First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...

FOCUS ON... MAXKOUOGUN

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to Max Kouogun, who returned to the side at the weekend following injury...



Another player who returns to the side this week is the Iron's number four, Max Kouogun. After an extended stint on the sidelines, recovering from an injury sustained at Chorley, he's now looking to stake a claim for the starting jersey once more, and is aiming to capitalise on Will Evans' suspension this evening.

The Irishman was brought into the team on Saturday in place of Andrew Boyce, primarily in anticipation for the loss of Evans this evening, as he serves a one-match ban for accumulating five yellow cards just two games shy of the amnesty. For Kouogun, the 90 minutes at the weekend, coupled with his likely nod this evening, gives him the chance not only to regain his match fitness, but to take the starting XI space that he began the campaign with. Speaking to the former York City defender going into the encounter with the Sandgrounders, he said: "It was really good to be back out there. It's been a long six or seven weeks for myself personally, with the injury. It was good to be back, and to participate at the weekend. I felt really good, and I was really happy with it.

"It was very frustrating. It happened at Chorley away and was a bit of a freak accident really. I ended up hurting my MCL. Over the past couple of weeks, I've been working really hard to make sure that I've come back fit and ready to help

the team, and that's what I'm ready to do from here on out. Hopefully, I'll stay fit, and I'll keep building momentum.

"Throughout the team, in every position, there's competition for places, and when you have that shirt, it's your responsibility to go and keep it. When you're in the eleven, when you're on the bench, when you're in the squad, you have to fight for your position and try to keep your shirt. Everyone is of that mindset, and that will only help as a collective to push the group on."

The competition for places doesn't need magnifying more than the three central defensive spaces. At first, it was Andrew Boyce who was forced to bide his time on the sidelines at the start of the season as Kouogun and Evans got the nod from Jimmy Dean. Since the injury, Boyce has more than taken his chance. Now, with Kouogun returning from injury and being given his chance on Saturday, he's aiming to consolidate his shirt and give the gaffer a headache going into the weekend's game.

"You can only look at the next game, and take it one game at a time and try to perform as best as you can. That should be the mindset regardless of whether there are one, two or no one there to replace you. Once you cross that white line, you have to give 100 per cent."

Prior to getting injured, it was an Evans-Kouogun combination in the heart of the Iron defence, which was yielding a strong backline. He Irishman outlined his thoughts on the games he played prior to being sidelined.

"I think myself and Will were building a good relationship. Obviously, we had some good results prior to my injury. There was a bit of turbulence at the football club at the time, which affected some performances and results as a collective. That's all behind us now, we're just looking forward to building our momentum, and really trying to push on and challenge for the league.

"For any footballer, all you want to focus on is the football. You want to come into training and go into games knowing that all of the background noise is as minimal as possible. Obviously, it was unsettling at the time, but we had to try to be as professional as possible, and to try and do the job that we are here to do. We tried to stick at it, and by the grace of God, we are now moving in the right direction as a football club.

"When you're out on the sidelines, you have a bit more time to read up on articles that are being published. For your own mental health, you

MIDLAND LEAGUE DUTIES STILL IN THE FA CUP A SCRAP WITH A TIGER AND A TIE WITH ROTHERHAM

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

The superb run experienced by Scunthorpe United during the autumn of 1923, during the 1923-24 season, was truly remarkable.

In the Midland League, they had managed a run of five matches unbeaten, even though they had home advantage in each case. In this sequence, they had twice taken points from the, then, league leaders. The first of these was a spirited goalless draw, against Notts County, and the next against Grimsby Town Reserves, who went back to Blundell Park with their rowing boat hit by a 3-0 torpedo.


In the meantime, the club had made some determined progress in the FA Cup, and home victories had beaten Grimsby Rovers, Cleethorpes Town, Gainsborough Trinity and Boston. Only last week, a century ago, it was Rotherham Town's turn to be turfed out of the competition, although they put up some stern resistance. It was only following a replay, away at the Clifton Ground, Rotherham, that Scunthorpe made the safe passage, thanks to Joe Kitchen netting the single goal of the match.

If there was a worry for supporters, it was that Kitchen was the only player functioning in the forward line, and without his presence the Nuts were not so strong. For the time being, they need to worry not, but concentrate on facing Rotherham County in the Fifth Qualifying Round, a week on Saturday. At least a headache of extra Cup games was putting much needed brass into the coffers, and a rubbing of the hands in anticipation of what further glory might be in the offing.

Scunthorpe United showed no signs of heavy legs after the extra exertions of the previous Thursday, and played particularly well during the first period, without scoring. The Hull City team contained two players who had been colleagues of Joe Kitchen, and they made sure he was shackled from scoring. The rest of the front line posed less of a threat.

However, it was the Nuts who took the lead, fifteen minutes into the second half. A corner was taken by Foster, and Wilson headed clean through, and into the net. At that time it looked as though the Tiger Cubs were suffering, especially when they lost their left back to injury. Instead they played up with greater vigour, and equalised five minutes later. Then, as a drawn result seemed certain, City's second eleven snatched the winner with only six minutes left. The Tiger Cubs were the first team to score against the Nuts in eight previous matches.

Scunthorpe United now looked to Saturday and the prospects of the FA Cup tie with Rotherham County from Division Three North. Ticket sales were brisk, and at kick-off the attendance was recorded at 4,152.

SCUNTHORPE BOTHERHAM COUNTY.

In the cup tie at Sounthorpe on Saturday, there were 4,152 spectators present, the gate receipts amounting to £164. The slippert ground, consequent upon the frost and rains of the previous few days, handicapped the players' movements greatly. seunthorpe had only ten men for practic-

United brought back Lawton for Shearsmith and Burkinshaw for Raby. At the appointed kick-off time, conditions on the Old Show Ground were far from ideal for neat football, being slippery from a combination of frost and heavy rain over the last 24 hours.

During the first half, Scunthorpe United had the better of the exchanges, and scored five

minutes from the interval. Ernie Millson initiated the move from the left side of the park, and pushed a ball into the path of Joe Kitchen. The Nuts inside left took control, slipped past the County right back, and unleashed a shot, into the corner of the net. Although Rotherham

thought they had replied, a linesman's flag tempered their celebrations, so much so that travelling supporters booed venomously at the referee. The game soon entered the second half, and another refereeing decision was to anger the home supporters, and possibly influence the result. Hargreaves fouled a Rotherham player outside the penalty box, as reported at the time, a straight forward foul without malice, but

to the disbelief of the Scunthorpe crowd, Hargreaves was ordered off the field. It meant that the under pressure ten Nuts played the ball out of the field, or tried the offside tactic. Just as time was slipping away, Rotherham County equalised, through a 'melee', in which Reynold grabbed the ball by the goal line, but the referee was satisfied that the whole of it had crossed for a valid point. The match finished 1-1, and the following Thursday the replay took place on the Millmoor ground at Rotherham.

For the replay, changes to the Scunthorpe team were necessary, but evidence of the ninety minutes play have not been unearth in the local journals. It is known that Frank Skull was moved to inside right, but the replacement for his former position is unknown. Scunthorpe United lost the game 2-0, as Chambers and Williams scored for County. It had been a memorable run in the competition.





We take a look at this evening's opponents, first starting with their brief history of how they got to where they are today...



A BRIEF HISTORY

The original Southport Football Club began as a rugby team in the 1870s.

Reforming in 1881 after the original club had ceased to function a year earlier, the new club played only three games of the 1881-82 season before switching to association football under the guidance of former Welsh international Thomas Burnett. On Saturday 12th November 1881 Southport took to the field against Bootle "second" in their first match under Association Rules.

The original association club merged with Southport Wanderers in the summer of 1886, and in 1888 a new professional football club, Southport Central, was formed.

Southport Central became founder members of the Central League in 1911 and in 1918 were taken over by the Vulcan Motor Company – playing as Southport Vulcan for one season, the first club to use a sponsorship label as part of their name, before reverting back to the original name of Southport Football Club.

Southport, under Secretary Edwin Clayton, joined the Football League in 1921 upon the establishment of the Third Division North, and were captained by Jimmy Fay, one of the founding members of what is now the Professional Footballers Association. In 1929 he became secretary and treasurer of the PFA and held post until 1959.

In the FA Cup Southport became the first Third Division North club to reach the sixth round in 1931, losing away from home against the mighty Everton 9-1. A season later a Haig Avenue record gate of 20,010 saw the Sandgrounders draw in the 4th round with Newcastle. Southport reached the 5th round in 1965 after defeating Cardiff City before losing to Hull City.

Southport had two promotions as a Football League side, in 1966-67 under Billy Bingham and as Champions in 1972-73 under Jimmy Meadows. Sadly, the second promotion lasted just one season with the club relegated and the slide into non-league football gathered pace. Twenty Third in 1975-76, 1976-77 and 1977-78 saw the club having to apply for re-election.

Disastrously Chairman Walter Giller failed to canvass and on a second ballot at the Café Royal on June 2nd Southport lost their league status. Southport's fifty years in the Football League was over. Their last home Football League match was against Huddersfield Town on April 22nd drawing 1-1 while their last ever Football League match was away to Graham Taylor's Watford, losing 3-2 in front of 10,089 supporters as Watford's rise up the leagues began and it was third time unlucky when Wigan Athletic took the Sandgrounders place in the Football League.

Since then, they have been members of the NPL (1978-1993), the Conference (1993-2003) and then the NPL Premier Division (2003-04). Since then, they've played in the National League North or National League.

In October 2023, the Big Help Group became the majority shareholder.

Jordan, who was previously on loan at the club in 2019 re-joined on a deal originally until May 2022 but extended until May 2024.

During his first stint at Southport, he scored on his debut, and has since gone on to be the latest member of the Southport Football Club 20 goal club with a total of 47 goals in all competitions, 34 in the league as at the end of the 2022-23 season

A strong striker with an eye for goal, he joined Southport from Boston United having made the switch to join the Pilgrims in the summer.

Starting his career with Chasetown, Jordan progressed up the football pyramid to play in the EFL for Bury and Port Vale. He has also spent time with Maidenhead United, Chester and Stockport County.

6. Declan Evans

A product of the youth academy at Rochdale, Declan joined Mossley from Chorley in 2017 and was a regular at Mossley making over 100 appearances. He made 27 starts in 2022-23 in a season blighted by injury.

7. Niall Watson

Niall is no stranger to Southport
Football having been coming to the
ground as a 4 year old as a
Southport supporter following his
Dad's team. He finished the
2022-23 as leading scorer in all
competitions with 17 goals including
5 in one County Cup game, the first

8. David Morgan

David returns to the club after being released by Accrington Stanley at the end of the 2022-23 season. He took on a player coach role that will also involve working alongside the existing Academy coaches.

11. Tyler Walton

A roaming midfielder, he joined in January 2022 initially on loan from Farsley Celtic, but such was his impressive form the loan was quickly made into a permanent move. His former clubs include Leeds United and Manchester City at youth level and York City for whom he debuted at 17 years of age.

20. Luke Burgess

Luke became manager Jim
Bentley's first permanent signing in
mid October. The midfielder who
has previous experience with Wigan
and Salford spent the 2022-23
season at Oldham before a loan
spell at Altrincham and more
recently he has been with Ashton
United. Likes to get amongst the
goals and is a player who will excite
the Southport fans.

12. Connor Heath

Connor is a big powerful forward who had been with Nantwich since the summer of 2020 after being released from Crewe Alexandra, where he impressed during his two-year scholarship period with a number of goals; he signed a professional contract in the summer of 2019.

Brad signed a professional contract with Blackpool in the summer of 2021 and is a striker with big potential.

Good at beating the offside trap and creating chances for himself to go on and score, Holmes made his first league start for Blackpool in May 2021 in a victory over Bristol Rovers.

He spent the first part of the 2021-22 season on loan at FC United of Manchester, where he impressed, before signing a further loan at National League North side Chorley. He was at AFC Fylde last season.

SATURDAY. DECEMBER ZND -

The Iron are next on the road at the start of December, making the second longest trip of the season.

The fixture against Bulls will be the first between the sides in Hereford's new form, and will be Scunthorpe's first trip to Edgar Street since September 2008.

THE STADIUM

They don't make them like Edgar Street anymore!

From the large chunky floodlights to the semi-circular terraces, the ground is certainly 'old school.' But it is a proper old-fashioned football ground that is both unique and memorable.

Since the Club's formation as a fan-owned club in 2015 (following the demise of Hereford United), a lot of effort has been put into bringing the facilities up to scratch and to brighten up the look of the ground.

Segregation is normally in force for most games at Edgar Street. Away fans are housed on one

side of the Len Weston Stand at one side of the pitch. This stand has an upper tier of seating that overhangs a lower tier of terracing.

The views from this areas are a bit mixed as there is an annoying (but necessary) guardrail running along the front of the seated section, that could impede your view from the lower row of seats. Also, it is quite hard at times to see the near touchline. Entrance to the away section is to be found at the corner of Edgar Street and Blackfriars Street.

BYCAR

174 miles from Glanford Park, it will take approximately three hours and 20 minutes to journey from the Iron's stadium.

> Follow M180, M18 and M1 to A42 in Leicestershire. Take the A42 exit from M1

> Continue on the A42 and follow M42 and M5 to Whittington Rd in Worcestershire. Take exit 7 from M5

>Follow A4440 and A4103 to Edgar St/A49 in Hereford

> Turn left (A49), with the ground on the left.

CAR PARKING

There is a large pay and display car park at the ground, which on Saturday afternoons costs £1 per hour or £5 for over four hours. Across from the entrance to the away section is the Old Market Multistorey car park which charges £4 for three hours, or £6 for four hours.

ALTERNATIVE

Hereford Railway Station is located around three-quarters of a mile away from Edgar Street or a 15 minute walk. It is served by trains from Manchester Piccadilly, Birmingham New Street and Cardiff Central. There is likely to be a train strike on the day of this fixture.

FACILITIES

There is a club bar at the ground itself called Radfords. This is open before and after the game and normally welcomes away fans, except for certain high profile fixtures. This small bar enjoys views across the ground and serves real ale from the Wye Valley Brewery.



WARRINGTON TOWN

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 25TH, 2023 - 3PM KICK-OFF

The Iron welcome Warrington Town to Glanford Park on Saturday for the third of three back-to-back home games.

The game will be the first meeting between the two teams in their histories, as has been the case for many of United's encounters so far this campaign.

Going into this evening's round of fixtures, Warrington sit in 11th position with 25 points from their 17 games, with one or two games in hand in comparison with a number of other sides across the division.

The Yellows commenced their campaign on their travels by smashing the Iron's opponents tonight Southport, with the result followed up with 2-0 home defeat against Blyth Spartans.
