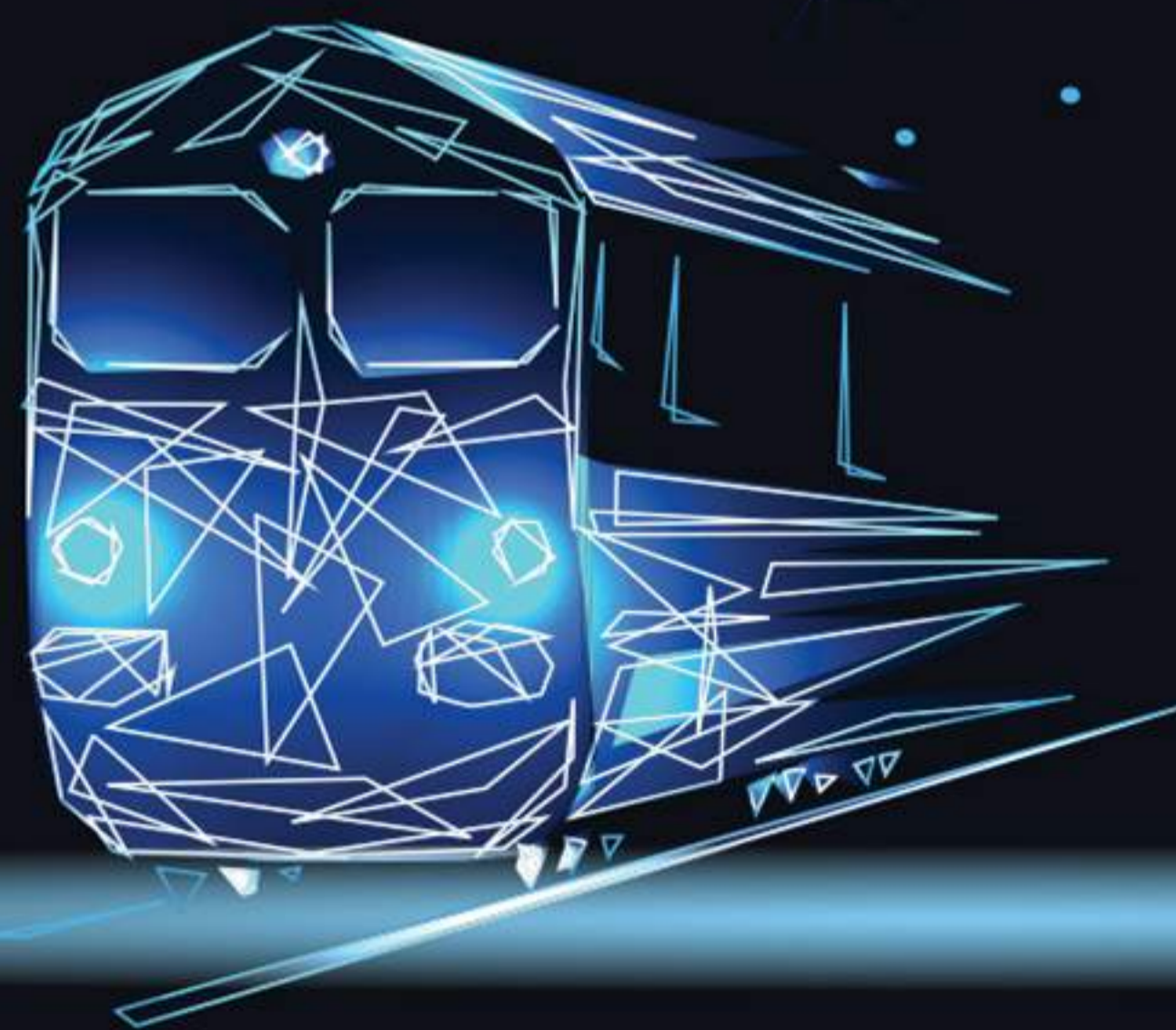

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Welcome back to Glanford Park as we entertain Scarborough Athletic to conclude this Bank Holiday weekend.

It was less than 48 hours ago when we last took to the field, so it has been a very quick turnaround ahead of this encounter. On Saturday, we suffered our first defeat of the season in what was a frustrating game at Curzon Ashton. Arguably we've played worse this season and won. We had 24 shots to their two and we come away with nothing. It was one of those days.

It was farcical towards the end in terms of the conditions. We had more than enough chances and more than enough of the ball to get something out of the game. It was just entirely frustrating that we weren't able to play our football in the latter stages to try and get something from the game. It hindered us attacking severely towards the end, and it nearly cost us a goal at the end with the ball holding up.

We have to dust ourselves down and go again this afternoon, and we have a very quick opportunity to put Saturday behind us in front of our own fans.

Last time out at Glanford Park was a special night against Darlington. Nights like that are what I've been thinking about and talking to my players about as we came into the season. We had the luxury of being able to enjoy the evening and the special atmosphere that you created, and we need more of that here this season.

Against Rushall, I thought they gave a really good account of

themselves and the scoreline did not reflect what they put in, but we were clinical with two brilliant goals late on.

While it may have been a defeat at the weekend, it was the first since Winterton in pre-season. We put together a nine-game unbeaten streak, including pre-season against three EFL sides, and we want to start another similar run from today.

There's pressure on the boys for every performance and to their credit, on the whole, they've done really well so far this season, and we've made a good start. We wouldn't have that pressure any other way. We understand we're Scunthorpe United, and that's why we are all here.

Saturday was made more difficult without Michael Clunan and Alfie Beestin, who have both done tremendously well for us in our opening games.

Mikey will be out for a couple of weeks, we hope, while Alfie has done his hamstring in training.

It's probably not as bad as last year, but we're probably looking at four-to-six weeks. It hurt us at the weekend. The squad that we had on Saturday is what we've got at the moment. They're two big misses, and we're also without Callum Roberts and Jason Law as well.

We have had incredible support at the weekend, with over 75% of the attendance at Curzon being Scunthorpe supporters. We took a similar number to Rushall a week prior and the attendances here have been superb.

We owe you one today after the weekend. We will look to turn that around and get back on a winning run, hopefully starting this afternoon. Thank you, as always, for your backing.

ROSS BARROWS JOINS ILKESTON TOWN ON LOAN

Iron defender Ross Barrows has joined Northern Premier League Premier Division side Ilkeston Town on a three-month loan.

The 25-year-old was United's tenth summer signing, but he's found himself down the pecking order with Reagan Ogle starting the season and Michael Kelly also getting pre-season minutes in his preferred position of right-back.

The switch to the Derbyshire side will allow the former Altrincham player to gain match minutes and remain match fit.

He joins the Robins ahead of their Northern Premier League Premier Division campaign opener away at Marske United on Saturday.

The loan is subject to a 28-day recall.

The defender has commenced life in good form, with Ilkeston starting the season very strongly. Barrows has featured in all three of their games at the time of writing (prior to Saturday) and scored in last weekend's 6-1 demolition of Workington in the FA Cup.

Barrows continued to get gametime as he returns from nine months out injured.

FOCUS ON... TYLER DENTON

We continued our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to defender Tyler Denton following his fantastic strike at Rushall last week...



If there was ever a goal that would be entered in to be an early contender for goal of the season, it would be Tyler Denton's strike away at Rushall Olympic last weekend.

At the same time that South Shields' Tom Broadbent was scoring an equally stupendous goal against our opponents today in what proved to be the winner, but the goal from the former King's Lynn defender even got the Non League Paper and the Vanarama National League North thinking he was a forward, naming him in their teams of the week and putting him in as a left-sided frontman.

So the burning question on everyone's mind... did he mean it? Was it a cross, or was it a shot. Naturally asked immediately after the game, it was even compounded with Reagan Ogle speaking post-match to the media,

jovially uttering that Denton has shanked it, with the ball coming off his shin and being a lucky goal.

The reality couldn't be further from the truth. Manager Jimmy Dean even stated in his post-match press conference that he knew the full-back was quick, but not that quick as he latched onto a ball through from Michael Kelly to then loop an incredible volley into the goal from the left touchline.

"It was definitely a shot!" Tyler affirmed when he was asked at

the start of the interview.

"A few people, including yourself (*James Moody, interviewing*) asked me after the game, but I didn't see anyone in the box, so I thought "why not?!"

The audacity to attempt such an effort sealed what looked like a resounding win away from home, but it was far from easy throughout, but the effort demonstrated the confidence oozing out of this team.

the pitch. It's not just the strikers. The gaffer is very positive. He thinks that if you're in those areas, shoot, cross, get balls into the box and you never know what can happen."

In quote tweeting the video of his goal on Twitter following the anticipated embargo being lifted by the Vanarama National League on 12.30pm on Sunday, he alluded to using his one goal of the season. Acknowledging, he's not known for his scoring prowess, the reality is Denton is hoping that his tally for the campaign doesn't stick to just one.

"Hopefully, I've not jinxed it! I don't seem to get many, but when they do come, they're usually alright. Especially, if I were to play higher up the pitch, I would expect to get a few more."

Denton was pushed higher up the pitch following a substitution at Rushall, with Kelly coming on and slotting in at right-back. He spoke about the slightly different role he took on, which allowed him to net the goal.

"I enjoy it. I like to think that I'm an attacking full-back anyway. It's a little bit different with starting positions and things like that.

"Like I've said previously, I've got a good relationship with Kells. If he bombs forward, I'll fill in for him and vice versa. If I go forward, I know I've got stability with Kells behind me at left-back."

The former King's Lynn defender has had the nod ahead of Kelly on each occasion so far this season. Not resting on his laurels, Denton is keen to keep his place. If that's at left-back, he will likely to continue to keep a player on the sidelines that was a mainstay in a National League Premier Division side's play-off campaign last season.

"Don't get me wrong, I am working hard. He's constantly nibbling at my heels, and he's at me. That's what makes us a good team and hopefully a successful team. All over the pitch, we've got players itching to get gametime, and it's up



to the 11 players on the pitch to keep their place. He's not shown it, which is a credit to him, because he's a great professional, but I know he's itching to go. He's pushing me, and hopefully I'm pushing him too."

With the Iron getting the results on

the road, but maybe not hitting their stride, but performances at Glanford Park being very performance, Denton alluded to the home support in a key part of the stadium being a fortress.

“Having the crowd here, is definitely a massive positive. Teams aren’t used to it, and at this level, the away games are going to be tough with the adversity. We’ve come through it so far.

“I’m glad we’ve got a couple of the plastic pitches out of the way early. It’s definitely not the same, it’s different on your feet, like we saw with the injury to Michael Clunan. It can take it out of you and it’s very firm underneath, and there’s potential to plant your foot a little bit differently than on grass. The medical staff here have been on it in terms of recovery. It’s proven to be fair too. We’re lasting a lot longer than other teams, which is good.

Last time out at home, the Iron enjoyed a special night under the lights at Glanford Park. More of the same is the

aim, according to the defender.

“That’s gone now. We can’t look back, only look at what’s to come.

“Scarborough are a good, organised team and good at set-pieces. They get a good following and it’s nice to see them back up in this league. We’re confident that if we do what we know we can, we will outmatch the majority of teams in this league.”

Finishing off the interview, Denton reflected on life as an Iron player: “I’m really enjoying my football. I’m

comfortable, but not too comfortable. Moving closer to home has definitely helped me, but the positivity around the place from the gaffer and the other lads and the fans has helped. It’s all coming together and is shaping up to be something special. Being closer to home has been massive in terms of recovery and being a bit happier, seeing family and friends. I’m very happy here and it’s been a great start. We know what we want to achieve - teams will never give up at this level, and we’ve got to stick at it.”

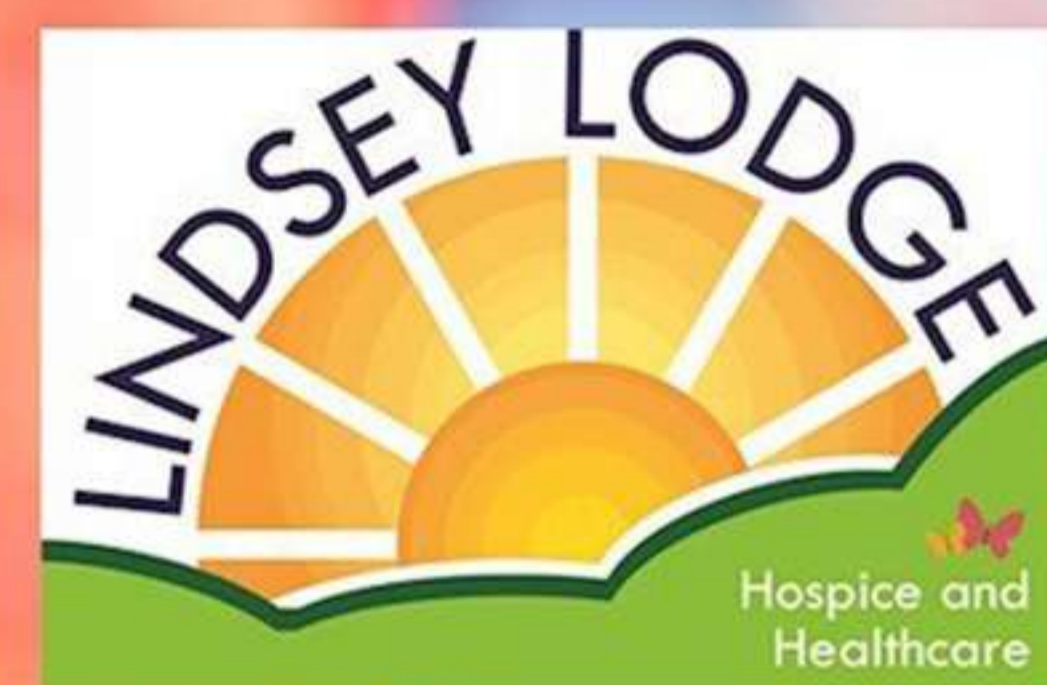
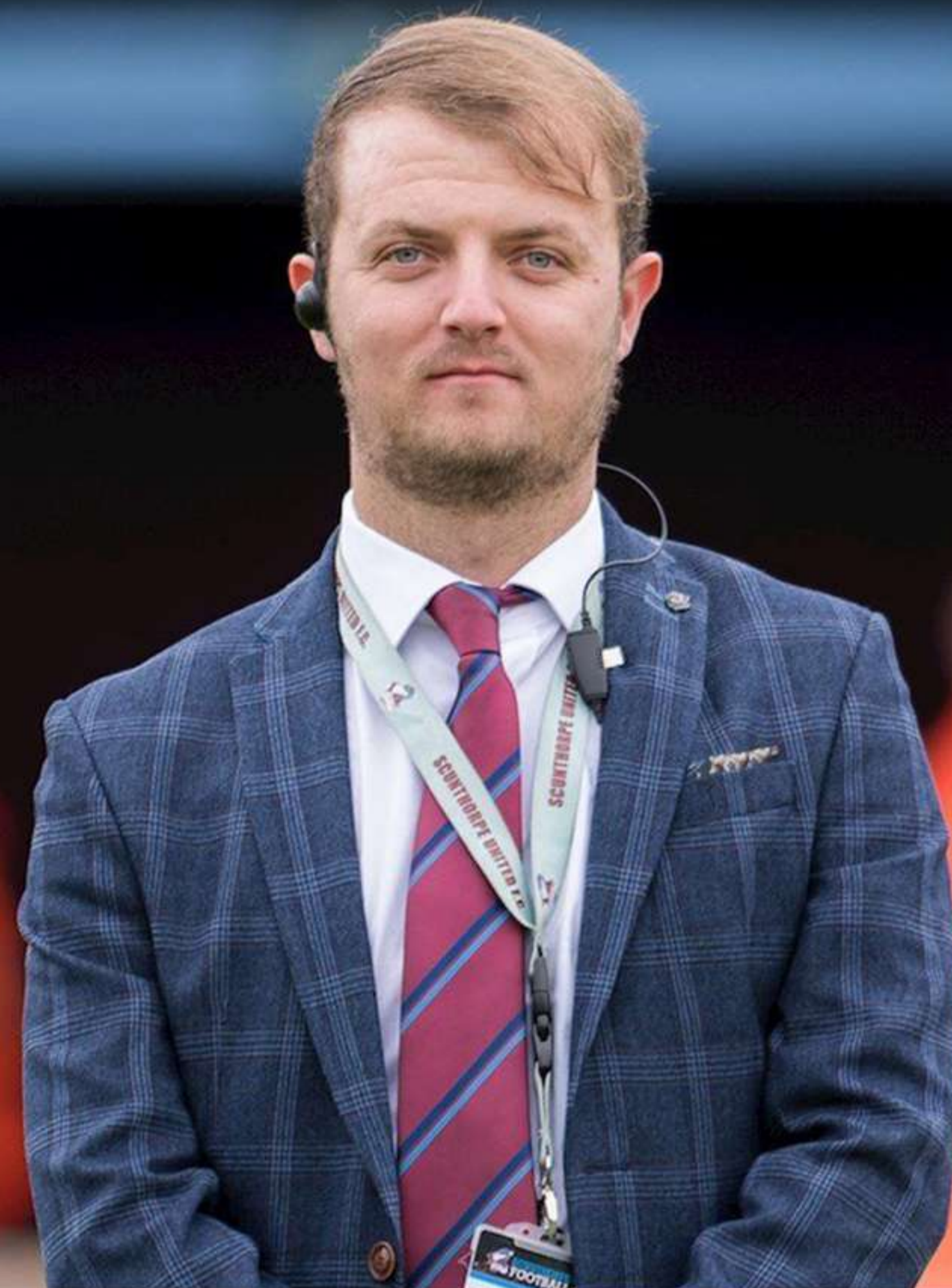

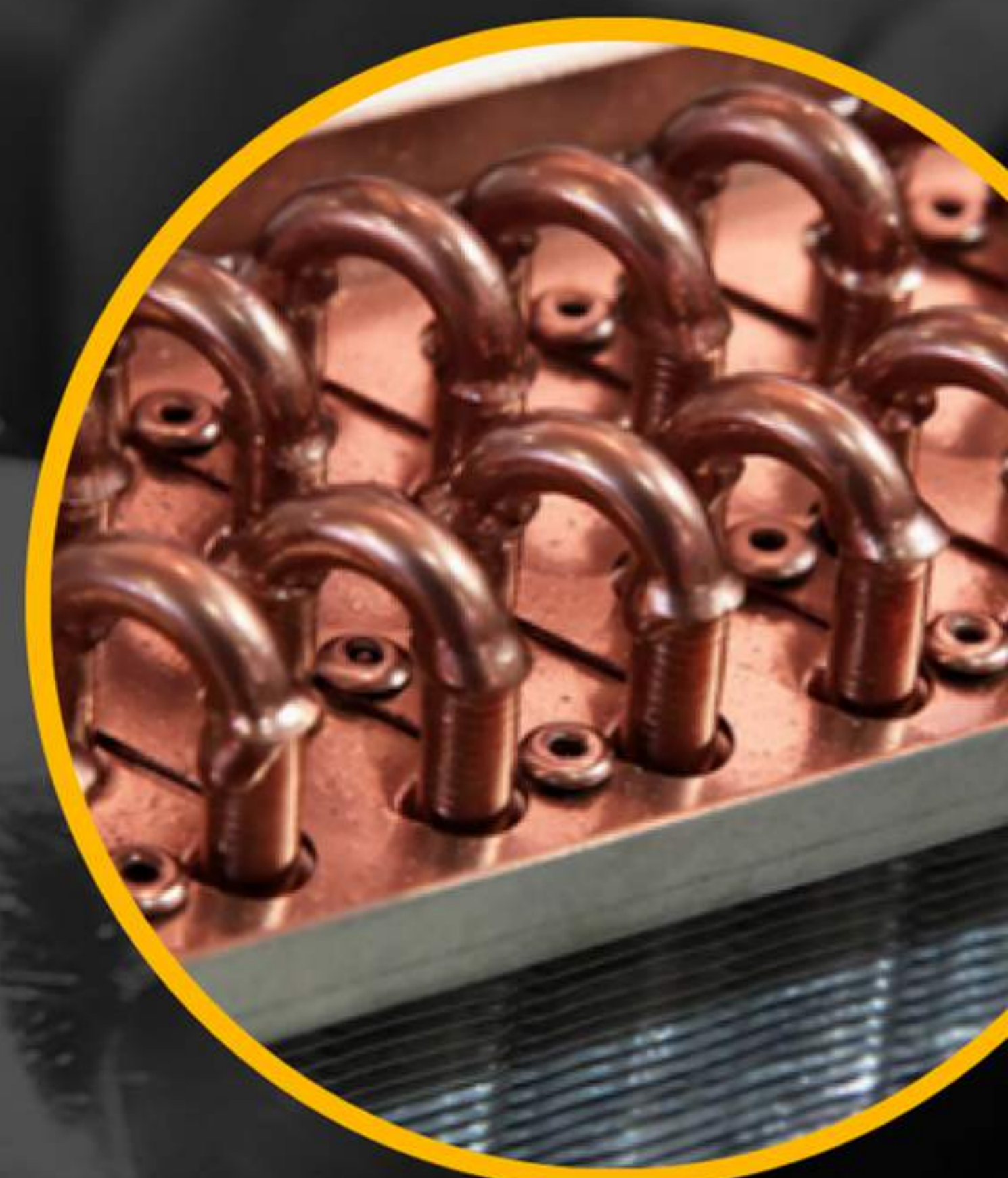

LOAN WATCH

We take a look at the players away from Glanford Park on loan, as they commence their season with their respective clubs (correct as August 25th)...

ROSS BARROWS

After re-joining Scunthorpe in the summer on a free transfer from National League side Altrincham, right-back Barrows was sent out on loan to Northern Premier League outfit Ilkeston Town.

Over the course of the month, he's made four appearances so far and has quickly become one of the first names on Robins manager Gary Haywards' teamsheet.

Barrows made his Ilkeston debut in the first game of the season as his side faced predicted strugglers Marske away from home. In this fixture, Barrows featured for the full 90 minutes and helped his side take a 3-1 win back to Derbyshire. He was selected in the starting XI again for the following Tuesday's 4-0 thumping of Gainsborough Trinity in which he played another full game.

But by far Barrows' best performance in a Robins' shirt came during Ilkeston's 6-1 demolition of Workington in which he picked up a goal and on top of that the man of the match award. This game was then followed by a disappointing 1-0 loss away to FC United of Manchester in which Barrows racked up another 90.

The side were set to face Bradford Park Avenue on Saturday.

JOSH ROBERTSON

First year professional Robertson has been gaining first team experience at NPL side Marske United and so far, has made four appearances for the Seasiders, featuring in every game.

Despite the team starting slowly, Robertson has been a bright light at Mount Pleasant by adding a much-needed creative spark. He made his debut playing against fellow Iron loanee Barrows' Ilkeston Town side in which he created a Marske penalty that resulted in the first goal in the encounter. His next appearance came soon after in which he was a standout performer in his sides 3-0 defeat at the hands of Worksop Town.

Marske's next result was a 3-1 loss to Ashton United in which Robertson featured and played a further 90 minutes.

He then played 70 minutes as Marske triumphed for the first time this campaign beating Bamber bridge 3-1, with the side set to face Radcliffe two days ago.

HARRISON POULTER

Robertson's fellow first year professional Harrison Pouter has also been loaned out to a Northern Premier League club in the form of Gainsborough Trinity.

Poulter has begun to prove his ability to

Iron Hall of Famer Neal Bishop who led the Holy Blues to the play-offs last campaign. So far Poulter has made four appearances, scoring once.

His debut came after coming on late as a substitute in their goalless draw with Marine on the opening game of the season, but Poulter has started in every game since including two difficult away fixtures against promotion hopefuls Ilkeston and Macclesfield which ended in heavy defeats.

After these two fixtures he opened his account for the Holy Blues during their 4-0 thrashing of Guisley at the Northolme.

MARCUS CARVER

After joining the Iron ahead of the 2022-23 season, striker Carver made 20 appearances in claret and blue last campaign and for this year was loaned out to fellow National League North side Southport in search of game time.

Game time is definitely what the former Accrington Stanley man has found as he has appeared three times for the Sandgrounders playing 90 minutes consistently. So far Carver is yet to score the struggling side, who are yet to obtain their first points. He has posed an attacking threat though, as he won a penalty in his sides 5-1 defeat away at Spennymoor.

HABIB MAKANJOUA

An U17 World Cup winner, he originally joined the Iron on a dual registration basis with Ilkeston Town, but that has instead been changed to that of Gainsborough where he has two appearances to date, voted man of the match in the 4-0 win over Guiseley after making his debut against Macclesfield.

STUTTERING START

AT YORK HAMPERED, DENTED BY DENABY

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

During the month of August, during 1923, the Old Show Ground was being spruced up by Charlie White and his volunteers. In the office, Harry Allcock had his quill at full speed, writing letters and answering the phone. There was a stream of directors popping their heads round the door, enquiring if all was ready for the coming season, scheduled to start on August 29th, 1923.

Before the Nuts were due to commence the season at the Fulford Ground of York City, a team of aspiring footballer had to be assembled, with a second eleven to do battle in the North Lindsey League. Each end of summer a pair of practice matches were arranged, with gate money duly presented to local charities. From the observations noted, quite often a player was taken to the office, and Harry Allcock would offer him a contract for the campaign in the claret and blue colours of the Natty Nuts.

At the appointed kick-off time of three o'clock, the Scunthorpe team marched manfully out of the dressing rooms, to the roar of a couple of hundred away supporters, who had made their way by the LNER to the cathedral city. The chosen eleven was noted as: Reynolds, goalkeeper, Bradbury and Hargreaves, full backs; Hill, Forbes and Crooks, midfield; Meredith, Kitchen, Burkinshaw, Raby and Foster, forwards. Straight up on the watch, the referee in black blazer blew a shrill note on his whistle, and the season was underway.

Reports suggested that there was some vigorous play by both sides, and it was the City men whose purpose was greater in the first

half. They were assisted by a noticeable breeze, and did most of the pressing, but were kept in check by Hargreaves, Bradbury and Forbes. Reynolds in goal was sound in his handling, and at the interval no goal was registered. However, the second half saw a turning of the tables, and it was Scunthorpe's turn to show some clever feet. Hill and Cooks gave good assistance, allowing Burkinshaw some chances. At the same time, the York back player performed superbly to cover their custodian. Newspaper observers paid tribute to the Joe Kitchen as an outstanding performer, and that right back Bradbury dealt quickly to break up any York attacking threats on the Scunthorpe goal.

Time was passing on the referee's watch, and the stalemate was not broken. Indeed a goalless draw was the final score. On reflection, this was not the best of games, but nor had it been without incident. Those making their way to the exits agreed on both sides of the fence that a fair score was the draw, and it was worth the entrance fee.

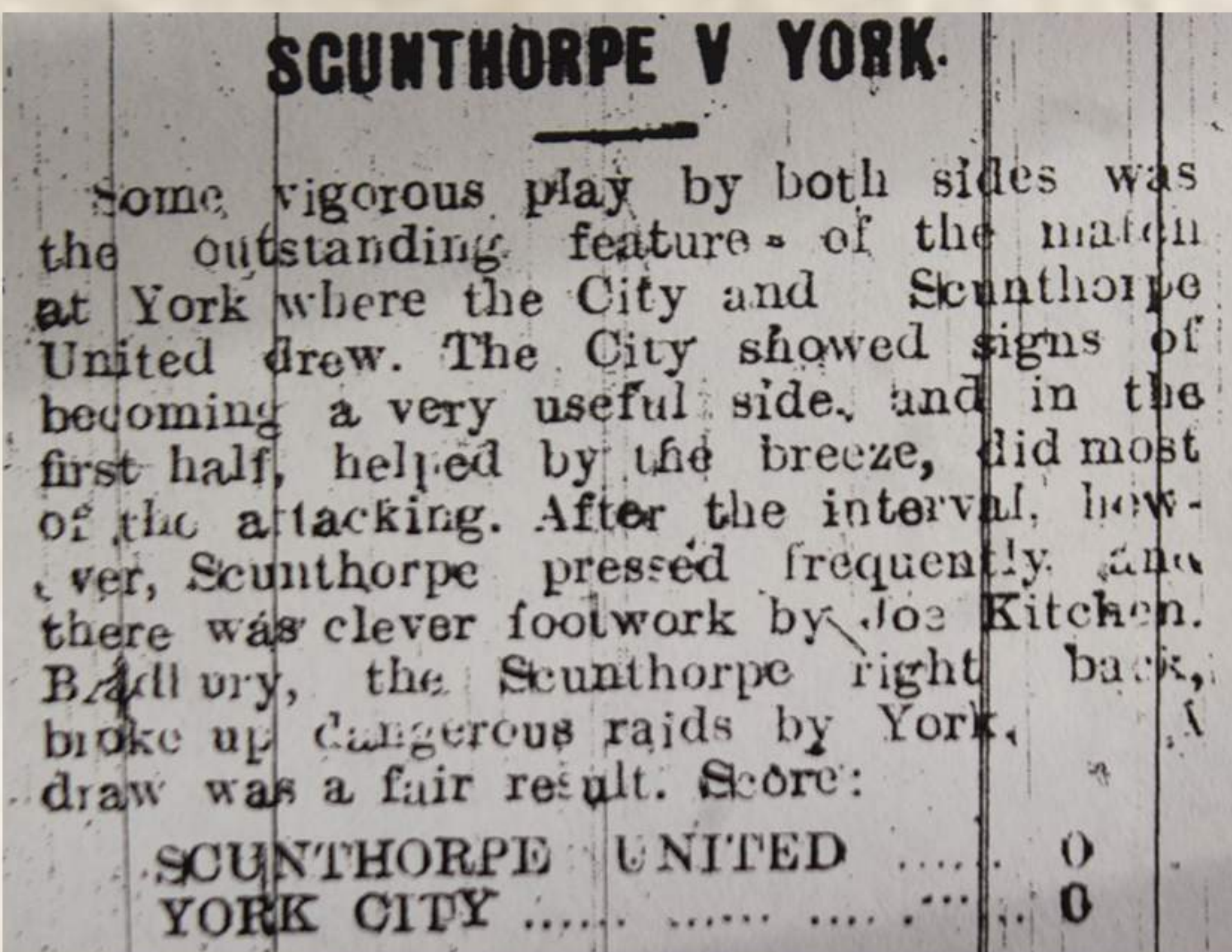

On September 1st, 1923, Scunthorpe United opened the Old Show Ground gates for the first Midland League home game. Denaby from Yorkshire coal mine territory were the visitors, and for this meeting, the directors decided upon an unchanged eleven. However the game that ensued was not what the Scunthorpe crowd had hoped for. Denaby played a physical game, and Scunthorpe's player were not happy. They tried to match this with tougher tactics of their own, and in the end the move was to prove a downfall. It was said that at one stage Joe Kitchen, who was a towering man, almost came to blows with Denaby defender, Kennedy. The three and a half thousand Scunthorpe supporters vented their feelings when Haslam deliberately kicked the ball over the heads of spectators, and was made to fetch the ball back, by the referee.

The meaningful part of this encounter began superbly for the Nuts, and was a move started by Kitchen, after which Meredith

crossed an accurate ball to Burkinshaw, who headed smartly into the net. The Old Show Ground crowd cheered with delight, but the mood became more sombre when Forbes was judged to have handled, and Shaw converted the spot kick for the miners.

In the second half, the Scunthorpe attack failed to produce a winner, and were distracted by the Denaby play-acting. Worse was to come on seventy five minutes, because Scrivens game the visitors the lead, and the Denaby team refused entry anywhere near their own target. Reports suggested that neither side deserved the spoils, but for the

Nuts it was two points lost, which should have been bagged. They would have to wait until the next Saturday, and see if a visit to Gainsborough would bring better luck. Everyone agreed, it was a stuttering start.

We look a bit deeper on Scarborough Athletic's history and how they were formed as a phoenix club following their off-field troubles...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Scarborough Athletic Football Club was formed on 25th June 2007 following the liquidation of Scarborough FC. The new club was set up by the Seadog Trust, a group of supporters who originally started the trust with the aim of gaining fan representation on the board of Scarborough FC.

However, as a result of the old club's liquidation, the Seadog Trust moved quickly to ensure a football team continued to represent the town at the highest level possible. On 25th June 2007, Scarborough Athletic were accepted into the NCEL Division One for the 2007-08 season, and an agreement was reached for the club to use Bridlington's Queensgate Stadium as part of a ground share with no suitable stadium able to be used in Scarborough.

The first game kicked off with a match against local side Edgehill at Hunmanby's Sands Lane Ground that finished 0-0, before embarking on a friendly at Northallerton Town. The match finished 2-2, with Shaun Chadburn taking the honour of the club's first

ever goal.

The team's first ever league match came in the NCEL Division One at Teversal on August 11th, 2007. Boro' fans marked the occasion by dressing up in suits to show their status of Joint Owners of the club through their membership of the Seadog Trust. Dave Thompson entered himself into the history books as he netted the club's first competitive goal, but a last minute winner saw Teversal claim a 2-1 win.

Following their first promotion a couple of seasons prior, the 2012-13 season would certainly live long in the memory of many Boro' fans as they finally clinched the NCEL title and promotion to the EVO-STIK Northern League. Aided by new additions Peter Davidson, Andy Milne, Jimmy Beadle and Paddy Miller, the club enjoyed a terrific season suffering only two defeats all season.

The club's first season back home was a successful one, achieving promotion to the Evo-Stik Premier Division after finishing second to South Shields in Evo-Stik North during 2017-18.

The 2018-19 was the club's first

season in the Northern Premier League Premier Division. In 2021-22, the side finished in third place, beating Matlock Town and Warrington Town in the play-offs to reach the National League North, fifteen years since Scarborough FC were relegated from the division.

Their return to the division was largely successful, as they managed an eighth-placed finish, narrowly missing out on the play-offs.

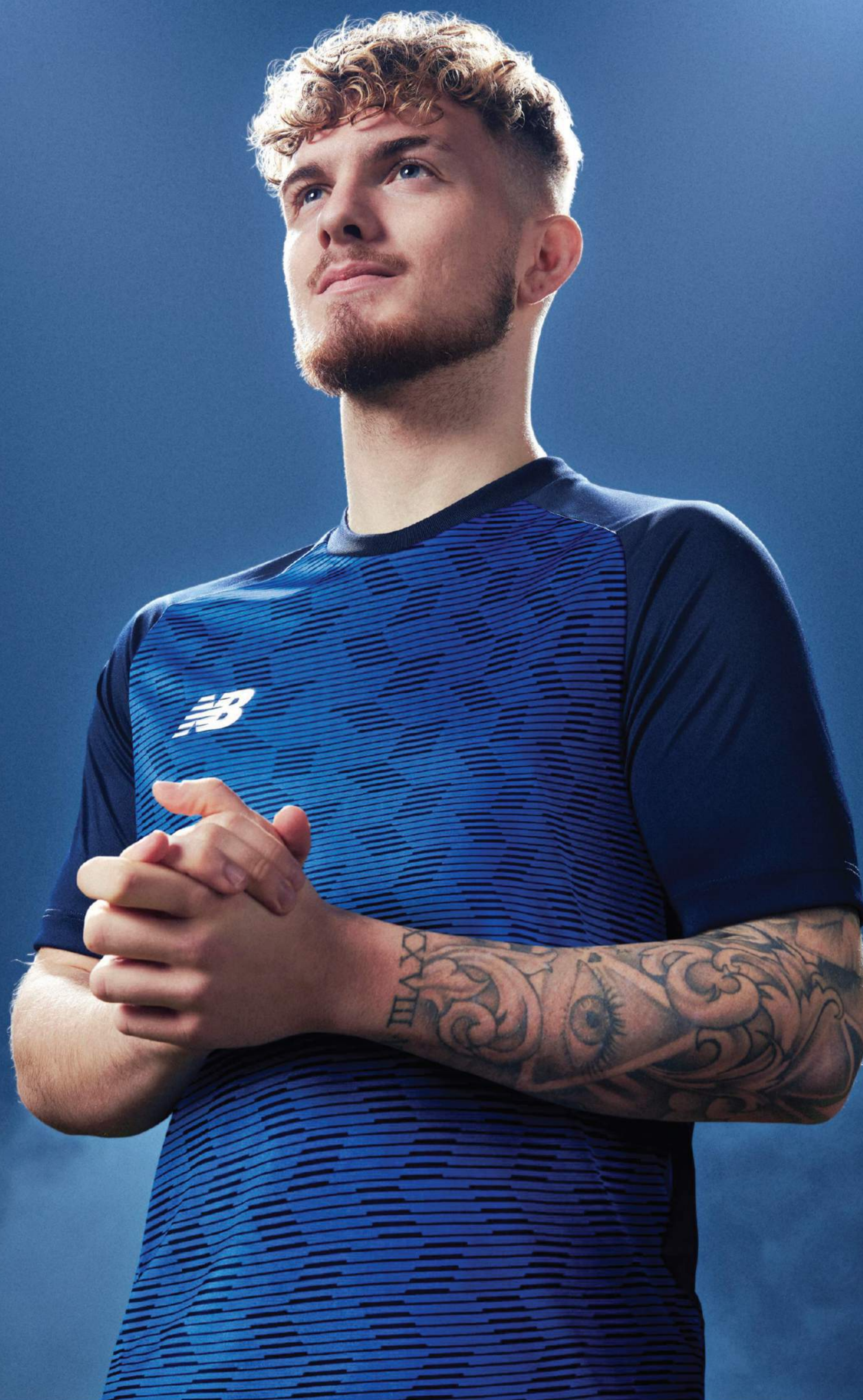

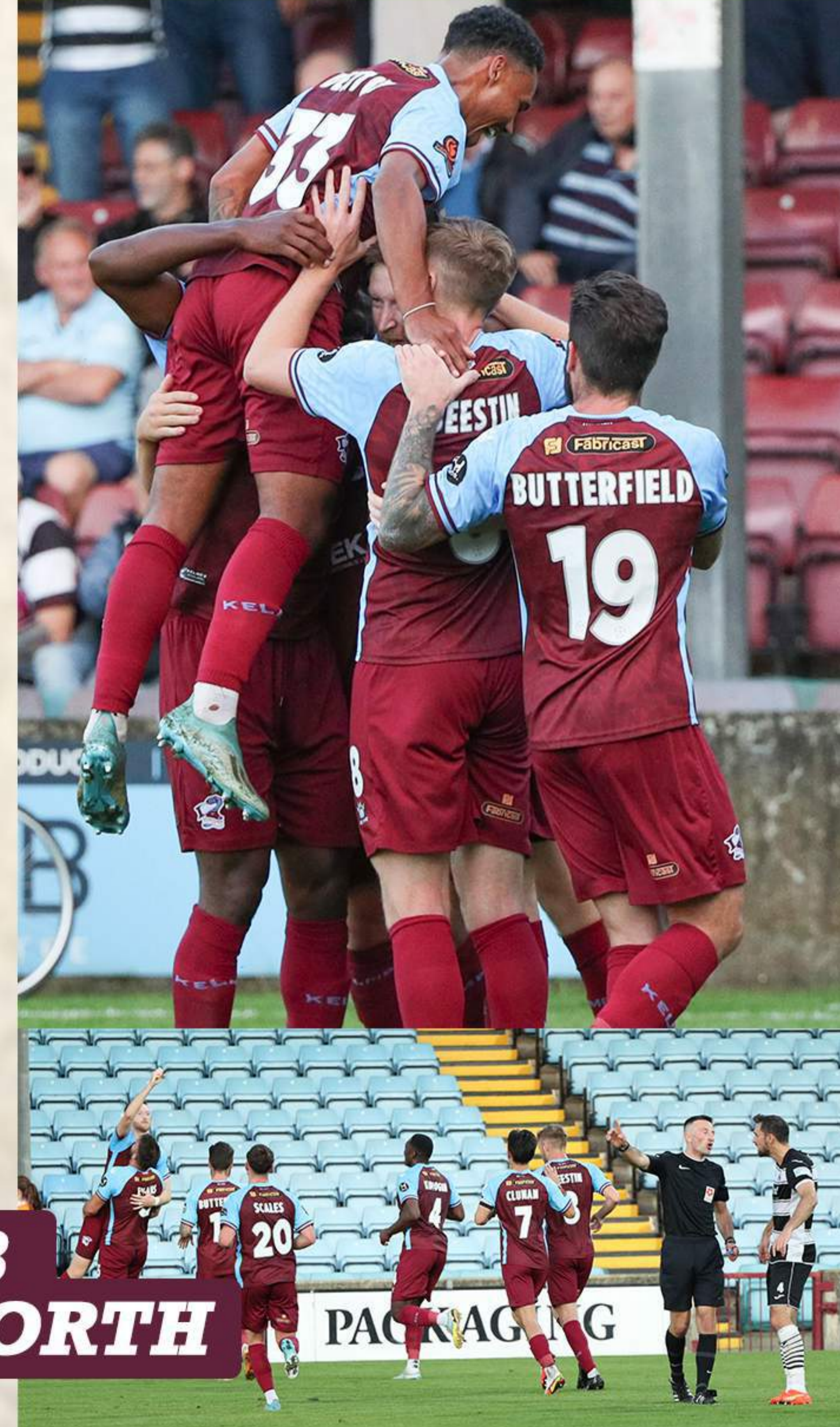

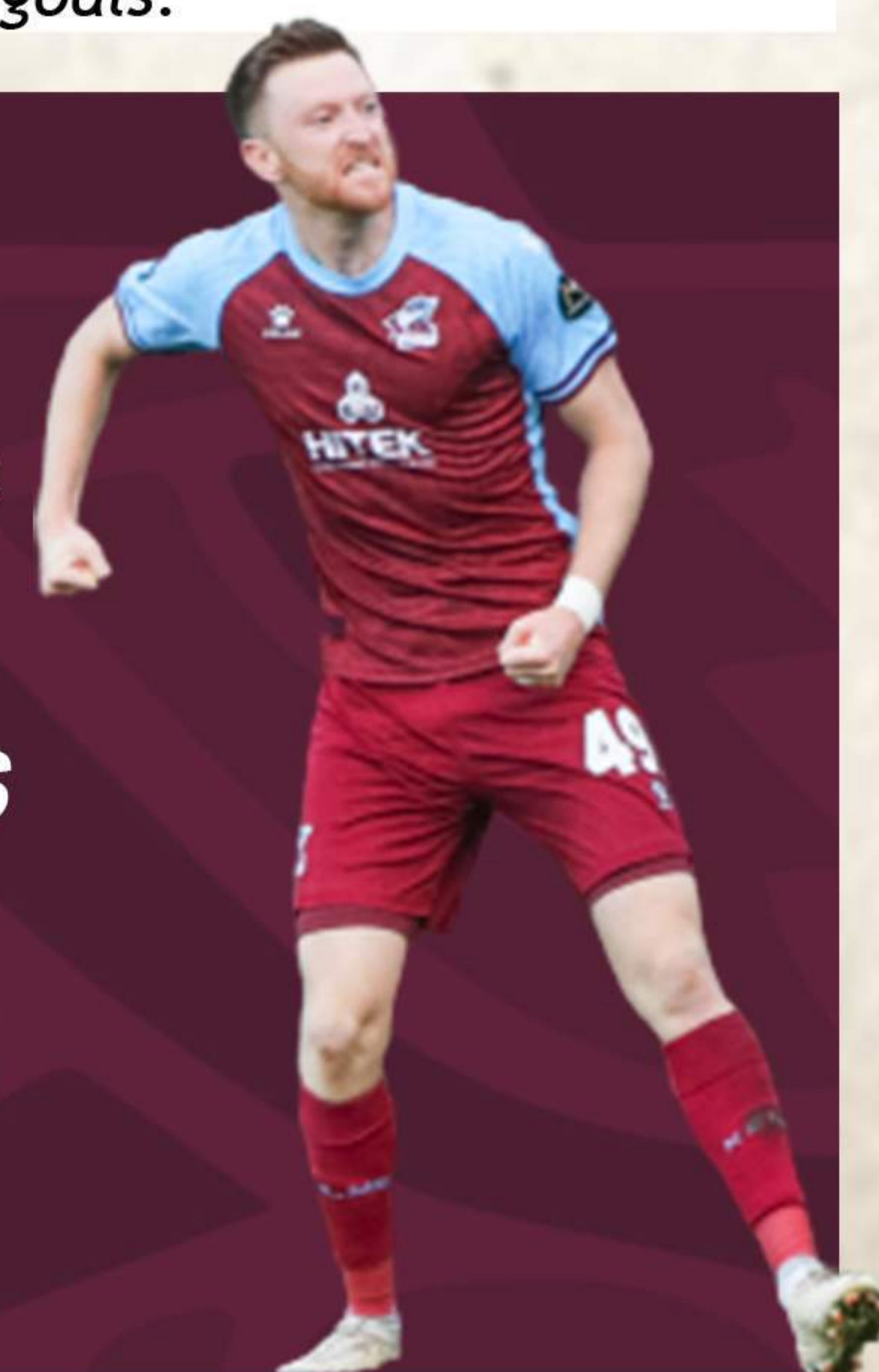

ON THE ROAD ALFRETON TOWN

SATURDAY. AUGUST 26TH - 3PM

Following this Bank Holiday weekend, the Iron are back on the road as we look ahead to our fixture against Alfreton Town next weekend.

The side finished 5th out of 24 in the National League North last season and narrowly missed out on promotion after losing 1-0 to eventual play-off winners Kidderminster Harriers. This season the Reds have started strongly picking up nine points from their opening four games of the campaign, registering wins against Tamworth, Peterborough Sports and Southport, respectively.

THE STADIUM

Alfreton play at the North Street Ground, otherwise known as the Impact Arena, where they have been located since they were founded in 1959. The ground has a capacity of 3,600 (1500 seated).

The stadium was also used as a rugby league ground for the Mansfield Marksman from 1986 until 1988. Since the 2000-01 season, the Central Midlands League Cup Final has taken place here.

The Iron have been allocated 2,000 tickets for this fixture which contains a mixture of seating and standing.

BY CAR

61 miles from Glanford Park, it will take around an hour and 20 minutes to journey to from the Iron's stadium.

> Take Doncaster Road/A18 to A1077

> Take M180, M18 and M1 to A38 In South Normanton. Take exit 28 from M1.

> At Pinxton interchange take the 3rd exit onto the A38.

> Take the exit towards Alfreton/Somercotes/B600.

> Turn right onto Nottingham Rd/B600.

> Turn left onto North Street.

> Turn right onto Bentley Close.

CAR PARKING

There is a small car park at the ground but there is otherwise plenty of street parking in the surrounding areas.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

Alfreton Railway Station is located just under three-quarters of a mile away from the ground and is about a 15 minute walk, mainly uphill to the ground.

Come out of the station entrance and at the main road turn right into Mansfield Road. Cross the road to the other side and take the second left into Prospect Street.

At the bottom of this road turn right into Nottingham Road, then take the first left into North Street and the ground is down on the right.

FACILITIES

Away fans are mostly housed in the mostly open 'Tin End' terrace at one end of the ground. This end can accommodate around 1,200 supporters.

In addition, a small amount of seats are also made available in the covered seating area on one side of the pitch.

At the back of the open terrace there is a small, covered area, which can provide some shelter.

SOUTH SHIELDS

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5TH, 2023 - 7.45PM KICK-OFF

The Iron welcome newly promoted side South Shields to Glanford Park for what will be the fourth home game of the campaign.

This will be the first time the reigning Northern Premier League Champions make the two-hour drive to North Lincolnshire, with the only other previous encounter between the two sides ending in a 1-0 win for South Shields at the First Cloud Arena, in the Fourth Qualifying Round of the FA Cup during the 2022-23 campaign.

After getting promoted last season, the Mariners have had mixed results to begin their first campaign in the National League North since 1974. After comfortably dispatching promotion hopefuls Alfreton Town 3-1 on the opening day, they have managed to acquire seven points from their first four games.

They beat today's opponents Scarborough Athletic 1-0 nine days ago thanks to an outrageous long range effort from Tom Broadbent, which will surely be an early contender for goal of the season.

At the weekend they hosted Gloucester City, surging to a resounding 3-0 victory through goals from Paul Blackett, Aaron Martin and Jedrael Abbey. At the time of writing, Shields have the same number of points at the Iron and are in third place.

South Shields unintentionally combines both the Iron and Grimsby Town in wearing claret and blue as their home strip, but with their nickname being the Mariners, they have ties to both sides.
