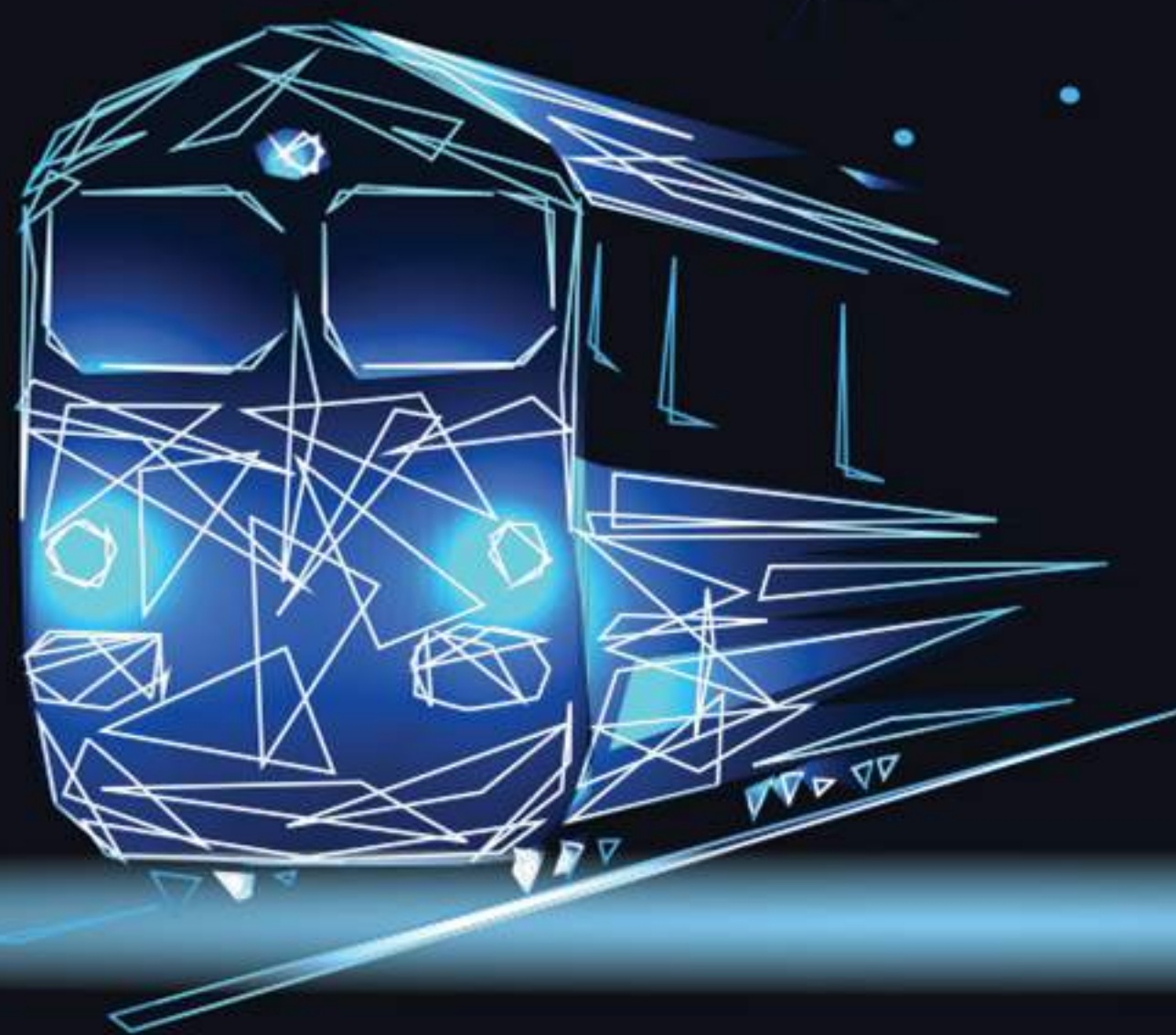

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good afternoon and welcome back to Glanford Park for the first of four games here this month, and we're going to need your backing in all of them as we look to build some momentum.

I extend my welcome to everyone associated with Gloucester City who have made the long trip to us for today's game.

Last time out at Glanford Park was thoroughly enjoyable. To back up the 6-0 against Spennymoor Town to put another six past Bishop's Stortford was fantastic. The equaliser was unacceptable, but we dealt with the adversity, played some great football and scored some fantastic goals.

We then went on the road for two games, with Blyth getting called off, and we picked up four points on our travels. At Boston, we came away with a good point. They raised their game, had a big crowd in, and it was a tough game. We took the lead but were pegged back, but all-in-all, it was a fair result.

On Tuesday night at Banbury, it was a perfect away performance. The game started open and expansive, and because of the quality we have in the side, that suited us and we were able to score two magnificent goals to win us the game. I thought the football was pulsating, particularly in the first half.

The two goals we scored were worldies, but we probably scored the hard ones and missed the easy ones, as we had a number of chances throughout the game to score more than the two goals we got.

There were a lot of big performances out there on Tuesday night, and we have to carry that forward now.

We lost Reagan Ogle to injury on Tuesday, and are waiting for further feedback on how serious it is, and how long he will be out for. Ross Barrows came in and did exceptionally well in midweek - like he'd played every game of the season so far. We will also look at Jason Law, who we took off as a precaution.

Gloucester will pose another challenge that we will have to overcome. We must not be complacent that we've won the last two here, or that we've scored six goals in each of those games. We must earn the right to perform in this game, and get the result by doing what we've been doing in recent weeks.

We've got a new owner, and I've had four games back in the dugout since my operation. In those games, we've had two clean sheets, and four points away from home.

We're in it together. United we stand, and I mean it when I say it. It feels like everyone in that

dressing room is pulling together. They've given us a great reaction since the Chester game which was an atrocious performance. We've taken 10 points from a possible 12 since then, which is a brilliant return.

Last time out, the whole day, the whole atmosphere in the ground was just fantastic to be part of. It was amazing, and one of them for me, when I get older and I look back, I can say I've part of occasions like that.

All I'll say is you're amazing; thank you. Please keep sticking with us. We're going to give it everything we can to keep you smiling and make us successful.

Thank you to everyone that's been to any of the last few games, since my last set of notes, and shown your support.

FOCUS ON... ROSS BARROWS

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to Ross Barrows, who could be set for an extended stint in the side...



Things, as reported in the summer, when Barrows returned to the club, have gone full circle for the defender. Having been released by the Iron at the age of 15, and signed 10 years later, it could be described as a dream come true.

And, as he enters his 27th year, sitting down on his 26th birthday on Thursday afternoon to speak ahead of the game, he now has a lot to be optimistic about over the coming weeks.

“Carpe diem” or “seize the day” was the message on Tuesday when Reagan Ogle went down inside the opening 10 minutes at Banbury on Tuesday night, and boy did he do that!

“Definitely, it is an opportunity for me. I’ve had to be patient, coming in off the back of a bad injury last year. I’ve had to be patient in terms of getting

myself fully fit, ready to go on and help the team. I’ve had a couple of starts, where I felt like I did okay. I obviously hadn’t done enough to keep my shirt, which is football, and it’s proved right because the boys are winning, so I have no issue with that. I’ve been coming off the bench for Will mainly, as he’s on four yellows, and I feel like every time I have, I’ve done well and kept the shape, and made a bit of an impact.

“I’ve stayed professional, I’ve stayed ready. Unfortunately for Reags, he got injured quite badly early on, so I was straight

into the thick of it, as full-back. I’m feeling fit, I’m feeling ready, and now is an opportunity for me to get a run of games and really stamp my authority on that shirt.”

Jimmy Dean, speaking after the game on Tuesday night, reflected on Barrows’ impact on the game stating that it “looked like he’d played every game this season” which was a testament to the performance he did put in on the night, also stating: “I knew what a great player Ross is... he’s going to really help us through this period.”

“When I saw it, and my agent showed me the footage, I was absolutely buzzing with it to be fair. It’s always good to get bit of praise from your gaffer. It gives you that confidence going forwards. He’s been very patient with me. He’s been brilliant, kept believing in me, so hopefully now I can come back and reward him for that.

“It felt good on Tuesday. I’ve done a lot of work in training to be ready to keep myself sharp. I was blowing a little bit towards the end, but I feel like I will get fitter and stronger with every game.

Having played a bit part in proceedings so far, Barrows is looking forward to playing a more prominent role going forward, but outlined the side’s key to success in recent weeks, also commenting on the group of players we have at the football club.

“We’re massively enjoying it at the minute. I think it was always going to take a little bit of time for the boys to gel, especially away from home. There were a lot of new arrivals coming into the club. I feel like we’ve got a really good togetherness, the boys are bouncing off each other, and it’s a good place to be. Everything is sorted off the pitch now, and you can see the rewards from the lads being able to fully focus on what’s happening on the pitch.

“It was tough. You’re not sure where you’re going to be - if you’ve got a contract or not. We didn’t know what was going to happen. I think sometimes some people forget that this is our job and that we have things to pay for. We were worried as we might have been unemployed. We’re over that now, and fully focused on getting up this league and hopefully winning it.

“This club means loads to me. They’ve given me experiences in football from being 10 years old. I’ve made friends and relationships at this club that I wouldn’t have been able to have if it wasn’t for this club - even in terms of football knowledge, going through the academy with what I learnt here. It’s part of the player I am today, so it was a real sad time to see the club



in the situation that it was. That’s why it means so much more for me when I’m playing to give back to the club that gave me so much when I was younger.”

Reflecting on his memories at the academy, the lowlight was naturally being released, but Barrows draws upon that experience, and has used it to get to the present day, pulling on that Iron shirt, like he always dreamt he would do.

“I’ve got a picture of me and my family when I signed on the pitch, which is from years ago. I’ve got friends who are now fans that message me - people like Charlie Henderson who was a goalkeeper. His dad was one of

the sponsors at the last match - John - he's a really good guy, and I've known him for ages. It's just so good to repay the club. That academy system wasn't successful for me in terms of the end result, but everything happens for a reason, and I'm thankful for everything that the club did for me in the academy, because I learnt so much.

"I think that some young players think that when they do get released, that that's it. At the time,

I did feel a little bit like that, but you have to reset and think that it's not the be-all and end-all. I went away, worked on myself, and to now come back to the club and be playing for the first team - which I always dreamed of as a young kid - is really special.

"I feel like I had a big point to prove to a lot of people, who maybe doubted me, or the coaches that released me. Not in a bad way, because they released me because they thought I wasn't good enough. Probably at that time, they were right, I probably wasn't good enough, or there were certain aspects of my game that weren't right for what the club needed at that time. For me to come back as a complete player, and for me to really show what I can do, means a lot. I really want to make an impact here."

Supporters may have seen Ross' involvement in the community, which he's done for a number of years. The interview concluded with him giving an insight to why he does it.

"Previously, over the past few years, I've had struggles with mental health in terms of setbacks and rejection, and not feeling great in myself. I've taken it upon myself to go into

schools, and to talk about that. I talk about my journey in football, how it's affected me, and how it's affected me mentally, and life as well. It's not just relating it to the kids in a football way, but relating it in a way to display that you can have these setbacks in life, and these negative thoughts, but you can come through it. There is light at the end of the tunnel. I just make them aware how to deal with those thoughts, in terms of speaking to someone, and also to help them understand that it is normal.

"It's about trying to educate a younger generation, and sometimes it's easier coming from someone that has been through it, rather than a teacher. I'm really grateful to the schools that invite me in to do it. It's all about me going out and sending out a positive message. If I save one life from what I'm doing, then that's my job done. I don't want anyone else to go through what I went through.

"Four years ago, I did a podcast, which was the first time I spoke about it openly. I got a card from someone a couple of years later saying they'd listened to it and it really helped them. That was a really good feeling, and I was taken aback that it helped someone."

Steve Parsons rounds-up the latest news from the Study Support Centre at the stadium...



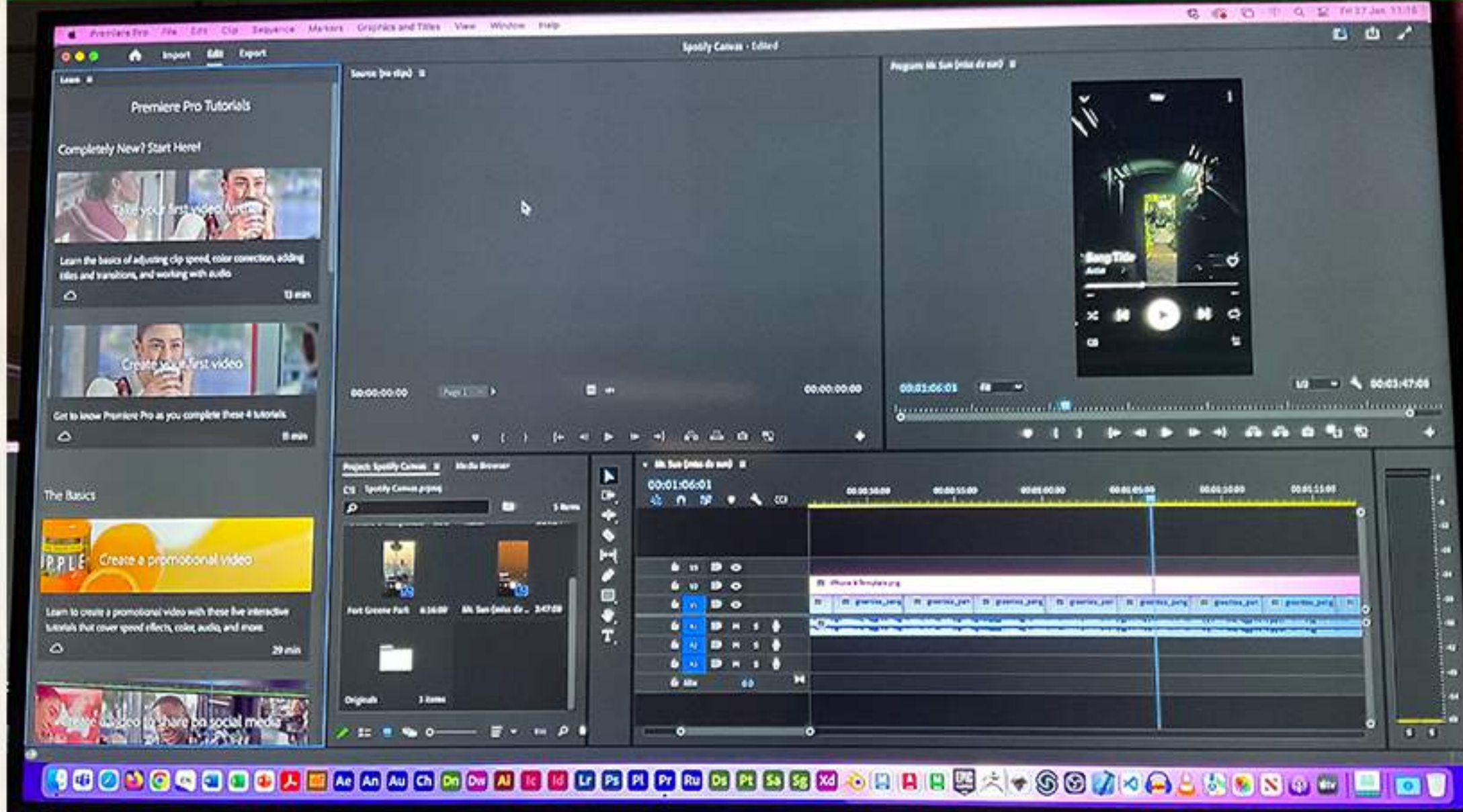

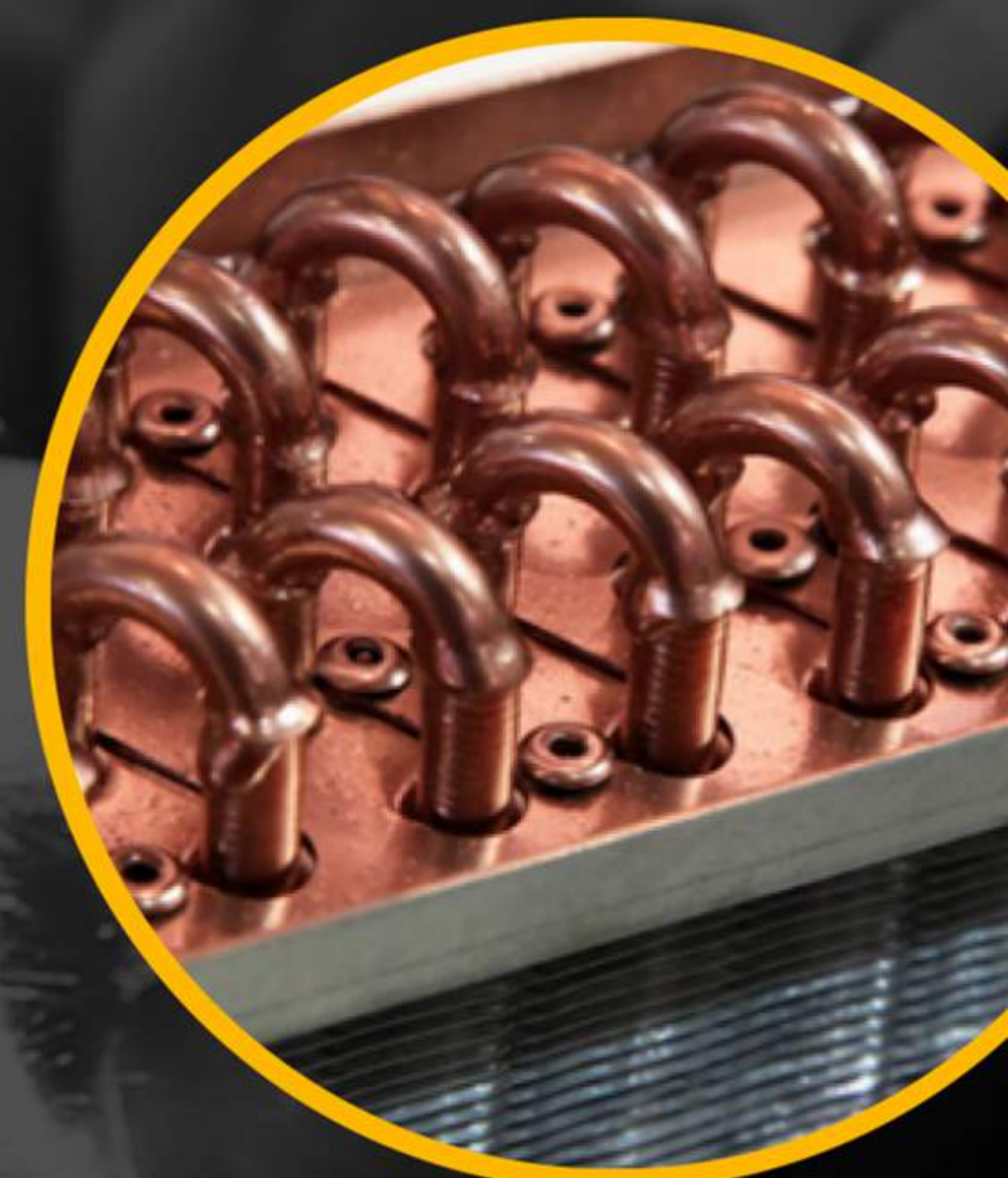

NEW ONLINE SHOP

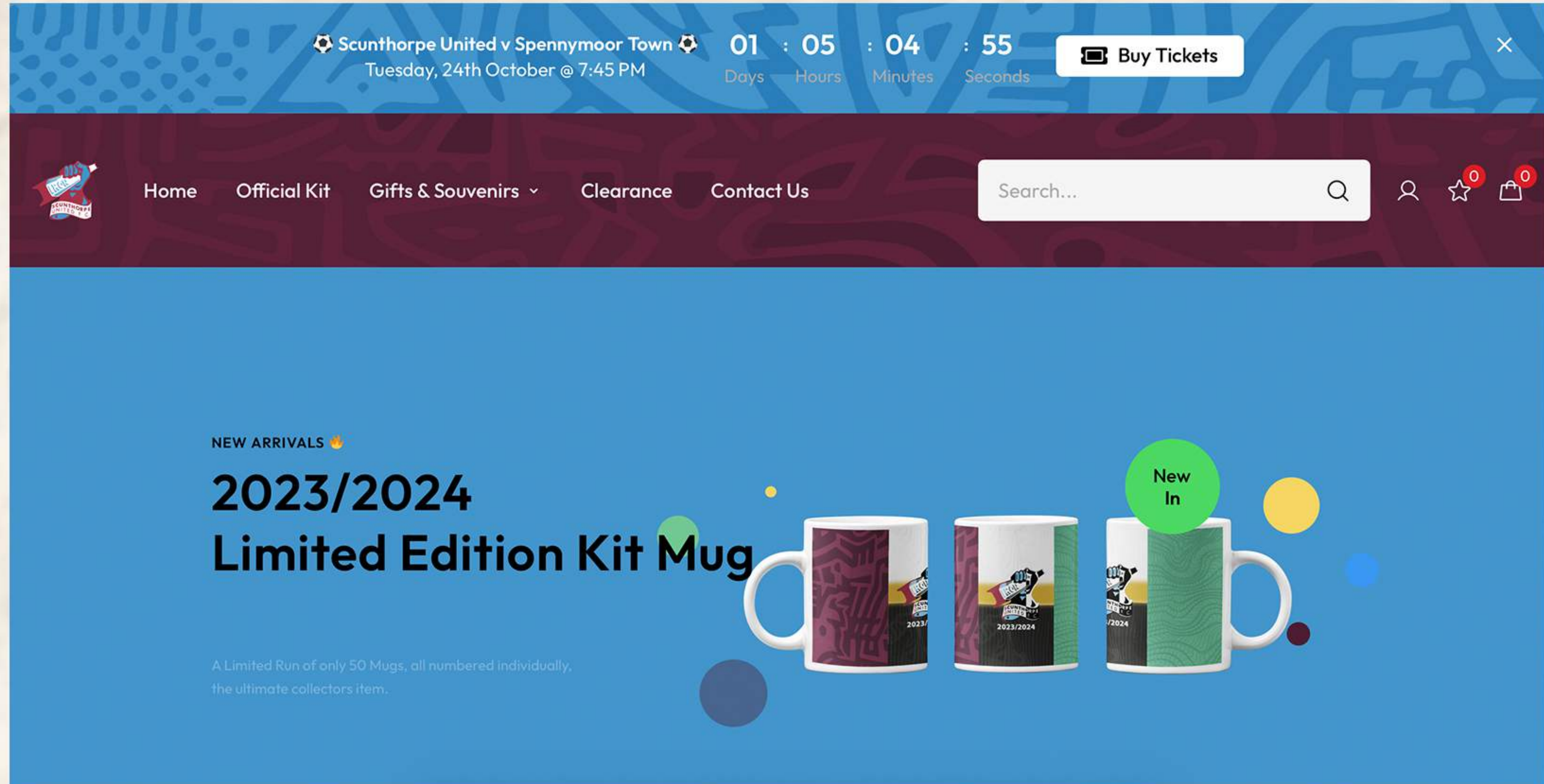
A brief outlook at our new online shop which was launched in collaboration with our United we Stand range.

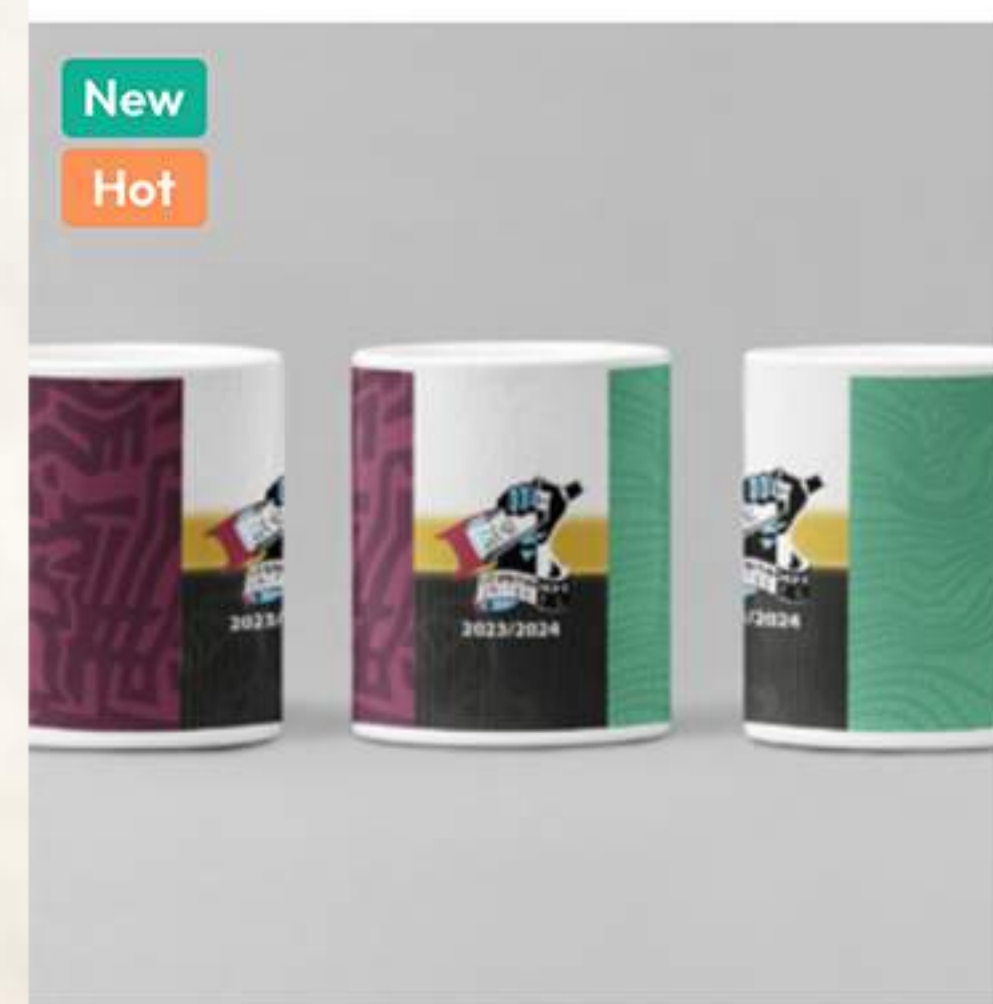
We also added to the "United we Stand" range in the form of two designs of bottle openers, while there is a new aluminium bottle design and mug available, along with much more.

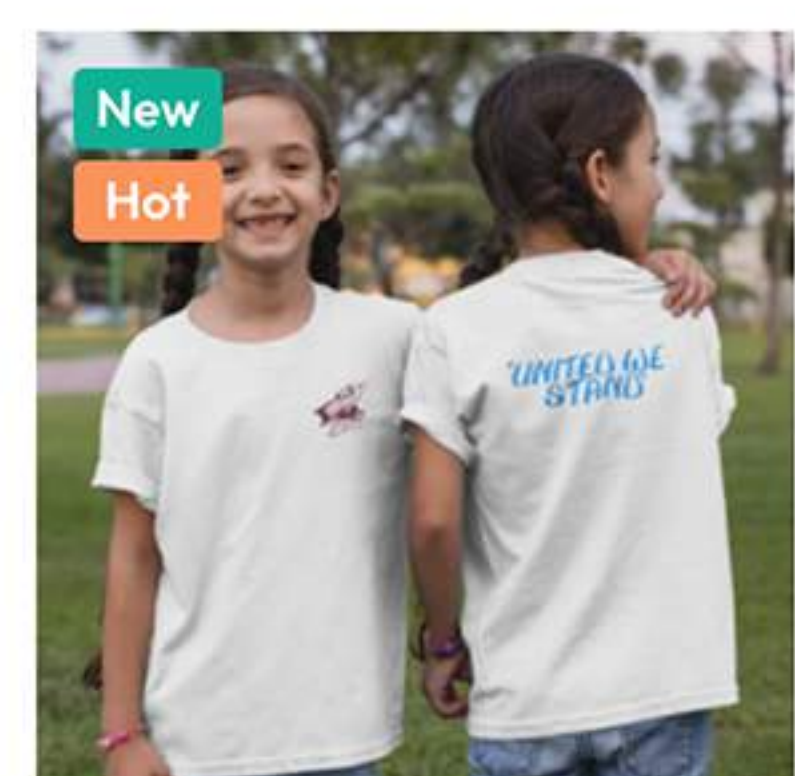

MIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES UNBEATEN IN EIGHT

MEETINGS WITH MARINERS AND ROTHERHAM

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

One hundred years ago it was autumn at Scunthorpe, and the children of the district were collecting wood for bonfire night, and on November 5th their dads would be letting rockets off into the dark night sky.

Up the Clayfield Road, now christened Doncaster Road, Scunthorpe United had rocketed into form, being unbeaten in eight games. It was a remarkable turn round after a moderate start, and saw the Club in mid-table position in the Midland League, and reach the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup.

The next chapter in the 1923-24 season was scheduled to take place on November 10th, 1923, when the Junior Mariners of Grimsby Town Reserves were expected at the Old Show Ground. A contest against this rather useful side was always a test, and the visitors were at the loftiest position in the table, on the summit, with a weather eye on taking silverware at the beginning of next May.

With this prospect in mind, Scunthorpe United's directors selected the following team: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Hargreaves, full backs; Skull Ashmore and Millson, halfbacks; Lawton, Burkinshaw, White, Kitchen and Foster. This was an unchanged team from that which had beaten Boston in the FA Cup, only seven days previous.

At kick-off, two-and-a-half thousand spectators at this important game was consider a poor attendance, but there was plenty of noise in support of the Nuts. Grimsby had the ball in the net at an early stage, but the point was ruled out for offside. Then, as Reynolds bounced the ball, a young Mariner nicked the ball off

him, but the shot hit the bar, and from the rebound the Mariners shot into the goal. After a consultation with a linesman, a free kick was awarded to Scunthorpe for the foul. Kitchen, too, had one chalked off, when goal line technology could not determine if the whole of the ball had crossed the line, so the ref also denied the Nuts.

Meanwhile, it was Scunthorpe United's turn to score a recognised goal, after ten minutes had ticked off the clock. A Scunthorpe attack was not cleared, allowing Ashmore to shoot, but the ball cannoned off the bar, and White dashed into register. In the second period Kitchen took control of the ball,

made a dash for the target, and scored with a sweet drive, to compensate for what had been chalked off. He stamped his authority on the game with his second goal, taking advantage of a poor back pass by the Grimsby right sided full back, and made no mistake with his stinging shot. A 3-0 result against the league leaders was a handsome result.

On the following Saturday, it was up for the cup, against Rotherham Town. It was deemed a disappointment that the crowd was only 2,633 for this notable occasion. Burkinshaw was not available for this occasion, and Gregson dropped into his place from the second eleven. Also Thorpe was required to take over from Foster at outside left. Those who took in the ninety minutes gave much praise to the Yorkshire visitors, especially in view of them playing for sixty minutes without their right back, who suffered a knee injury.

This was to be a frustrating ninety minutes, which ended goalless. United could only blame themselves for creating the extra work of a replay, because they missed the golden opportunity of a penalty,

We take a look at this afternoon's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Thomas H. Coleman sat down in his home in Littleton Villa, Brook Street, Tredworth and wrote a letter to the Editor of The Citizen on Saturday 27th January 1883 wondering why there was no football club playing under Association Rules in the City of Gloucester.

As a result of the letter, 37 days later the club was officially formed on March 5th 1883 as Gloucester Association Football Club and Thomas H. Coleman became the club's first ever captain in the inaugural season of 1883-84. Although formed on March 5th 1883, Gloucester AFC did not play their first game until 9th February 1884 when a match was advertised as the first in the city under Association Rules to be played at Budding's Field against Warmley losing 1-3. Unfortunately, the first venture was to last only three seasons and folded in 1886.

A group of players keen to have a major team in Gloucester played eight fixtures in 1888-89 under the leadership of Algernon S. King and called themselves initially 'A.S. King's XI'. After two games they were known as 'Gloucester

Nomads' due to the lack of a home venue. It was these players who passed the baton on to two enthusiasts of the game who re-formed the club in September 1889 as Gloucester AFC.

The first time 'City' was officially added to the Gloucester title was in 1902, although the first mention in The Citizen of the team being called Gloucester City was when the team was printed on Friday 16 November 1900.

In 1986 the club moved grounds again, this time to the Hempsted area and Meadow Park.

In July 2007, Gloucester City's home, Meadow Park, was affected by the Gloucestershire flooding that engulfed the county. The club was hit with almost 8 feet of water, almost submerging the crossbar. This astonishing picture, featured in The Sun, Sky News and the BBC shot the club to national attention both in the media and football supporters across the Country.

The club's first season of exile was at Forest Green Rovers New Lawn Stadium, despite the loss of a stadium and revenue stream the club finished a creditable 6th in the

in the league, just outside the play-offs.

The club's second season of exile at Cirencester Town proved to be one of the greatest in the history of the club. The club finished 3rd in the Southern Premier League and would gain promotion through the play-offs - which was amazing considering the predicament.

It was announced in March 2010 that the club would be ground sharing with major rivals Cheltenham Town for the forthcoming two seasons.

In October 2018 Alex Petheram joined the main club board and became co-Chairman with Eamonn McGurk in 2019. With new vision and investment both on and off the pitch and the club returning to its original club colours. City finally in September 2020 returned home to TigerTurf Stadium with a Phase 1 capacity of 4,000 and a build cost of circa £3m.

ON THE ROAD KING'S LYNN TOWN

**TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 14TH -
7.45PM**

The Iron are next on the road on Tuesday night when they make the trip to face King's Lynn Town.

The fixture against the Linnets will be the first meeting between the two sides, as has been the case for much of the season so far.

THE STADIUM

The Walks Stadium is a classic looking football ground, which is of a good size for this level.

Dating back to 1879 it is one of the oldest grounds in the country. On one side is the Grandstand. Although it only runs for around two-thirds of the length of the pitch, straddling the halfway line, it is of a good size and looks quite imposing. This covered stand has a single tier of 1,200 seats, which are raised above pitch level, meaning that you have to climb a small set of stairs to enter it. Originally opened in 1956, the stand contains the club facilities, such as the dressing rooms, press area clubhouse bar, cafe and club shop. It is set back a bit

from the side of the pitch, as there is a spectator standing area in front, as well as the team dugouts. It has windshields to either side as well as a couple of supporting pillars at the front.

Away fans are housed on the Mick Wright Terrace at one end, as well as part of the North Terrace. In addition, a limited number of seats are normally made available to visiting supporters in the Grandstand for those who need to sit.

BY CAR

94 miles from Glanford Park, it will take approximately two hours and 10 minutes to journey from the Iron's stadium.

> Follow M180 towards Grimsby, and take the exit for the A15 towards Lincoln

> Following the A15 before taking the first exit onto the A17 towards Sleaford

> Follow Clenchwarton Rd (first exit on the roundabout) before continuing onto Wisbech Rd

> Take the first exit to remain on Wisbech Rd, before at the next roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Vancouver Ave/B1144

> Turn left, with the ground on the left.

CAR PARKING

There is no car parking available at the ground for visiting supporters, however, there is plenty of street parking available in the local area.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

King's Lynn Railway Station is a 5-10 minute walk away from the ground. It is served by trains from London Kings Cross. On exiting the station turn left and where you see a church in front of you (and where the roads bends around to the right), take the pathway around to the left and walk through the park. You will soon see the ground over on your right.

FACILITIES

As fans are segregated, then only those visiting supporters who are seated in the Grandstand can access the bar. There are two small pubs located around five minutes walk away from the Walks Stadium, the Live and Let live on Windsor Road and Lord Napier on Guanock Terrace.

DARLINGTON - FA TROPHY

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 18TH, 2023 - 3PM KICK-OFF

The Iron are set to welcome Darlington to Glanford Park for the second time this season.

The side were United's second opponents on home soil in the league earlier in the campaign, and first under the lights, with Scunthorpe running out comfortable 4-0 winners. Danny Whitehall notched a brace in the game, with Alfie Beestin netting, while Dion Sembie-Ferris scored his first goal for the club in the thoroughly enjoyable August evening.

Since that result, Darlington have continued to struggle in their league form, and have since parted company with then-manager Alun Armstrong and replaced him with Josh Gowling.

The side are currently rock bottom of the division with 11 points from their 16 games played. Their two wins of the season, though, have come on the road, while they have drawn five of their eight home games, losing the other three.

Darlington lost 2-0 in midweek to Peterborough Sports, but did pick up three points away at Farsley Celtic a couple of games ago as they picked up a spirited 2-1 win. That was their first victory in 11 games though, when they squeezed a 3-2 win at Alfreton.

In between, they've found points hard to come by, often suffering only narrow defeats, although - aside from the Iron - they have been beaten comfortably by Tamworth (L0-4) and Buxton (L0-5). Five league draws make up their 11 points.
