Unfortunately, that was unsuccessful, so we will miss Danny for the next three games, which will be a massive loss to us. Him now being available now represents a big opportunity for someone else to stake a claim for his shirt. We have a near-fully fit squad at the moment, so I'm sure the players

### FOCUS ON... REAGAN OGLE

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to Reagan Ogle, as he reflects on life at the club and his future aspirations...



It was heard recently on the Project Footballer podcast which featured Ogle along with Ross Barrows and Connor Smith, with the Aussie planning a return to his homeland in the future.

Iron fans need not worry though, with those plans seemingly in the distant future, as the right-back sees his future with the football club as he looks to return the side back up to the National League, having been part of the team that got relegated last season. my mind.

"It's a big one for me in terms of my direct family being the only ones to see me play. I've got a lot of cousins that see it on social media, but it's just Twitter or clips, it's never a live game. That's a big thing for me - to go back there and play in front of that side of the family. I'm sure it'll happen, whether it's in four or five years, or more. I'm in no rush.

The lifestyle is very different out there. I'm lucky enough to go back at the end of most

seasons. There will always be home."

Ogle will forever be indebted to his family, who uprooted the family to move halfway across the world to allow their son to pursue a footballing dream at just 11-years-old.

"At the time, I probably didn't realise. It was football focused. I think if you asked me to make that decision at the age I am now, I think I'd find it 100 times harder, and I still don't understand how I made that decision at the age of 11.

"The move at a young age was for football. I do love it here. I get people asking me "why would you come here?", but I do enjoy living here. It's been a great experience. It all depends on how I'm doing here in England, and by no means am I saying I want to go back in the next couple of years - maybe I'll finish my career there. It's something that's in the back of

"I owe my parents everything for the sacrifice they made for me. They might not say it's a sacrifice but at the end of the day, they uplifted the family for one of their kids, not knowing whether it was going to work out. I definitely owe them the world; my sister and my parents.

"Dad used to go back and forth. Mum found a similar job over here. For my sister, it was probably the hardest, coming out of High School with her mates. They found it good, it was an adventure for them. It was tough at the start. When my parents left here to go back, it was probably tougher."

18 months into life in claret and blue, the 24-year-old has experienced polar opposite campaigns on the pitch, and turbulence off it. He continued by explaining his viewpoint of his time at the club so far.

"A lot has gone on since I signed here a year-and-a-half ago. The club is definitely in the right direction now. Everyone can see that. It's had a massive effect on the players, and you can see that as a group, and how the results have gone. stay, and it means a lot to me to have a gaffer like that, who really wants you here. It was a difficult decision, but I feel I've definitely made the right choice in staying here, and I wouldn't change it.

"The circumstances played a part. We were wondering whether there'd be a club the following week. That's why it was something that was quite intriguing. It's in the past now, we're halfway through the season, and it was the right decision to try and help the club get back to where it deserves to be." "...it means a lot to have a gaffer like that,

"As a team, we were having conversations. We talked about certain situations and what we would do. Everything we would have done, was as a team. There were no individuals stepping out. We stuck together, and that's probably what helped us a lot. It probably helped us get the results during that time, and has helped us be top of the league now."

During the turbulence, Ogle was subject of interest from clubs, including Oldham Athletic, who were keen to acquire his services. The right-back opted to stay with the Iron, a bold decision considering the state of the club's future at the time.

"It was a tough one to think about. It would have been back to where I grew up, so I will admit that it was intriguing. The gaffer and I chatted most days. During the difficult times of the current season, the massive togetherness of the squad is what

saw the success continue on the pitch. Should the Iron achieve their ultimate goal at the end of the season, Ogle states it's one that should be deemed a massive success.

"It would be massive. People can't tell us at the end of the season that we've had an easy run and we've had everything given to us, because we haven't. At one point, we nearly didn't have a club. To come through that, and during that time to still get results.

Hopefully, if we do what we've set out to do, it would be a massive achievement.

"I felt for the lads who had their families to look after. I'm sure it was a very stressful time for those with a wife and kids. I'm fortunate enough that I've just got myself to look after. It was still stressful, because you just didn't know."

And with one eye on returning Down Under in years to come, he continued by outlining his goals that remain in the English game. he's had.

"Based on my past experiences with injuries, it's been a big knock in my performances and taken me a while to come back. But I feel like this season, when I have come back, it hasn't taken me long to get back to the levels before. I'm happy to say that the injuries aren't affecting me now. I'm not feeling any of them, especially the shoulder. I'm happy that, in the last four or five games, we've kept a clean sheet

"Short term, it's to get Scunny promoted. It's one of the big r easons I wanted to stay here. I wanted to correct what we did last year. That's a big thing for me. From there, it's to play as high as possible. If I'm doing well here, then I'll stay in England. With football, you never know what's going to happen. We've got such a great squad here. If we do get promoted, I feel like we've got a well-versed team to deal with the National League."

It was a weird one. With my back injury, I couldn't do anything, but with the shoulder, I could still jump on the bike and keep some level of cardio going, which helped me massively when I came back. Surprisingly, I was able to run quite quickly after it, which helped. A big part of my game is throw-ins and that type of thing, and I'd say I'm quite a physical player, so that was the scary side for me."

Finishing on the Pilgrims, he added: "When we played Boston at their place, they executed their game plan pretty well. We went 1-0 up and conceded a scruffy goal. It could be a different game coming here with our fans, and the reputation we have at Glanford Park. It will be down to us to make sure we play our game.







### MARCUS CARVER


After joining the Iron ahead of the 2022-23 season, striker **Carver made 20 appearances in** claret and blue last campaign and up until recently he'd been enjoying his football at fellow **National League North outfit** and initial strugglers Southport.

The experienced forward has featured massively since his arrival at Southport in early November with his previously mentioned target forward performances becoming integral in the Sandgrounders style of play.

Despite finding goals hard to come by throughout his time in Amber and Black, manager Jim Bentley is a massive supporter of the striker as he's rewarded him with four starts straight across the month of December against Chesterfield, Tamworth, Kings Lynn and Curzon Ashton respectively playing in a system where he operates with another smaller forward alongside him.

His creative spark and five goals that he's aquired to date have helped his side to pull away from the relegation zone, and pull themselves gradually up to a record 14th spot. During the month of December, DSF has been enthralling once again and his immaculate form helped him be selected for the Vanarama National League North team of the half season. Sports' fortunes have turned around throughout the Christmas period as they have won four out of their six encounters in all competitions. Sembie-Ferris has been gaining consistent game-time as he appeared and started in all six fixtures against Gloucester, South Shields, Tamworth, Bishops Stortford and Dagenham in the FA Trophy.

Under boss Jim Bentley, Carver originally found himself as the star man leading the line. His impressive form earned himself five goals in three games back in September, which aided in the Sandgrounders' rejuvenation. Since this, however, the goals have dried up for the 33-year-old frontman as he has been on an extended goal drought since early November when he slotted home against Rushall Olympic.



The workhorse midfielder Pugh has been integral in the Bulls' recent surge up the Vanarama **National League North table that** sees them well in the hunt for the play-offs.



**Creative midfielder Robertson** has accumulated over 90 minutes of action over the course of December for initial **Northern Premier League** strugglers Marske United, in a month where the Seasiders have turned been struggling financially and are in desperate need of donation to save their club.

Over the course of December, Carver has fallen out of favour within the Southport ranks as fellow Iron Ioanee striker Richie Bennett has overshadowed him with his traditional target forward displays. As the Sandgrounders went winless over the course of the month, conceding a staggering 17 goals and only scoring three, Carver only saw himself accumulate a handful of minutes including three substitute appearances against Chesterfield, Kings Lynn and Curzon Ashton in which he joined the fray in the 70th minute of each encounter. Despite this, he was selected to start in his

Pugh has claimed himself a goal and an assist so far in all competitions for Hereford, along with this he's collected two man of the match accolades for his strong-willed performances that have been on display. Across the month of December Pugh has been a valuable rotation option for Nick Caddis' Bulls as they have stridden to a five-game unbeaten streak across all competitions. These results included wins against Warrington, Bishop's Stortford, Spennymoor, Gloucester and South Park in the FA Trophy. Throughout, Pugh featured in all games across the month, other than being ineligible for Hereford's 5-1 thumping against the Iron at Edgar Street.

On the pitch however they have turned round their form with Robertson's agile style of play being bright light for his side when featuring primarily off the bench. ### **NIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES INTO THE NEW YEAR** THE BORO VISIT AND A LAST TANGO IN ROTHERHAM Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

A century ago, the winter was in full swing, and icicles on the end of steelworker's noses were a common sight, as they came out of every rook and granny, and formed long queues of cyclists, making for the steelworks, at half past five in the morning. either side, and a dour 0-0 draw at least yielded a point, which was not to be coughed at.

Winters of this decade were long, dark, and apparently colder. A century ago, events on the Scunthorpe United calendar had passed into the New Year of 1924.

There is a frequent cry in this day and age that the Premiership footballers play too many fixtures, and need a well-earned rest by the warm shores of a Caribbean Island for a week or two. Not so for the footballers of the era, one hundred years in history. Scunthorpe United entered their Christmas period on December 22nd 1923, and could not draw breath to rest until January 1st 1924. During those fourteen eventful days, the Nuts had performed away from home at Wombwell, Mexborough, Lincoln and Barnsley. In addition there was a home encounter with Lincoln City Reserves, which was played on Christmas Day, making for a late festive lunch.

at Barnsley, and also in the pair of tussles with Lincoln. The Barnsley result was rewarding, because they were equally as strong as the visiting Scunthorpe team, but the lads put in a dogged performance, and shear hard work won the day, with Raby scoring the only goal of this close ninety minutes. However, the cream at the top of the bottle was the two victories over the Junior Imps, on Christmas Day and Boxing Day. A 1-0 result at home does not reflect the superiority of the Scunthorpe XI, but those in attendance confirmed their satisfaction that the home team had excelled over the opponents. At Lincoln, twenty four hours later, a similar margin existed between these gladiators, and the 3-1 result in Scunthorpe United's favour was far more a true view of the activities on the hard, and baron Sincil Bank pitch.

This brought the story of the last year up to date, and with four days without a rest from New Year's Day, United had the prospect of the return fixture, at the Old Show Ground, with Mexborough, on Saturday, January 5th, 1924. Hargreaves was still under suspension, after his controversial dismissal time, but Franklin had played with distinction and was to become regular. There was better news of Ernie Millson, who had recovered from a knock, and was summoned for duty. Thus, the directors agreed upon the following eleven to represent the Club: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Franklin, fullbacks; Skull, Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Lawton, Bradbury, Raby, Kitchen and Foster, forwards.

So how had Dame Fortune treated Scunthorpe United in those five arduous contests? The answer was that the hard working Nuts had generally excelled, and although the football was not of champagne quality at times, they had stacked up a reasonable tally of points, and a gradual climb up the Midland League table was in evidence. The only defeat was in a lack lustre display at Mexborough, who caught a tired looking Nuts on the hop, with a decisive 3-0 defeat. At Wombwell, a gale force wind spoilt any chance of a chicken dinner display by

The match that unfolded, at the Old Show Ground against Mexborough, had similar pattern as that of the away match, three weeks ago. A poor attendance, on a bitterly cold day, saw the Nuts underperform, and never get to grips with an opposition that made opportunities, and converted them. Injury to Burkinshaw was a contributing factor, but Scunthorpe United were definitely second best.





This was to be the last visit the Scunthorpe side would take to this venue, because Rotherham Town were scheduled to amalgamate with Rotherham County, to become Rotherham United. News earlier in the season, and in this campaign they were struggling at the foot of the table, and just like a postman, the Natty Nuts were soon to deliver. The nuts and bolts of this clash were that a sparse crowd watched United take a first half lead, on a heavy pitch, that a farmer would be pleased to have ploughed. After the interval, it was the visitors from North Lincolnshire who dominated the play, and extended the lead to 3-0 on 90 minutes.

The Knut contemplates the tough Mexborough clash

Mexborough scored twice, and it could have been worse, if not for the agility of Reynolds, in goal, and Ashmore in the heart of the defence.

A 2-0 reverse could have been worse, but at least there were seven full days before Scunthorpe needed to take the trek to Rotherham, to face the Town club at the old Clifton Lane ground. from the dressing room was that Burkinshaw

could not make the team, and Edwin Charlesworth was given a rare opportunity for the first time since 1920, while Lawton on the wing was rested to give Clark from the reserves a first team trial, otherwise, it was as you were.

In past years, Rotherham Town had been a stiff opponent, especially at Clifton Lane. However, Scunthorpe had beaten them in the FA Cup, The newspaper headlines gave great credit to strength in depth at the back, where Bradbury, Franklin, Skull and Ashmore gave Reynolds, in between the Nuts' posts, a trouble free afternoon. However, the forward line were unquestionably heroes, especially Raby whose hat-trick made him stand out from the rest. Added to this superb result was the prospects of a second match against Rotherham Town, in seven days hence, at the Old Show Ground.







We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...





### A BRIEF HISTORY

Although it was 1933 before the name Boston United first appeared, football had been played in the town since the late 1800s and, indeed, always on the same site as the York Street stadium. at the back of the appropriate pub! Both teams were members of the Lincoln and District League.

After the First World War only one club, called simply Boston, emerged. After winning the Lincoln and District League in successive seasons, in 1921 the club joined the Midland League as a semi-professional side. In 1925 it went on to achieve the first Boston giant-killing in the FA Cup by beating the then-powerful Football League club Bradford Park Avenue 1-0 in the second round. The club was also achieving respectable positions in the Midland League, being runners up in 1924-25, behind Mansfield Town and again in 1926-27 behind Scunthorpe United.

Only twice were they not involved in the championship race, winning it a record four times. Boston were the first club ever to win a NPL "treble" of league, cup and shield. United also created a record of conceding only three goals at home in league games in a whole season, 51 consecutive home and away league games without a defeat, and 64 home league games (over three years) without a defeat.

The first time that a team from Boston entered the FA Cup was in 1887. In the first round they were drawn against Gainsborough Trinity and were soundly thrashed 7-0. Those early years saw some spectacular defeats in the FA Cup, including a 9-0 defeat at Lincoln City in 1890 and in the following season Grimsby Town went one better to notch up a 10-0 win.

By the start of the First World War there were two clubs in Boston, Boston Town, whose headquarters were "The Coach and Horses" and Boston Swifts, who used "The Indian Queen" as their HQ. In fact, as both the public houses were situated on "Main Ridge" and the pitch was virtually just opposite, it wasn't surprising that for the first 40 years or so that was what the ground was called. A small stand was erected in the early 1900s but other than that there were no other facilities, and the teams changed

The club would find major success elusive until 1954 when they appointed former Derby County goalkeeper Ray Middleton as their new player-manager. Middleton put together a squad that would challenge for honours over the next few seasons. For the 2001-2002 season, the club made the decision to go fully professional. This paid dividends when they went on to clinch the Conference title and promotion to the Football League.

Their fairytale farewell to York Street did not materialise in 2019-20 as Altrincham secured a 1-0 win in Lincolnshire as the curtain fell on the Pilgrims' famous old stadium before moving to their current home.

Season 1965-66 saw the start of the climb back to senior non-league football with a United Counties League and cup "double."

In management, he began as an assistant at Colchester, Norwich and Aston Villa before managing King's Lynn, Grantham and Kettering before Boston.

### 9. Kelsey Mooney

Age: 24 Nationality: English Position: Forward

Former Aston Villa youngster Mooney, son of Watford legend Tommy, joined the Pilgrims in May 2023 as the club's first summer signing.

Mooney was an established National League North striker with Learnington when he sustained a serious ACL injury - returning for the latter part of the 2022-2023 campaign as the Brakes failed to stave off relegation. Throughout his career Mooney has appeared for various clubs at the sixth tier of English Football, however the forward is a familiar face at Glanford Park as he enjoyed a stint with the Iron after arriving from Hereford ahead of the 2020-21 season.

### 2. Jai Rowe

A familiar face to Iron supporters having left the club last season by mutual consent. Rowe ended up at Aldershot Town for the final stages of last season before penning a deal with the Pilgrims.

### 3. Ethan Sephton

The left-back joined Boston United from Alvechurch for an undisclosed fee in January 2023. He had sprung to prominence during the Church's run to the second round of the Emirates FA Cup. He signed a contract until the end of the 2023-2024 campaign.

Following his departure, a year later Mooney went on to find his form in front of goal including this current campaign as he's amassed five goals in 20 league appearances under the guideship of lan Calverhouse.

### 5. Michael Bostwick

Having made his name locally with the likes of Peterborough United and Lincoln City, enjoying legendary status at both clubs, Bostwick won promotion from League Two with Stevenage in 2022-2023. He also helped Boro beat Premier League side Aston Villa in the Emirates FA Cup in January 2023.

### 6. Tom Leak Joining in June 2023 from promotion final winners

### **19. Jordan Richards**

Originally joining on loan from Notts County in September 2015. The son of former United defender Pedro, Richards linked up with the Pilgrims alongside team-mate Lartey Sarpong. Richards made his debut against Chorley at right-back before moving into a more natural role in front of United's back four. He was subsequently loaned to Sligo Rovers in Ireland - before successful permanent spells with King's Lynn Town (under lan Culverhouse) and Brackley Town. He re-united with Culverhouse at United in June 2023.

### stint at AFC Telford United.



12. Michael Gyasi Exciting striker Gyasi linked up with Boston United in July 2023 - having previously played under Ian Culverhouse's management at King's Lynn Town. The Hamburg-born striker arrived from Chesterfield, where he had agreed a mutual termination of his contract, having also previously played for Dover Athletic.

Kidderminster Harriers. Having begun his career with Walsall, the centre-half moved on to Aggborough, from where he also spent a brief spell on loan at Alfreton Town.

### 23. Zak Mills

Mills made a sensational homecoming in August 2022 - six years after leaving the Pilgrims to embark on a career in the EFL. He spent two seasons with Grimsby Town, before single campaigns with Morecambe, Port Vale, Oldham Athletic and Walsall. He was twice part of the United squad beaten in the play-offs during his first spell with the club.

### 8. Martin Woods

Vastly-experienced, joining in the summer. The former Leeds United youngster enjoyed a long and distinguished career within the pro ranks - including spells north and south of the border. His most prolific spell in terms of appearances arrived between 2007 and 2013 with Doncaster Rovers.

### **11. Jimmy Knowles** Striker Knowles joined Boston United following his departure from Mansfield Town. The young forward enjoyed loan spells with Notts County and Kettering Town during his time at Field Mill - and made a new start with the Pilgrims in July 2023.



Other players in their squad also include recently departed goalkeeper from the Iron, Aaron Chapman, as well as players Tom Edge and Deji Sotona.

### 4. Brad Nicholson

He re-joined Boston United in the summer - having recovered from a serious ACL injury. Having arrived from Guiseley in March 2022, impressing on his debut against his previous club, Nicholson missed out on involvement in the play-offs after sustaining a serious injury against Gloucester City.

### 7. Keaton Ward

Signing from Kettering Town for an undisclosed fee, he started his career at Mansfield Town, before a brief spell with Barnsley and a loan

Their festive period has been a good one, taking maximum points of nine from their three games, while they also recorded a more than respectable draw at Chester just prior.

Their recent form in the league has been good, losing just three of their last 14 games in all competitions. They also started the season relatively strongly, taking four points from Buxton and South Shields before being edged out by Tamworth. Their next defeat would be a heavy 4-0 reverse at Alfreton Town, but they avenged for that defeat just before Christmas. The Pilgrims arrive at Glanford Park full of confidence and in-form.

The Iron are set to venture down to Northamptonshire for the second time this term, as Jimmy Dean's men are awaited by play-off hopefuls **Brackley Town for a highly** anticipated reverse fixture at the St James Park.

In between the clubs change of home's they played their football at Buckingham Road, where the players would change in a nearby pub called the Plough.

The ground has a capacity of 3,500 seats of which 500 are seated and 1500 are covered. The highest ever attendance in the stadium is 3,015 which took place during last terms their National League North play-off Final encounter with eventual winners Kidderminster Harriers.



There is a medium sized car park at the ground (around 80-100 cars), which costs £2 to park. Otherwise, there is plenty of street parking along Churchill Way and roads to either side.

The fixture comes after three previous encounters so far this season between the two clubs with both United and the Saints sporting one win a piece. Firstly a 0-0 draw at Glanford Park in mid-September set up an enticing replay on the road where Scunthorpe were defeated 3-1 following three late Brackley goals, including two in additional time. The Iron faced Gavin Cowan's side once more in early October when the Iron prevailed 1-0 courtesy of a superb Jacob Butterfield free-kick.



One of the furthest away trips for Iron fans this season, the stadium sits 144 miles away from Glanford Park with an estimated 2 hours and 20 minutes car journey.

### ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

There isn't a railway station in Brackley itself. The closest is the nearby Banbury which is ten miles away. From the railway you can get the Stagecoach Bus No 500 from Banbury to Brackley.



There is a large social club at the ground, which welcomes away supporters and is accessed from inside the ground. The nearest pub is the Locomotive Inn, which is a five-minute walk away. This pub offers pies on matchdays and has real ale from the nearby Silverstone Brewery. Further up in the town (about a 10 minute walk from the ground) is the Crown Hotel which has a bar. There is also a handy fish and chip shop on this side of the road called Ann's'.

### THE STADIUM

St James Park opened in 1974, six years prior to the closure of the formerly Manor Park establishment where the Saints played since their formation in 1890.

> Take Doncaster Rd/A18 to A1077

> Take M18 and M1 to A43 in Northamptonshire. Then take exit 15A from the A1

> Follow the A43 until the Northampton Road roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Northampton Road and follow it until arriving at Brackley Town Football Club.






