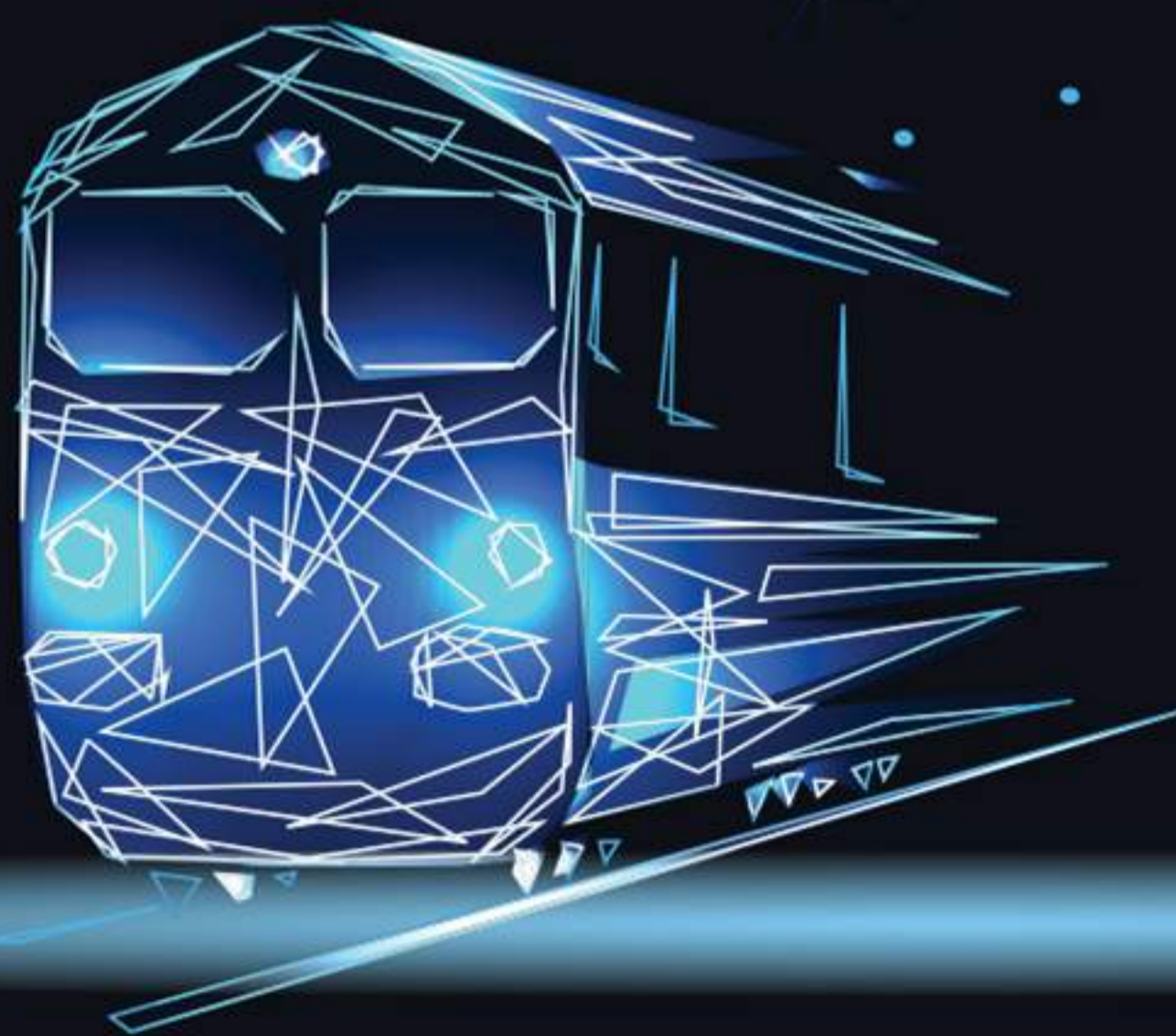

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good afternoon once more, as we welcome Warrington Town to Glanford Park today, in what is our third home game in a week, as we look to extend our winning home run to seven games in all competitions.

It was a big three points for us on Tuesday following a really hard-fought win and performance on the night. It was fantastic to keep our form going here at Glanford Park, and it was superb that we got another result under the lights.

We controlled the tempo and the ball throughout the game, but we didn't take enough risk with the ball in the first half. In the second half, we were more expansive and showed a bit more energy. The crowd certainly their part in the win as well, we certainly wouldn't have done it without them.

It was a deserved three points, and we certainly enjoyed it having ground the result out. That's six wins on the spin at home, six wins from eight overall with a draw and a defeat, and five clean sheets in our last eight games. There's a lot to be positive about. We're getting to the business part of the season, and I feel we're well positioned to kick on from here.

We know we're hard to beat at home, and that teams will struggle to come here. Warrington will test that this afternoon. They have a decent away record of late, winning two and drawing two of their last four games. They get the ball down and play, and they've made a really good impression since being promoted into this league. It'll be another tough Saturday afternoon for us.

Their defence is full of experience, with Andre Wisdom and Peter Clarke, formerly of Liverpool and Oldham respectively, in their ranks. I came up against Clarke when I was at Sports. He has missed the last two games through injury, but we are mindful of what he brings.

The focus has to be on us again to try and expose their weaknesses. Our boys have given us a reaction each time we've had a bad result this season. They continue to do it, and they have strong mindsets. We have to make sure that the bad ones become less and less frequent. In the main, the form has been steady. It's had a positive spike in the last month. The games have been relentless, but we've coped with it well. We need to use it and kick on.

After this game, we have a couple of weeks where we can recover and do some work on the training ground. We need it.

The injuries, other than Alfie Beestin, are all in one area - full-backs. To have three out, we now have to work hard to ensure it doesn't hurt us too much. With Ross Barrows, it's not going to be days, there's a lot of bruising around his ankle.

Let's not get bored of winning. Let's not take it as normal. This football club has not been used to winning in recent years, and you gave us a lift on Tuesday night. You're so significant to how we want to do things here at home, and getting us through. With everything considered, with what the club has been through, stay behind us and keep enjoying this moment, and keep enjoying us putting these wins together.

FOCUS ON... JASON LAW

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to Jason Law, with the former Mansfield winger giving his verdict so far...



Enjoying a run in the side of late is midfielder Jason Law. Having commenced the campaign in the side, the former Mansfield Town player sustained an injury which kept him out for 10 weeks, before forcing his way back into the reckoning on his return.

Knowing a number of players, such as the returning Callum Roberts, and youth team product Cameron Wilson, are hot on his heels, he knows he has to keep up his performances to keep his shirt week-in, week-out.

"We've always had a lot of competition in the squad, and now we've got some really good players like Cal coming back.

"There's always a pressure to perform, because you know if you don't perform, you're going to lose your place. We have a

strong squad, so that's inevitable. I embrace the pressure, go out and enjoy it, and try to put on the best performance I can."

The 24-year-old summer recruit reflected on Tuesday's slender 1-0 win over Southport as a crucial one, and stated that it could be a result the Iron look back at the end of the season as a pivotal one that aided achievement of the club's goals.

"It was a difficult win, and they made it tough for us. They camped out and made it difficult for us to break down.

"We've always had a lot of competition in the squad...there's always pressure to perform...if you don't, you're going to lose your place..."

"At times they had 10 and 11 men behind the ball. It's up to us to find ways to do that better in the future.

It was definitely a win that - especially because we've won by five or six goals here this season - it makes you appreciate it a little bit more to get three points. They're the ones you need.

"The difficult games where you sometimes will struggle to score. The 1-0s, we will hopefully look back on at the end of the season and see them as big moments."

While alluding to the Iron's hot streak at home, with six wins from the last six, and five clean sheets in amongst those games as well, Law also alluded to the way opposition teams set-up when they journey to Glanford Park, and also when Scunthorpe are away from home, with games often becoming increasingly frustrating when United don't achieve an early goal.

"We've kept five clean sheets in the last six, so we're definitely difficult to break down.

"We dominate games as well, and it's good that we're doing that, and teams aren't scoring against us. It's hard when teams put themselves behind the ball. We need to find different ways to break teams down in and around the box, to get them moments. They will come in games, and we've got the players to do that."

The tight spaces often means patient build-up for the Iron, which can become frustrating both for the players on the pitch, the management on the sidelines and the supporters in the stand, but United tend to find a way at home, whether it's long range supremacy from Jacob Butterfield, or taking the chance when the ball drops inside the area. Finding a way is the motive, and it happens more often than not on home soil.

"It can be difficult. They're blocking the insides, and it's been tight and condensed. I feel like I am the type of player that, if it was to suit any player, it would suit a player like me.

"Getting on the ball is important for me, and when teams do camp up, it does allow me to get on the ball. We just have to find ways to break teams down."

Scunthorpe now have 20 different goalscorers that have found the net this season, with Max Kouogun the latest addition to that list in midweek. It was ironic, having not found a way through, that both central defenders found themselves in the box, with Andrew Boyce teeing up the winner.

"It's great that everyone is chipping



in. For example, Tuesday night, Maxi scored and it was such an important goal. They're coming from all over the pitch, and there's no reliance on anyone in particular. In games I feel like, as a team, we're going to get a goal. We don't know exactly where it's going to come from, but there's a confidence we are going to score. We're also keeping clean sheets, so it puts us in good stead to win games.

"We need to find different ways to break teams down in and around the box, to get them moments. Those chances will come in games, and we've got the players in the squad that can take those chances... it's great that everyone is chipping in..."

Law next touched on his injury which saw him miss a sizeable chunk of the start of the season, and the battle to get back.

“I was unfortunate to get the injury. I thought I’d had a good pre-season up until that point. I started the first game of the season at Tamworth, and then the injury killed me a little bit. All that fitness that I built up in

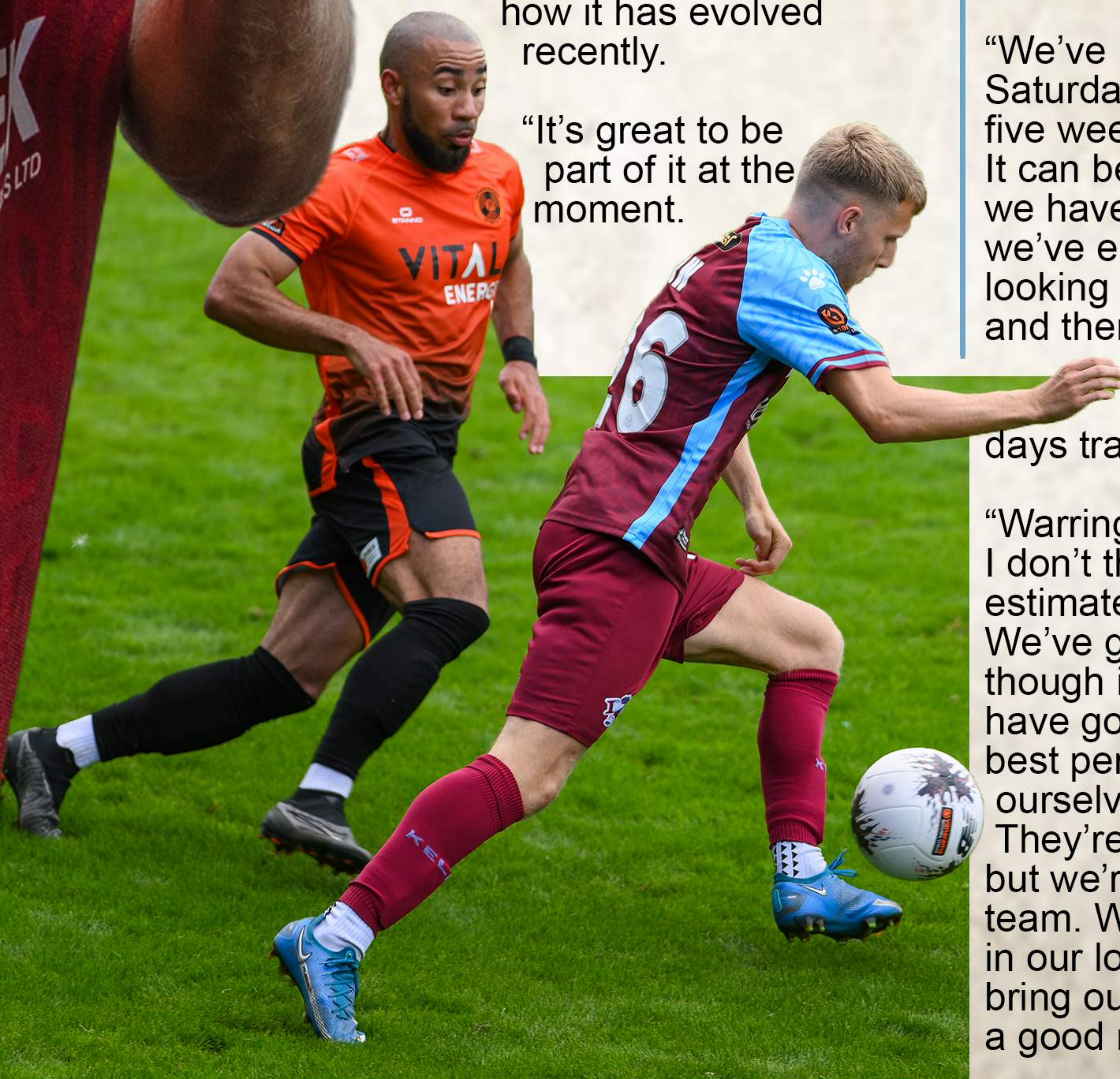
pre-season, I lost it all. I think I was off for 10 weeks in total, so it’s been great to come back in, get back training with a point to prove. Thankfully, the gaffer has had some trust in me over the last few games, and I feel like I’ve not done too bad. I still feel like I’ve got more to give, but a run of games is doing me well, and I’m really happy with how it’s going at the minute.

“I feel like I’m getting there. I got a goal and an assist on my first game back. For me, I hopefully want more goal contributions. That’s something I’m really trying to work on, and I feel like it’s only a matter of time before it comes, but I’ve got to keep going in training and games, and hopefully improve.

“We are in tremendous form at home at the moment, but we know we have to bring our A game each time to make sure we win the game. It’s been great here - especially after my injury at the start of the season. To come back, to get in the team, and to be in a good run of form like we are, especially with the support we get at home, I’m loving it at the minute.”

Law also reflected on the mood and situation at the club, and how it has evolved recently.

“It’s great to be part of it at the moment.



“I’ve heard it from a few of the boys who were here before this season, and how hard it has been. To be up there, in a good run of form, the atmosphere around the place makes it a great place to be. Hopefully, that brings success going forward. We want to keep that going, but we won’t get too far ahead of ourselves.

“Some of the situations have been difficult, with the previous owner, but in a way it kind of brought us together even more as a team, going through those adversities together and really coming together. Going through those difficult moments together, and being where we are in the league despite that, I think is successful so far. Now we’re sorted, we just have to continue. We all stuck together. It could have been easy for financial pressures, for someone that has to look after their family, to go down that route. We all believed in the vision, and the manager at the club, and it’s paid off.”

For the first time in a number of weeks, the Iron can take to the training ground next week without a midweek fixture, something that will be beneficial heading into the festive period.

“We’ve had a lot of Saturday-Tuesdays over four or five weeks, and we’ve done well. It can be tough physically, but we have got a strong squad, that we’ve embraced it. We’re looking forward to this game, and then we’ve got a break to next weekend, so it will be good to get some days training in during the week.

“Warrington have done well, and I don’t think we can underestimate any team in this league. We’ve got to treat each game as though it’s really important. We have got to be on it to bring the best performances out of ourselves. No game is a given. They’re in a good patch of form, but we’re not scared of any team. We know what we’ve got in our locker, and know if we bring our A-game, we’ll be in for a good night.

FOREST FIRES AND A CASTLE WALL

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

A century ago, it was a cold wet December at Scunthorpe, and wrapping up warm was the order of the day for all and sundry, and dark nights came early to add to the gloom.

Down the road at the steelworks, the evenings were illuminated by the tipping of slag ladles, emphasising the motto of Scunthorpe, that the skies reflect our labours. Those darker days, of course, meant earlier starts for football matches, because the technology of floodlights was still up to three decades away. It was a headache, to allow the six to two shift time to reach the Old Show Ground on a pull bike from the works, but still manage to catch sufficient light before the curtain came down on the winter sun at about quarter to four.

A century ago, the FA Cup run had been exceptional, and the team had taken the Club on its furthest journey in its history, reaching the Fifth Qualifying Round. They had the good fortune of having home ties in every case, and beaten three Midland League clubs en route, which included Gainsborough Trinity, Boston and Rotherham Town. They almost beat Rotherham County, a Third Division North team of note, and a Scunthorpe played much of the second half of the first match, when Oscar Hargreaves was sent off under controversial circumstances. It was a valiant effort, and deserved being mentioned in despatches.

The beauty of the FA Cup run was that it had enabled a small amount of money to be push towards team strengthening, and the directors decided to make two modest purchases. The first was Harold Slater, a right winger from Hull City, and the second, Leonard Haythorne, an inside forward, late

of Castleford. In each case they were pressed into action, but neither would be long stayers in the first eleven.

Now the Club was out of the FA Cup, it was high time to concentrate on a push up the Midland League table. On December 8th 1923 Nottingham Forest were the men traveling up to the Old Show Ground. The Forest Reserves had men of quality, some of whom had first team experience, but the team results only had them in a mid-table position, exactly where the Nuts were. Those in attendance thought a close and entertaining match was in prospect, and the Club was represented by the following claret and blues: Reynold, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Hargreaves, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Slater, Haythorne, Burkinshaw, Kitchen and Foster, forwards.

Scunthorpe United and Forest Reserves were to provide the modest crowd with match full of cut and thrust. When everything was analysed, it was Scunthorpe that had the cut, and the Nottingham lads that had the thrust. The difference being that Scunthorpe cut to the quick, and took two chances before half-time, and the two points were eventually bagged. The Forest second eleven had plenty of thrust in the way of attempts on goal, but they wasted them by shooting high and wide.

The first goal came early in the match, when Foster crossed a difficult ball into the Forest goal area, which a defender headed against the bar, in an effort to clear. Up in attendance, Joe Kitchen was on hand to nod gently back into the net, and it was not long before he was at it again, netting a second, with a crisp shot, as the Forest keeper came out unsuccessfully to intercept. In so doing, the collision required Kitchen to need some attention.

When he match was examined, critics suggested that the left wing pair had performed better than the new right sides flank. It gave the selection committee

food for thought, but the same team assembled a week later, at the Show Ground, for the visit of Castleford Town.

Castleford Town were men of a lowly stature in the Midland League table, and the match attracted the smallest attendance of the season. Those who did brave the cold conditions saw a match of little interest, save for twenty whirlwind second half minutes during which all four goals were netted. This excitement only came after injury forced the loss of the Castleford goalkeeper. Ashmore started the scoring, when he converted the ball into the target, after a shot by Kitchen was only blocked by the depleted Castleford defence. Scunthorpe United were awarded two penalties, after fouls on Burkinshaw

and Kitchen, and it was the latter that casually crashed each attempt into the bulging net. Tookey managed a consolation for the visitors, and the 3-1 result put two more points on the Scunthorpe United board.

Christmas was fast approaching, and after a moderate start to the season, Scunthorpe United had produced a good run of form seeing them rise to the top half. The talk was of a Nuts eleven with a tough defence, a mobile and inventive midfield, and able to create when on top, or assist the defence when the pressure was on. The great problem was still in the attack, save for the dominating presence of former FA Cup winning medallist, Joe Kitchen. He was the drive of all things at the sharp end of the forward line. What would the team be without good old Joe? Supporters dreaded to think. All they needed to do was think about the next Midland League fixture on December 22nd, 1923, at Wombwell.

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Formed in 1949 under the eye of their late president, Jimmy Drinkwater the club began life as Stockton Heath playing at a ground called London Road in Appleton.

They competed in the Warrington and District league until 1953, when a move to the Mid Cheshire League coincided with the appointment of Freddie Worrall as manager. During his thirteen years at the helm, Heath were one of the most feared sides in Cheshire football, winning a string of honours including the Mid Cheshire League Championship in 1960, the League Cup three times, and making more appearances (five) in the Cheshire Amateur Cup Final than any other club.

Several players from this successful period went on to join Football League clubs, including Ian Weir (Scotland and Hibernian), John Green (Tranmere Rovers), and Alan Foster (Crewe). The most famous son must, however, be Roger Hunt who went on to score many memorable goals for Liverpool and gained the ultimate honour of winning a World Cup Winners Medal with England in

1966.

At the 1961 AGM, it was decided to change the clubs name to Warrington Town, and in 1965, the club moved to their present home in Latchford. A neat, compact stadium with a capacity of around 3,500 the ground is on the banks of the Manchester Ship canal in the shadow of the imposing Cantilever Bridge which dominates the areas skyline, and from which the ground now takes its name.

The late sixties and early seventies were mostly spent in the doldrums, and the club continued without success until the formation of the North West Counties League in 1982 proved to be a springboard to start to move up the pyramid.

Promotion to the Northern Premier League was gained in 1989-90 as champions. The club had consistency in the new division with three seventh place and a fifth place finish, but relatively little success until 1992-93 when a fantastic FA Trophy run ended in the quarter finals at Sutton United, earning them a cool £5,000 for being the furthest non-exempt team left in the competition.

2015-16 would see the side promoted to the NPL Premier Division as Champions, with the new league bringing mixed fortunes and inconsistency.

With a couple of opportunities to flirt with promotion in the seasons to follow, they achieved that feat last season. From 26th November through to the end of the season, losing just once in 26 games and going unbeaten for 24 of those.

Town once again faced the play-off's but this time would be guaranteed home advantage in both semi and final. Matlock Town were played off the park in the semi final first half, a rampant Town scoring four without reply. It ended 4-1. Bamber Bridge would be the opposition in the final, with Warrington defying a numerical disadvantage to claim a late, late goal to seal promotion to the National League North in front of over 2,500 following their slender advantage on the day.

The former Liverpool man then left to join Welsh side TNS before quickly moving on to Hyde United, where he featured twice against Town last season.

2. Dec Walker

Walker signed for the club from local rivals Rylands in September 2022, having achieved promotion to the Northern Premier League with the Blues during the previous campaign. Achieved promotion with the Yellows last season, capping the achievement at his hometown club.

19. Isaac Buckley-Ricketts

Age: 25

Nationality: English

Position: Forward

Isaac joined Warrington Town, initially on loan from Southport, in February 2022.

He was 23-years-old when he joined Town and started his career at Manchester City. He has been capped by England at Under-18, Under-19 and Under-20 level.

The forward also spent time in the Dutch Eredivisie, where he scored twice in 12 appearances for FC Twente. The initial loan deal was until April 3, and made his debut in a 3-1 victory over Morpeth Town, notching a second half assist for Josh Amis. d

That loan deal was extended to the end of the season, and he signed for the club for the start of the following season. Isaac scored the goal that saw the side win the NPL Premier Division Play-off Final to gain promotion to the National League North against Bamber Bridge.

4. Tom Hannigan

Tom was a summer signing from Altrincham. He has also played for Vauxhall Motors and AFC Fylde.

3. Andrew White

Andrew was one of a number of summer 2022 signings from National League side Altrincham. He has had a distinguished career in football in both the EFL and National League. Derby-born, he started out at Hucknall as a youth player before signing for Mansfield Town. He also had two spells at Crewe Alexandra either side of joining Boston United, Kidderminster Harriers and Burton Albion. He later played for Notts County and Southport.

21. Andre Wisdom

He signed for the club in September 2023 having spent time away from the game. With 20 appearances for Liverpool after coming through their youth system, he also went on to play in the Premier League for West Bromwich Albion and Norwich City. The Leeds born defender also played in the German Bundesliga for Red Bull Salzburg and for a time with Birmingham City. His last club was Derby County but left after their financial problems surfaced.

MIDFIELDERS

20. Mitch Duggan

Duggan signed in November 2016 with a first appearance in the home win over Rushall Olympic. Mitch started out as a youth team player with Tranmere Rovers before progressing to the first team. He was previously with Marine before coming to Warrington but left again for a spell to return in summer 2018 and is to date their longest serving player.

17. Bohan Dixon

Bohan joined Town in late August 2018 and scored on his debut in the 5-0 win away to North Ferriby United. Joining from Ashton United he has had a wealth of experience,

predominantly in non-league football. Starting out at Accrington Stanley, he soon moved on to Lincoln City before spells at AFC Fylde, FC Halifax Town and Stockport County.

6. Jay Harris

Jay has a wealth of experience in the EFL and National League having previously played for Wrexham. He started out as an Everton trainee before moving on to play for Accrington Stanley. He spent a couple of seasons with Chester before moving down the road to fierce rival Wrexham where he spent five seasons. He then moved a few miles north to Tranmere Rovers. He had a spell at Macclesfield Town and then returned to Wrexham.

8. Sean Williams

Sean originally signed in for Town in November 2016 making his debut at home to Rushall Olympic. Sean's former clubs include Stockport County, Halifax Town, Altrincham, Hinckley United and Hednesford Town. He initially joined Warrington Town from AFC Telford United. He later moved to Altrincham before returning to Town in 2021.

FORWARDS

7. Connor Woods

Connor signed for the club in autumn 2022 on loan from Southport where he has progressed from the youth set up. He was recalled by Southport after a couple of months but signed for the club on a permanent basis in March.

14. Jordan Buckley

Jordan joined Town from FC United of Manchester in 2020-21. He has been a regular goalscorer at both clubs and is a natural finisher.

He was the club's top scorer last season with 19 goals despite injury lay-offs.

27. Aaron Bennett

Aaron joined town just prior to the start of the 2023-24 season having previously been with Preston North End.

Aaron has also spent time at Altrincham. He is a Wales youth international.

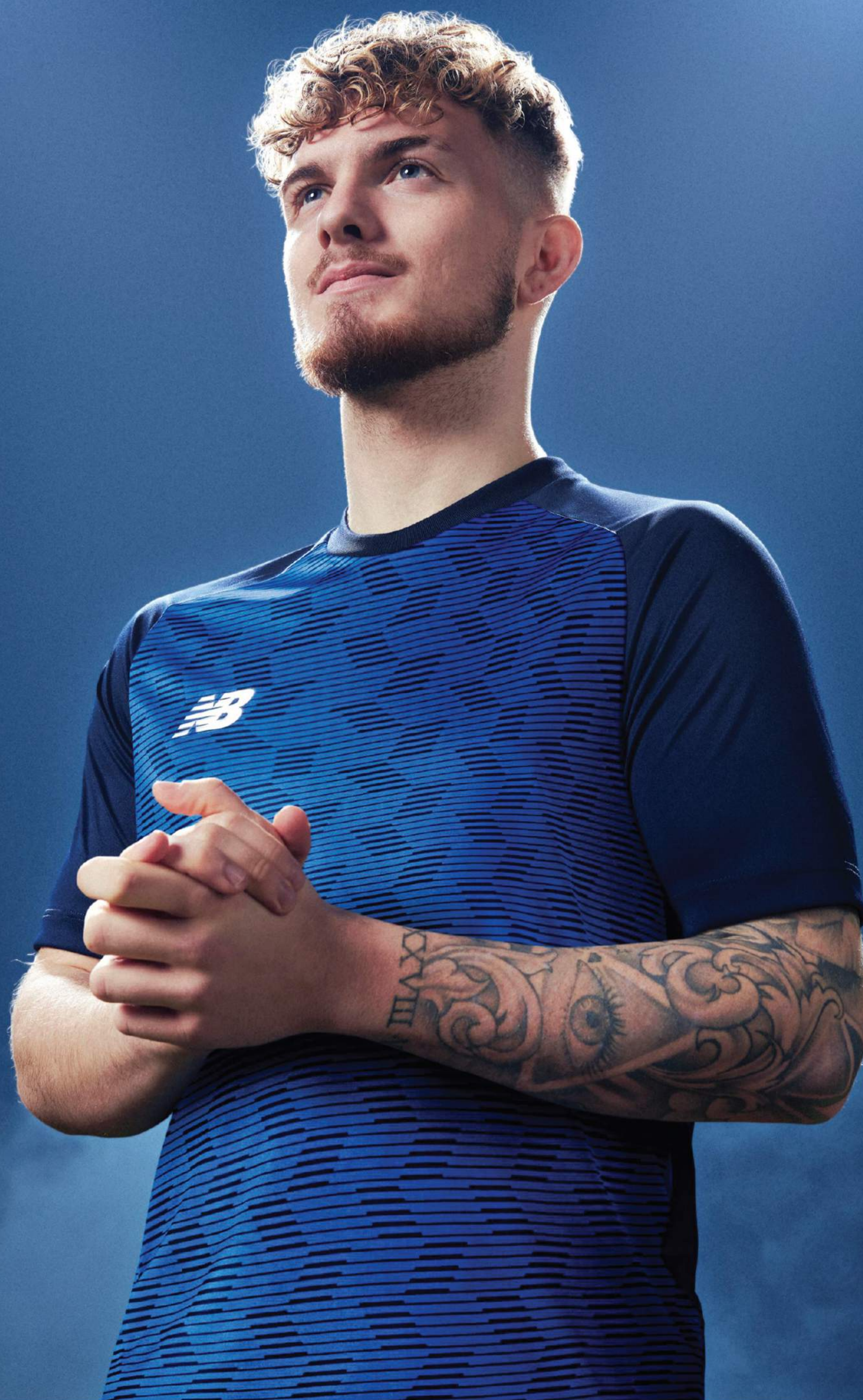

The fixture against Bulls will be the first between the sides in Hereford's new form, and will be Scunthorpe's first trip to Edgar Street since September 2008.

THE STADIUM

They don't make them like Edgar Street anymore!

From the large chunky floodlights to the semi-circular terraces, the ground is certainly 'old school.' But it is a proper old-fashioned football ground that is both unique and memorable.

Since the Club's formation as a fan-owned club in 2015 (following the demise of Hereford United), a lot of effort has been put into bringing the facilities up to scratch and to brighten up the look of the ground.

Segregation is normally in force for most games at Edgar Street. Away fans are housed on one

side of the Len Weston Stand at one side of the pitch. This stand has an upper tier of seating that overhangs a lower tier of terracing.

The views from this areas are a bit mixed as there is an annoying (but necessary) guardrail running along the front of the seated section, that could impede your view from the lower row of seats. Also, it is quite hard at times to see the near touchline. Entrance to the away section is to be found at the corner of Edgar Street and Blackfriars Street.

BY CAR

174 miles from Glanford Park, it will take approximately three hours and 20 minutes to journey from the Iron's stadium.

> Follow M180, M18 and M1 to A42 in Leicestershire. Take the A42 exit from M1

> Continue on the A42 and follow M42 and M5 to Whittington Rd in Worcestershire. Take exit 7 from M5

> Follow A4440 and A4103 to Edgar St/A49 in Hereford

> Turn left (A49), with the ground on the left.

CAR PARKING

There is a large pay and display car park at the ground, which on Saturday afternoons costs £1 per hour or £5 for over four hours. Across from the entrance to the away section is the Old Market Multistorey car park which charges £4 for three hours, or £6 for four hours.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Hereford Railway Station is located around three-quarters of a mile away from Edgar Street or a 15 minute walk. It is served by trains from Manchester Piccadilly, Birmingham New Street and Cardiff Central. There is likely to be a train strike on the day of this fixture.

FACILITIES

There is a club bar at the ground itself called Radfords. This is open before and after the game and normally welcomes away fans, except for certain high profile fixtures. This small bar enjoys views across the ground and serves real ale from the Wye Valley Brewery.

SOLIHULL MOORS - FA TROPHY ROUND THREE

FRIDAY, DECEMBER 8TH, 2023 - 7.45PM KICK-OFF

The Iron welcome Vanarama National League Premier Division side Solihull Moors to Glanford Park for the third round of the Isuzu FA Trophy.

The game takes place on a Friday night under the lights, with an anticipated boosted crowd for a cup encounter expected at the stadium.

It will be the fourth meeting between the two sides following one meeting in the Emirates FA Cup and the two league meetings last season. None of them are memorable in a positive light from a Scunthorpe United point of view.

The first encounter was during COVID-19 and was played behind closed doors in November 2020. John McAtee and Kevin van Veen scored for the Iron, but Stephen Gleeson got two for the visitors, with the winner netted by former defender Krystian Pearce. Tyler Cordner was sent off for two cautions.

Meanwhile, the league meeting in North Lincolnshire saw United surrender a 3-0 lead to lose 4-3 with Joe Nuttall (two) and Colin Daniel scoring for Scuthorpe. The reverse fixture finished 3-1 to Solihull, with Will Smith scoring the Iron's goal.

Solihull currently sit in fourth of the National League having taken 37 points from their 21 games so far. This will be their first involvement in the competition so far this season with teams from that level entering at the third round stage.
