, joining in the summer. The former Leeds United youngster enjoyed a long and distinguished career within the pro ranks - including spells north and south of the border. His most prolific spell in terms of appearances arrived between 2007 and 2013 with Doncaster Rovers.

7. Keaton Ward

Signing from Kettering Town for an undisclosed fee, he started his career at Mansfield Town, before a brief spell with Barnsley and a loan

stint at AFC Telford United.

FORWARDS

12. Michael Gyasi

Exciting striker Gyasi linked up with Boston United in July 2023 - having previously played under Ian Culverhouse's management at King's Lynn Town. The Hamburg-born striker arrived from Chesterfield, where he had agreed a mutual termination of his contract, having also previously played for Dover Athletic.

11. Jimmy Knowles

Striker Knowles joined Boston United following his departure from Mansfield Town. The young forward enjoyed loan spells with Notts County and Kettering Town during his time at Field Mill - and made a new start with the Pilgrims in July 2023.

OTHERS

Other players in their squad also include recently departed goalkeeper from the Iron, Aaron Chapman, as well as players Tom Edge and Deji Sotona.

PLAY-OFF FINAL

Saturday, May 4th

The final game of the Vanarama National League North campaign is the play-off final, which will see two of the four remaining teams take on each other for the place in the National League next season (3.30pm kick-off).

Scunthorpe play Boston this afternoon off the back of finishing second in the league, with the Pilgrims seeing off Alfreton Town away from home in midweek, with the encounter going the distance.
