


Another 855 were at Alfreton on Saturday, outnumbering the home crowd again. Your support levels are greater than a number of EFL clubs, and you help us over the line.

of being evicted from Glanford Park.

We achieved a positive outcome on the day. While the immediate prospect of eviction has been halted, there were no winners or losers.

The club remains in the ground until next year when a three-day hearing will be listed. We will use the time to continue negotiations and hopefully achieve a settlement that works for all parties.

Legal action has never been our preferred option and we hope this can be resolved without further hearings.

Ironically, it is this evening's visitors to Glanford Park who the Iron faced in last season's competition, with South Shields running out as giant killers following their 1-0 home win. The side were on their way to winning the Northern Premier League at the time, while United were struggling at the bottom of the National League.

A full-time outfit, it was Kevin Phillips' side who edged the tie, with Scunthorpe this season hoping to make real progress in the competition, entering with three qualifying stages remaining prior to the actual competition commencing.



FOCUS ON... DANNY ELLIOTT

We continued our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to forward Danny Elliott after netting his first goal of the season last Monday...





Having began the season as the starting striker, with Danny Whitehall on the bench, roles were quickly reversed in the following game, with Danny Elliott settling for a place on the bench.

With Whitehall then netting the winner in the opening game as his replacement at Tamworth, he would be given the nod going forward, taking his tally to four goals in the opening four games. Elliott was reduced to just substitute appearances at that point, and the question was whether it would be Danny or Danny throughout the season... until last week. While it looked for a split second as though Fin Shrimpton fancied himself, it was the Iron midfielder who grasped hold of the ball, placed the ball on the spot and then stepped away for Elliott to role home his first of the campaign.

Relief, or a weight off his shoulders, confidence ran through his veins quickly, resulting in an Iron fourth, which is sure to be stripped away from the former Boreham Wood frontman, as it goes down as an own goal. First asked about that second strike, he said: "I've watched it from the side angle in slow motion, and I think it was spinning in. Technically, if it's going in, it's my goal. it. I think the goals had been coming for a while. I was a bit frustrated, but I had to keep positive. The team was doing really well, and Dan (Whitehall) had got his goals and I found myself out of the team. I'd come on into games and hit the post a couple of times, so it was more relief to be honest."

The images, including the one on page five, and of the somersault, could prove to be iconic and memorable moments if the campaign turns into a successful one for the club. Feeling the emotion of Elliott on the wall celebrating his goal, with the emotions of the Britcon Stand behind is one that will remain there for all to see.



"I felt it at the time. You feel the togetherness when we are playing here. The boys are all pushing in the same direction. There's a really good feeling around the place at the minute and you get an EFL feel to the games, with the excitement, the noise and the atmosphere."

The start of the season resulted in the team line-up being either Elliott or Danny Whitehall, with the former given the nod to start on the opening day. With the Iron drawing, the substitution was made and it was Whitehall who ended up with the matchwinner. That meant that Elliott was on the sidelines going forward, and with the former Eastleigh man continuing his streak in front of goal, it's the former Boreham Wood forward who has had to bide his time. "I've always said to myself, and publicly, that my best position is a number nine, but I'm more than happy to play a slightly different role. I have qualities that can lend to coming in from out wide. We're in a team that keeps a lot of the ball, and that allows me to not necessarily be pinned out wide."

Elliott came in last season and experienced the lows that came with being involved in relegation to the National League North. Now part of a team that's made a successful start, he described the differences at the club from only a few months ago. "It's like night and day. It was very, very tough coming in last season with the problems that were here - more problems than I thought there were in terms of it being a much bigger task than I thought it was. We



Scunthorpe United had finished the 1922-23 season in a respectable sixth position in the Midland League table, and **Directors, supporters and** players were all aiming to improve on this placing on the ladder. Although it was early days, the first two matches in the division had seen the Nuts play as though there was a cog missing from the gears. It was thought that with a new part, a drop of oil, and a fitter to adjust the machine, the team should be functioning in a fashion to seize its first win.

It took only five minutes for them to raise their voices in salute of a visiting goal. Meredith, from the right side of the park was the architect, steadying himself for control, and dropping a ball down the throat of the Trinity keeper. As the custodian attempted to clear, White rushed in to make a simple tap into the net, and score on his debut. The lead last until the 20th minute, and when the Nuts defence failed to clear the ball, Bennett seized upon it, and sent in a centre onto the head of Copley for a nicely worked goal.





A BRIEF HISTORY

It has now been over 130 years since the first recorded appearance of a named South Shields Football Club.

A team from the town began playing friendly matches in 1888, and from those early times, the town club has been subject to much fortune and misfortune. only four games were lost.

Shields were champions of the league for 1915-16, and in 1919, the years of effort behind the drive for the Football League came to fruition with its election to the Second Division, or the second league as it was then titled. this stage. As part of the club's bid to become increasingly community-owned, a share scheme was launched in October 2020 which went on to raise almost £380,000 as 1,000 people invested to become shareholders.

The playing squad also completed its transition to a full-time training model in the summer of 2021 losing in the play-offs before being promoted as Champions last season.

The club, in all of its incarnations, has had many twists and turns, and is now more than seven years into another exciting new era.

South Shields Athletic AFC was a member of the Northern Alliance League, and enjoyed moderate success in its short career of five years before being disbanded in 1902 due to financial problems. The club was relegated to the Third Division North before, facing impending bankruptcy, the only viable alternative from closure was to move, and this regrettable point was reached in 1930. Despite a final league table position of seventh, the club left the town and moved to Gateshead.

A new club was eventually established, and won the 1938-39 North Eastern League championship.

This team was known as South Shields Adelaide Athletic, and after much success, it re-organised two years later as a limited company in 1910, and now changed its official title to that of South Shields Football Club.

Numerous records were made and smashed, plus two consecutive North Eastern League championship titles won, in which In 1974, the club went to Gateshead for the second time in 44 years, re-emerged as Gateshead United and took the place of South Shields in the Northern Premier League, and the rest is history. A new club, the South Shields Mariners FC, was born, and started with nothing.

The encounter this evening is South Shields' fourth away game of the campaign as they look for their first three points on the road, with the team holding a 100% home record so far.



Following back-to-back home games this week, the Iron will have the FA Cup on Saturday, September 16th, but will return to league action and travel to Chorley on Saturday, September 23rd. and Darwen.

At the time of writing, ticket news for the encounter had yet to be confirmed.
