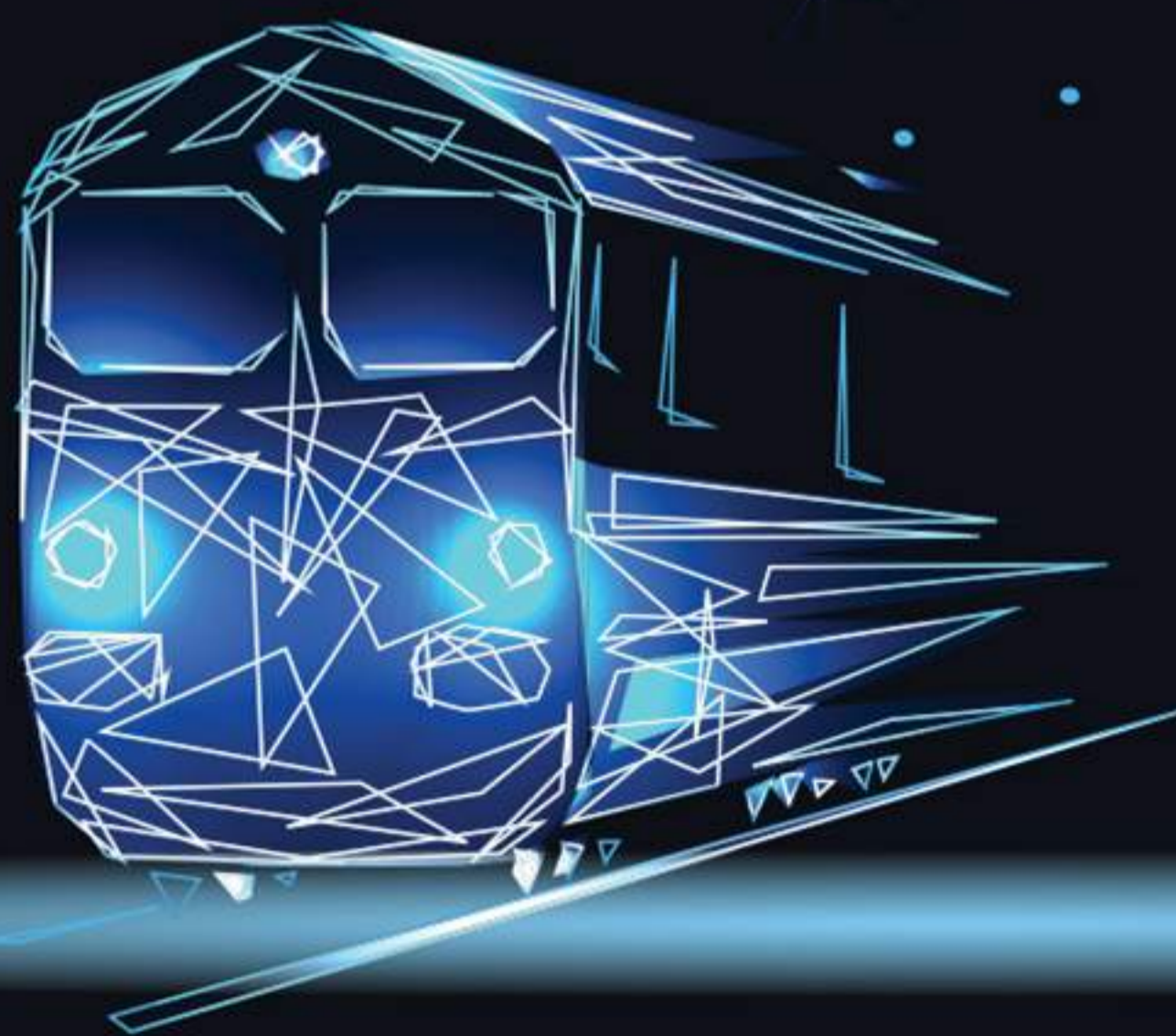

JIMMY DEAN

First team manager Jimmy Dean writes his latest set of notes...



Good evening and welcome back to Glanford Park for another game under the lights, as we welcome Spennymoor Town.

Despite not being at the last home game against Brackley Town, due to the operation that I had, it was fantastic to be able to watch it, and for the winning goal from Jacob to be scored in front of the fantastic crowd. To get over 5,000 supporters for the occasion was monumental, and we can only ask for that to continue as we move forward. It was vitally important to get the three points as well. Brackley proved to be difficult opposition over the course of the three games we've played them, but we definitely won the game that we would have preferred to win, getting points on the board, rather than progression in the FA Cup.

It was great to be back in the building for the first time just over a week ago. It was great to see the staff, both backroom and behind the scenes, and it was great to see the players again. Chris Plummer and the staff have done fantastic in my absence and I thank everyone for what they've done while I've not been here.

Saturday at Chester was disappointing for us. While it was great to be back at a live game again, it was a poor day for us. At 0-0, we had another big decision go against us, and if Boycey's goal counts and isn't wrongly flagged offside, we go 1-0 up and it's a different game. Soon after, we hit the bar, but then a mistake saw us go 1-0 down and we never really got back into the game after that. It ended up being a poor day all round.

It was another superb following from you again. 450 tickets sold out in hours of them going on sale. I've no doubt we could have taken double that amount too. It was never enough, but with Chester having capacity restrictions, credit to them for giving us that many.

Tonight is a quick opportunity for us to bounce back against a side who have made a really positive start this season, sitting second. Their game was called off at the weekend, so they'll be fresher, but we are at home, and we know how special we can make these games at Glanford Park, particularly under the lights.

Behind the scenes, Michelle is doing an amazing job, but she is going to need your help. She's taken on an awful lot here, and she's done it to make sure this community has got a football club.

There's a big financial burden at her door, and I really know she needs the support of everyone. If you've got spare money to support our club, we need you to do it to help get us through these times.

She will find a way. She's a resilient lady. She stood up when no one else was going to. She needs help now, not just backing, from our fanbase to keep us moving and keep us going.

Win, lose or draw come and support us - especially in the next few months while the club makes some adjustments to put itself in a more sustainable model. She's picked up a baton and it's a really heavy one, and she is going to need that support from everyone to make sure we're okay. There's no doubt in my mind that she will get that.

FOCUS ON... JACOB BUTTERFIELD

We continue our interviews with the Iron squad this season by talking to matchwinner from our last home game, Jacob Butterfield...



Is he left-footed? Is he right-footed? Does he even know?! It's a question a number of people have asked over recently weeks, as he interchanges between both for corners, free-kicks and general play in the game.

A product of Manchester United's academy, he will have been encouraged to work on his weaker foot without doubt, but has so much practise lead to him not having a stronger, or preferred foot to kick with?

"As of now, I'm both footed," he stated.

"Naturally, I was right-footed, but I worked on both as a kid as much as possible - kicking a ball against a wall really; right, left, right, left and grew in confidence on my left. Over the years, I've worked on it, and now I'm equally as comfortable on either side, which is a nice skill to have. It's unique, you

don't see it much in football throughout the leagues (taking a free-kick or corner with either foot). It took a lot of practise and it's one that always fascinates people really. I've played with a few lads who are really good on both feet, but to be able to do set pieces is a nice tool to have.

"Earlier in my career, I've set up different and changed, because a goalkeeper sets his wall dependent on the way it is setting up. On the pitch, you can move the ball quick off either side and it makes you

unpredictable. The whole pitch becomes available to you. Players that are predominantly one-footed, you expect them to go one way, rather than the other way. It's definitely something that has helped me in my career. I'm a technical player and not the most physical in terms of stature and running ability."

There's no secret that in the summer, Butterfield was assessing his options. With aspirations to potentially play higher up in the pyramid, he returned to the club at the start

of pre-season, and has been dedicated to the cause ever since. Speaking about his decision to be openly keeping his options open, he said: "Since I've been at the club, there's been a lot of turnaround and it's been chaotic really. With us dropping down a level, just naturally as a player, I wanted to be open with everyone at the club and say I'm going to explore what potential options I could have.

"I wanted to be transparent and honest, and if something that I really fancied came up that excited me and suited me, I could potentially look to pursue it. At that point, as well, with the club going down and such a turnover of players, it was uncertain what this season was going to be like. There was so much going on.

"The intention behind it all was to be open and honest. It was probably the same for the majority of players. That's how football works. I did have some options, but because Scunthorpe did their business early, and I kept in contact with the manager and people at the club. As things geared up towards pre-season, it felt like things were going to be good here and I wanted to help move the club forward again. I've always enjoyed it since I came through the door. I never wanted to leave for any reason.

"I wanted to stay and help the club turn things around, and help the club get back to where they should be. I'm at the later stages of my career now, and if I could be part of something like that at a club like this, it would be a good thing to do.

That decision could have been questioned by himself in stages already this season, but with new owners at the helm, Butterfield is confident staying with the Iron has been a positive one.

"It's been a real rollercoaster hasn't it, in terms of what's been happening. It's been mental. Obviously now, with new owners, it feels like we've got good people who want the best for the club. I think it's important that the ground is secured. It's easy for me to say



that - but I know it's not, it's complicated. There's a lot to go through, but it's the heart and soul of the club. Everything works through here, it's in Scunthorpe, it's where the fans have all their memories, so I think that it is vitally important for the future of the football club that we secure this ground, and then I think we can move forward and get ourselves back up the leagues."

Alluding to it briefly before, the next topic of discussion was what aspirations the midfielder has for the remainder of his career, and what comes next. With a career predominantly in the



Championship, Butterfield has looked to coaching as his next progression when the time comes to move away from playing.

“I feel good now. I feel like I’ve got more years left in me, so I’m not looking to hang them up anytime soon. I want to carry on playing and I still enjoy playing. I think it might be one of them, where your body tells you and you know. I feel far from that at the minute. I’m still enthusiastic, still motivated and still enjoying it, and I’ll carry on playing as long as I feel that way.”

“I do look back at my career, things that I’m proud of and things that I look back and learn from. I try to weigh it up. I’ve played football since I was six-years-old, so it’s been a massive part of my life. I’ve had a decent career, played at some good clubs, and had tonnes of great experiences. I’ve had a good life, so I owe a lot to football, and I’m grateful for everything it’s given me.”

“Coaching is probably next. I do love the game, and I’ve always felt like I’d stay in the game. I’ve started them, this year, putting the first steps in. I’ve got two young kids at home, I’ve got family at home, so I don’t want to spread myself too thin. Time-wise and effort-wise and energy-wise, I want to focus on my football and the kids as much as possible, but I know that it’s important to do that in the background to keep it ticking over ready for when I finish playing.”

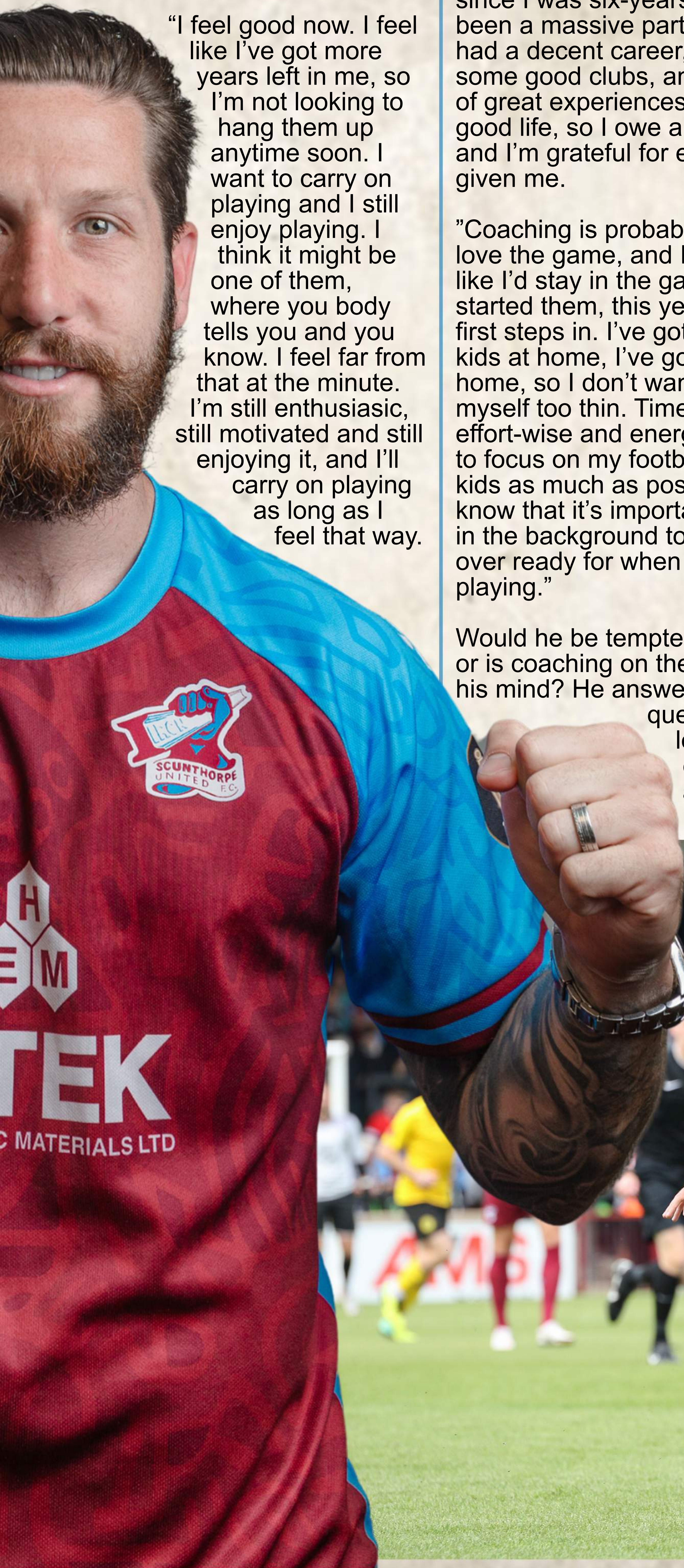
Would he be tempted to manage, or is coaching on the forefront of his mind? He answered that

question next: “A lot of my ex-teammates and players have had

huge aspirations to be a manager and they’ve gone straight in to be a manager, or an assistant.

“I’ve always felt for me, coming through Manchester United’s academy, which is a very good academy, and I think it’s very important to learn your craft a little bit. I want to get to know myself as a coach, and develop my skills. If I did ever move into management, I’d want to be confident that I was ready for it and do it the right way. I can see myself doing an academy coaching role initially, and if I’m good - which remains to be seen - I possibly would have a go at management. Having playing, that’s really where the excitement and adrenaline comes in. Playing for three points, playing in stadiums in front of fans where it really means something. That’s really what excites people, hence why so many players want to straight into first team management to get that buzz every Saturday.

“I’ve offered little bits and pieces, probably more so this season. In no way, shape or form have I made any decisions, but I’m more their voice on the pitch.”

I've done it a little bit under other coaches too, it's just conversations really. That voice on the pitch can try to influence things out there, and make sure we are doing things as we should tactically. As I've got older, I've been more interested in that side. I always think about it, and try to analyse why a manager is doing something, or what he's seen, or what he wants it to look like."

The match-winner the last time out at Glanford Park, Butterfield was the man of the moment on a memorable day at Glanford Park against Brackley Town in front of over 5,000 spectators.

Speaking after the game, he reacted to the day: "A lot of fans turned up. It was a great atmosphere and we marked it with a win. We've not had one for a few weeks as there has been a lot going on around the



club. However, it just felt it was about the football only on Saturday and we got the win.

"It was a good performance against a decent team at this level, so we're really pleased."

Talking about his 61st minute free-kick which decided the game, he said: "We spoke in training on Friday, between the coaching staff and a few of us, about maybe moving the ball around rather than taking a direct free-kick, but I just assessed it and had a go, and hit it perfectly to be honest. It's one of them, where you know when you've hit it.

"We were pretty dominant throughout to be honest but the goal came at a good time."

Talking about Brackley, he added: "At this level, you'd expect them to be amongst the top four or five come the end of the season.

"We weren't at our fluent best and could probably play slightly better, but to get the clean sheet was important too. We were solid throughout."

Assessing the wider picture in general, the seasoned campaigner said: "It's been tough and not right that people are worried about the future of the club. There have been lots of meetings and it feels like the focus hasn't been on the football, but hopefully now we can focus on what we're here to do and get a positive end result.

"(What has happened in the last couple of weeks) shows what the club means to people, and we need to start moving forward again and make it the club it once was so it can prosper again in the future.

"We've got a good squad and there's no reason why we can't be successful now."

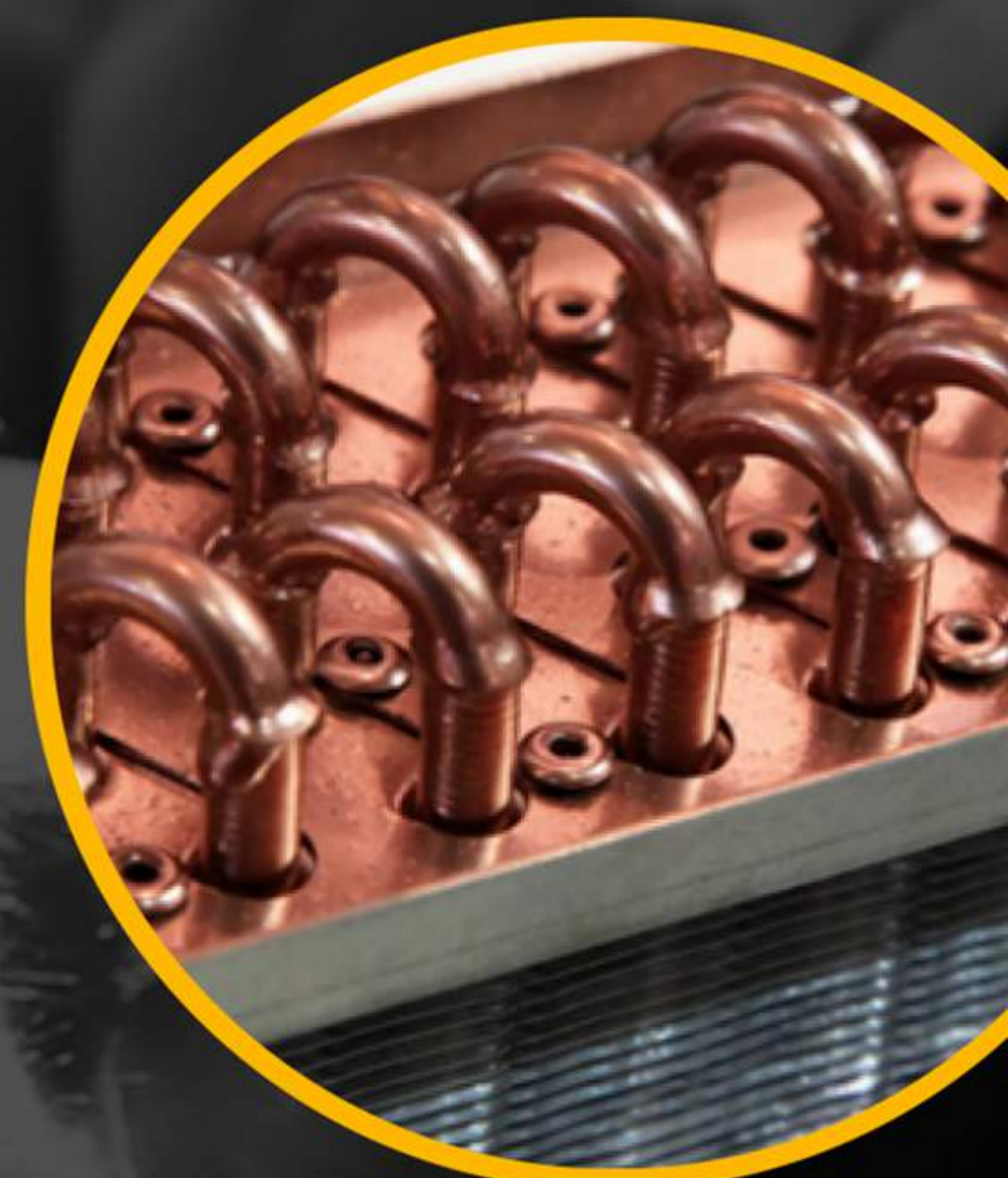

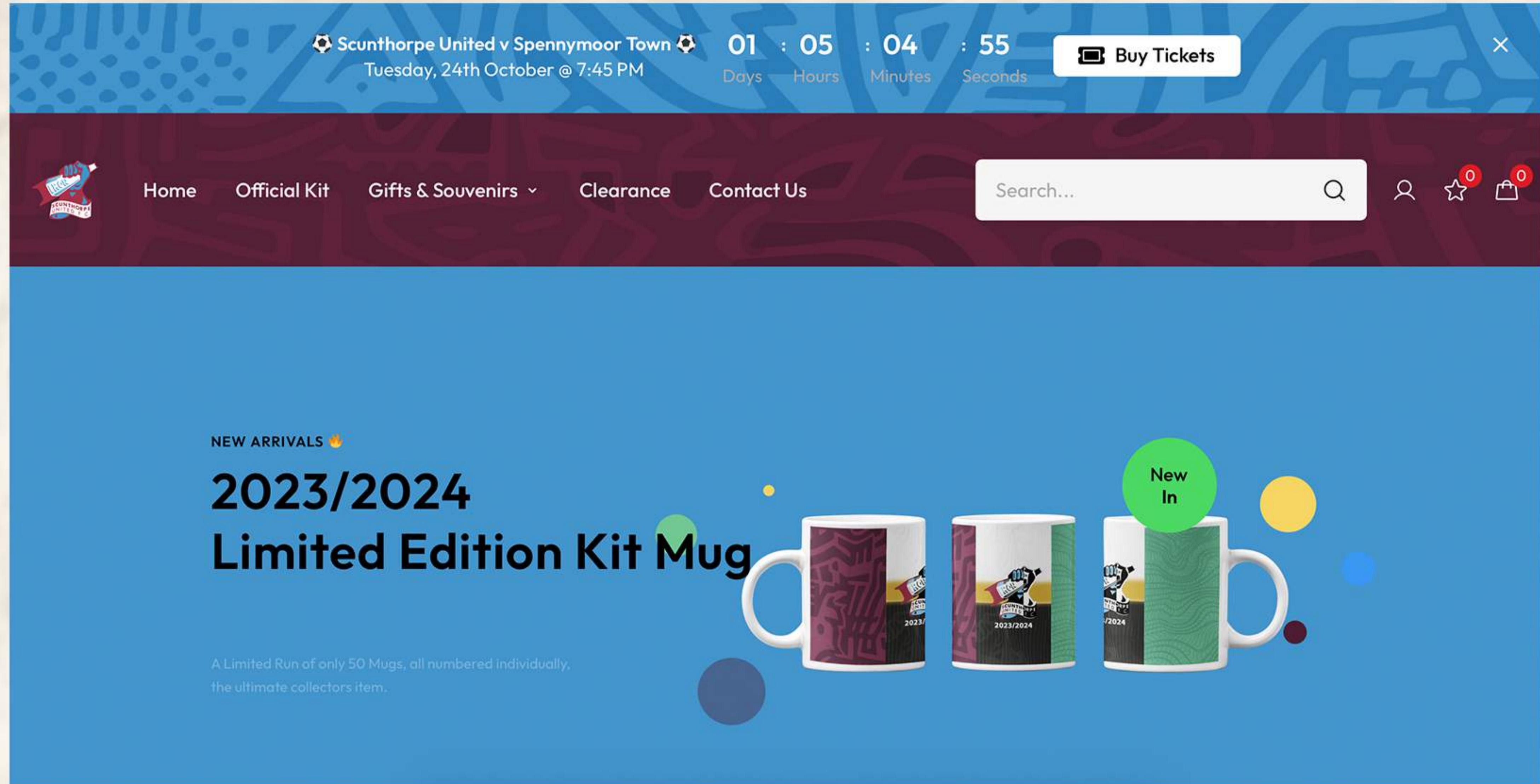
Jake Pullan continues our monthly round-up of the players away from Glanford Park on loan, as we enter the third month of the campaign.

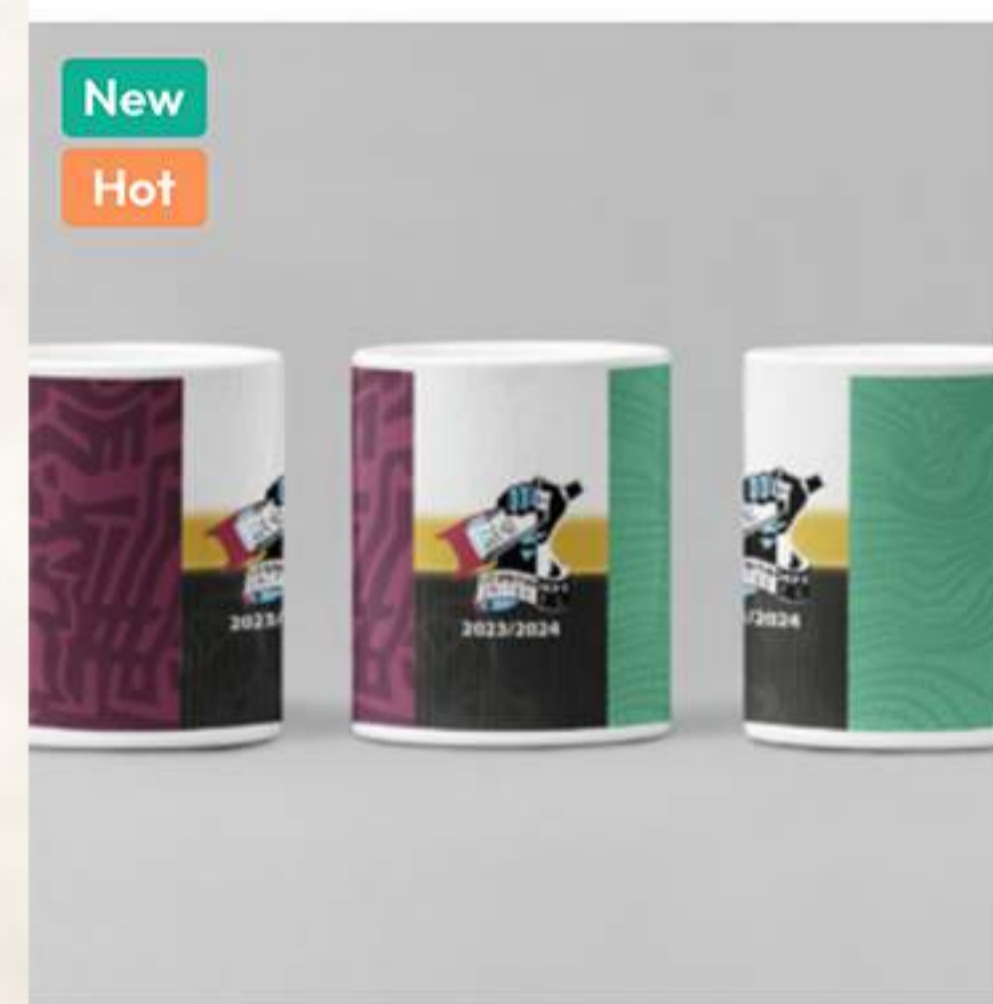

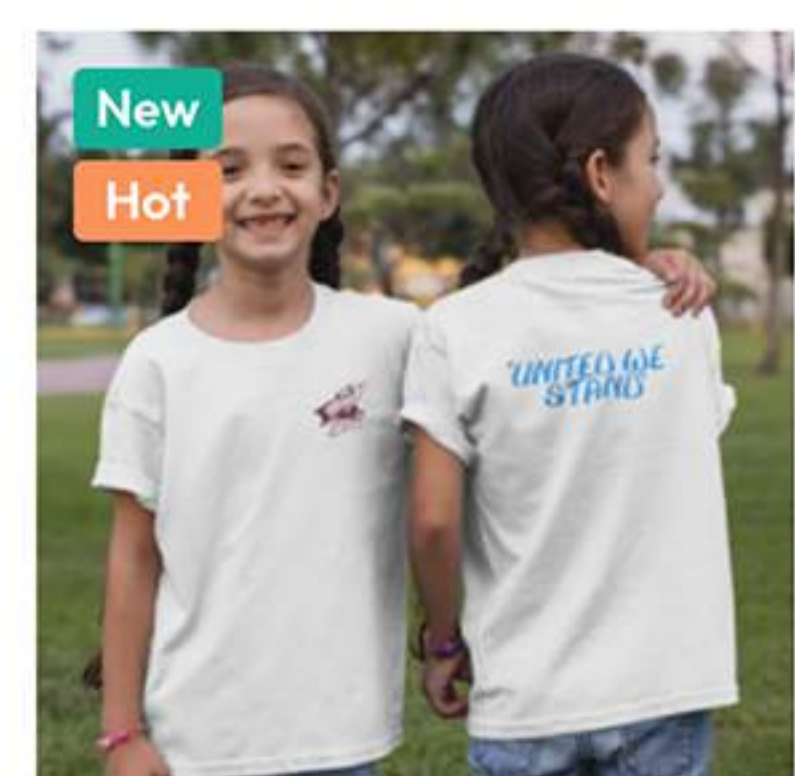

TWO IN THE LEAGUE AND FA CUP

TOUGHER TESTS WITH MAGPIES AND THE BLUE BOY

Historian John Staff continues his 100-year rewind, looking back at 1923-24

The 1923-23 season had started with two draws and two defeats for Scunthorpe United, and with spiralling debts, compounded by repayments on rebuilding a stand that was only a couple of years old, after a destructive blaze, prospects looked decidedly grim for the Lincolnshire Club.

Added to that, Shem Hill, a popular player of more than a decade, had decided that he should retire following injury problems.

However, the new stand was now completed, and was a structure of note and prominence on the West side of the ground. Two players had been sold to pay off some of the debt, with replacements filling in the gaps. On the field of play, after that dismal beginning, Sutton and York City had been beaten in the Midland League, while expected progress over Grimsby Rovers and Cleethorpes Town brought advancement in the FA Cup. All four consecutive victories had been at the Old Show Ground, and supporters could look forward to two more episodes at home, up the Clayfield Road, what is now heralded as Doncaster Road.

The next team to try their strengths against the Nuts was Notts County, the Midland League leader. They had won all of the seven Midland League matches played so far, including subduing Scunthorpe United 4-1 at Meadow Lane. It was a stiff test for the Nuts, and so the directors selected what was the best eleven available, and consisted of the following: Reynolds, goalkeeper; Bradbury and Hargreaves, full-backs; Skull, Crooks and Blenko, halfbacks; Lawton, Burkinshaw, Kitchen, Raby and Foster, forward. Of these Scunthorpe players,

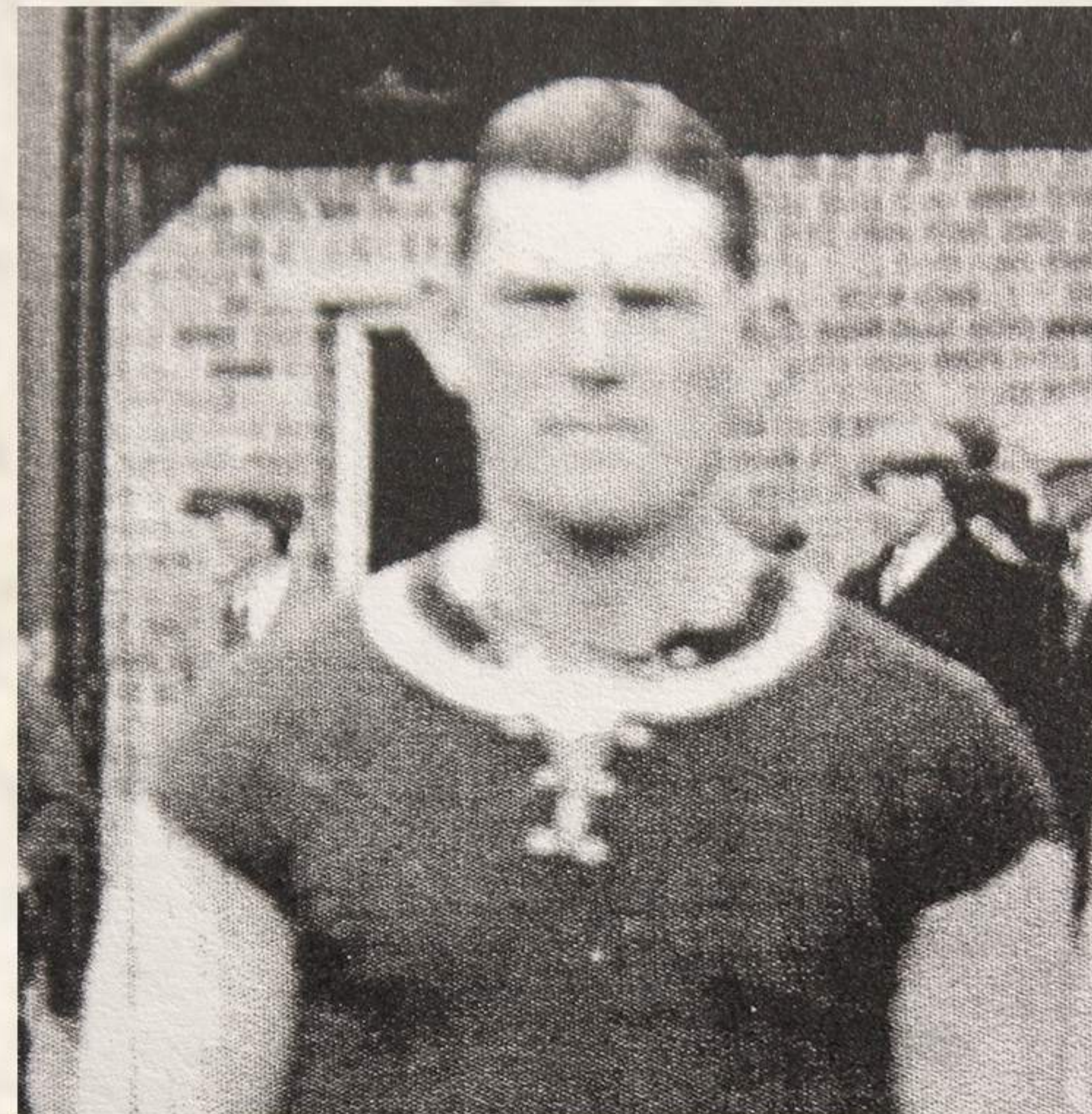
outside right, Lawton, was a first team debutant from the second eleven.

When the game kick-off there was a battle royal, with Scunthorpe playing their smartest football of the campaign. Every part of the field functioned to cut out the constant threat of an excellent Nottingham side, firing on all cylinders. During the ninety minutes, there might not have been any goals to declare, but goal mouth incidents mad this a memorable game to be savoured. Even then, reports suggested the home forwards were far more dangerous, with Josh Burkinshaw the best on display. In defence, Bradbury and Hargreaves were in great form, and Frank Skull played as a tower of strength. It was certainly felt as though the performance was like a win.

However, there was a sight at the game which brought a great roar of laughter, for the pig being raffled in support of the new stand broke free, and had to be chased round the pitch, until being captured.

A FA Cup-tie hat-trick for Joe Kitchen

With this thrilling instalment on the board, thought turned to Saturday's forth coming FA Cup match with Gainsborough, and the usual derby rivalry. The team selection saw some changes, which would booster the side.

At centre-half, Richard Ashmore, a Doncaster player was given the reins, and at left half local boy, Ernest Millson, was preferred. These two men would cement their seats on the bus for the rest of the season, and become the incumbent for those positions.

It was not surprising to see every corner of the Old Show Ground packed, as five thousand spectators roared the combatants onto the park. Gate receipts of £238 6s 9d was a bonus, and not far from a record. Scunthorpe United's men were soon to put an early grip on the game, with a by Frank Skull on ninety seconds. Foster's effort was repelled, but the ball dropped to the Scunthorpe right half. He steadied himself and punted a shot at goal, which looked to be covered, but went through the keeper's hands, over his head, and nestled in the back of the net.

Scunthorpe United had Notts County, the League leaders, as opponents at home to-day. The County had won seven matches in succession, but they made five changes for this afternoon, such notable players as Pape, McPherson and Platts being absent. The United had only one change, this being

Kitchen. Streets here showed masterly anticipation when he jumped out and caught the ball and punted it well away. Cook was responsible for one of the best shots so far when from 20 yards range he brought Reynolds to his knees when dealing with a shot which hardly left the ground. The United had a spell on the attack just before the interval, and when a free kick from Foster had been cleared

charmed life. Burkinshaw may have missed a penalty, but he was reckoned to be the best forward. Gainsborough's forward line was hardly in evidence, and only tested Reynolds for the first time, with ten minutes left on

The blue boy of Gainsborough was always in the game at 1-0 down, and despite playing second fiddle, could have snatched an undeserved equaliser to level the tie, and force a replay. Any chance of this happening was dispelled with a few minutes left, when Kitchen seized the ball near the centre line and cleverly beat two fullbacks, then unleashed a shot which had 'goal' written all over it, from the moment it left his boot.

A 2-0 victory was all that Scunthorpe deserved. The result had earned another home tie, and Boston would have to respond to the Nuts in dispute of the next passage.

We take a look at this evening's opponents Spennymoor Town, who are high-flying in the Vanarama National League North, sitting second...



A BRIEF HISTORY

Spennymoor Town FC was born in the summer of 2005 following the demise of both UniBond Premier Division club Spennymoor United AFC and Northern League Second Division club Evenwood Town FC.

The club was originally formed in 1904, chiefly at the instigation of local councillor and businessman Thomas Grant, who negotiated use of the Brewery Field, used previously by Tudhoe Rugby Club. Spennymoor United were six times Northern League Champions, four times winners of the old North Eastern League, on 16 occasions Durham Challenge Cup holders.

They reached the FA Cup first round 18 times, twice the second and in 1937 at West Brom in front of a 23,000 crowd, the third. Spennymoor have since faced Wigan Athletic, Tranmere Rovers, Chesterfield and Rotherham United in the same competition.

Spennymoor United also reached the semi-finals of the FA Trophy in 1978 (the first North East and the only Northern League side to do so), won the Northern League Cup

five times, JR Cleator Cup, Northern Counties East Premier Division and the UniBond League Cup.

A portfolio of players have played for the club and moved onto the Football League over the years - in particular, Johnny Dixon who captained Aston Villa in their 1957 FA Cup Final victory over Manchester United. Meanwhile, John Collins – the father of comedian Frank Skinner – also played for the club just before the Second World War.

Following the Northern League's decision not to be part of the pyramid, Spennymoor joined the Northern Counties East League and won the Championship at their second attempt in 1993 for promotion to the UniBond First Division. Promotion was secured on the last day of the season with a victory over Ashton United in front of a near 1,000 Brewery Field crowd.

The same season, Spennymoor became the first club from the First Division to win the UniBond League Challenge Cup, beating Hyde United 3-1 in the Final at Harrogate Town.

Bad news followed at the end of the century when the club lost its main sponsor and faced two disastrous seasons without financial support and that told on the field as the club was relegated into the UniBond First Division. The club did, however, bounce back under the leadership of Jamie Pollock to gain promotion back into the Premier Division in 2003. The season afterwards, Moors were in the play-offs for entry into the newly formed Nationwide Conference North but lost 3-1 to Bradford Park Avenue. The Moors social club was burned to the ground in an arson attack on Christmas Day 2003 and, from then on, the club had no income. Despite the appointment of a new Chairman, things got worse.

In 2005 the club could not fulfil their fixtures and Spennymoor United AFC were removed from the UniBond League and the club sadly went out of existence after 101 years of senior soccer.

An integral and well-established part of Spennymoor Town's defence, Curtis joined the club from Gateshead in the summer of 2016 after making 596 appearances for The Tynesiders.

7. Will Harris

Age: 27

Nationality: English

Position: Striker

Young front man Harris joined Spennymoor Town in the summer of 2023 following his departure from National League outfit Gateshead.

The South Shields born striker was on the books at Burnley and Hebburn Town during his youth before earning a move to Sunderland in 2020. He spent two years with the Black Cats, making his senior debut in a Papa John's Trophy game against Lincoln City in October 2021 and earned a further five first team appearances.

A loan spell at Barrow followed for the robust and hard-working attacker, before he was snapped up by Gateshead following his release by Sunderland in 2022.

So far this campaign Harris has excelled and leads the way in the National League North scoring charts with eight goals so far.

His debut campaign in Moors colours proved hugely successful as the vastly experienced centre-back scooped both the Manager's Player of the Season and the Players' Player of the Season awards. An important figure on and off the pitch Curtis was awarded the captains armband ahead of the 2020-21 season.

27. Josh Doherty

Age: 27

Nationality: English

Versatile defender Doherty became Moors eighth summer signing of 2023 following his departure from South Shields. The Northern Irish left-back started his career with his local club Ards before earning a move to England with Watford in 2012. He'd also go on to play for Leyton Orient and Crawley Town where he we made almost 100 appearances over the years years.

19. Keenan Ferguson

Age: 31

Nationality: English

The talented youngster spent time in the Academies of Sheffield United and Tottenham Hotspur in his younger days before earning a deal at Boston in 2021. A mainstay in The Pilgrims' line-up throughout his time there, Ferguson is comfortable operating in either full-back position and has the ability to get forward and provide crosses into the box.

MIDFIELDERS

11. Mark Anderson

Age: 34

Nationality: English

A long-serving midfielder, he has been with Moors since January 2016 and has become a firm favourite with supporters, signing a new contract during the summer. Anderson became a reliable supply of goals from midfield, and he helped himself to an impressive 13 as Moors won a second successive

promotion in 2016-17. A former Sunderland youngster, Anderson moved to the USA in 2010 where he began his professional career with Fort Lauderdale Strikers in 2012, where he remains fondly remembered after scoring 19 goals in 65 appearances.

8. Sam Fielding

Age: 24

Nationality: English

York-born Fielding came through the ranks with his hometown club but his eye-catching performances for York City earned him a move to Barnsley in 2017. The midfield star then spent a season on the books of ambitious Salford City before making a return to York in time for the 2021-22 campaign.

4. Callum Ross

Age: 29

Nationality: English

Most comfortable in a deep lying central midfield berth, Ross had spent the previous three years at Mariners Park where his performances had made him a big favourite with supporters. Prior to that, the midfield man had spent time in America and played for

Wingate Bulldogs during his studies before making the step up to star for Charlotte Independence and Oklahoma City Energy.

23. Owen Gallacher

Age: 24

Nationality: English

Pacy front man Gallacher joined Moors in the summer following the expiry of his Grimsby Town contract. The youngster was on the books at both Newcastle United and Nottingham Forest at the start of his career before a loan spell at Harrogate Town was followed by a permanent switch to Burton Albion.

9. Glen Taylor

Legendary front man Glen Taylor has not only written himself into Spennymoor Town history in recent years but also carved out a reputation as one of the hottest properties in non-league, with over 100 Moors goals to his name.

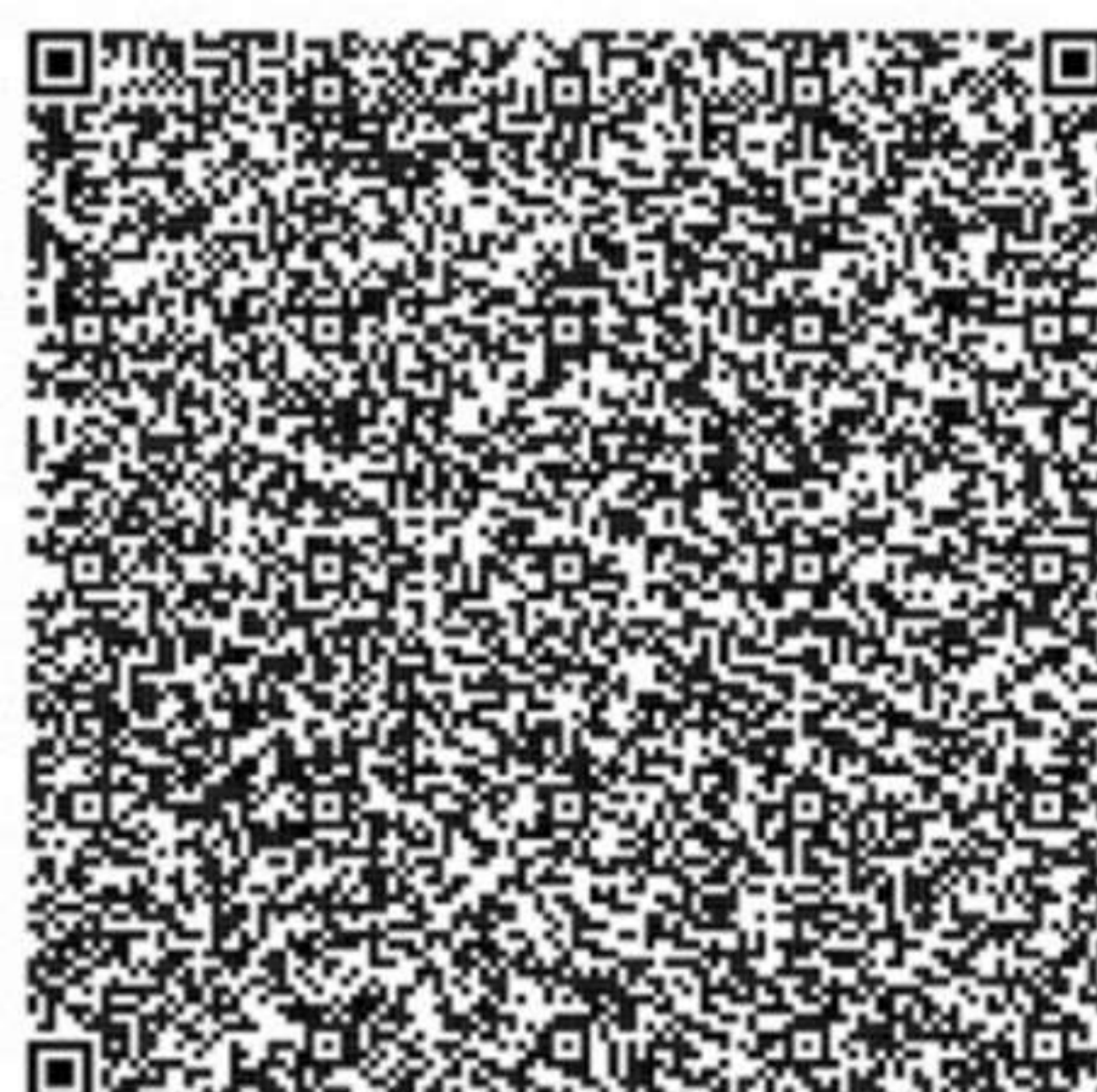

The Iron are set to travel to Boston United for a highly anticipated Halloween clash between the two Lincolnshire based clubs.

This tie has been rescheduled to this given date due to the Pilgrims' advance into the FA Cup Fourth Qualifying Round in which they were defeated by Worksop Town 3-2 at the Sandy Lane Ground.

THE STADIUM

The tie against the Pilgrims will take place at the Jakemans Community Stadium, with Boston United hoping to continue their positive start to the league season where they sit 11th place and have obtained a total of 17 points due to some convincing team displays.

Last season Boston fell short toward the end of the campaign, starting well and cementing themselves in and around the play-offs for the term's majority, this was until the sale of some key players to National League outfits caused them to slowly slide down the table and meant

they were only able to gain a 15th place finish.

The Pilgrims have undergone a ground change in recent years as they moved into the Jakemans Community Stadium in 2020, leaving their former stadium York Street to be in search of new inhabitants.

The stadium holds a capacity of 5,061 of which 2,155 are seated. The Iron have been allocated 600 tickets for the fixture which will be the first encounter between the sides at the new venue.

BY CAR

70 miles from Glanford Park, it will take around one hour and 40 minutes to journey to from the Iron's stadium.

> Take M180 towards Grimsby and take the A15 turn-off heading towards Lincoln

> Take the exit to A17 and then A1121 to Pilgrim Way in Wyberton.

> At the final roundabout take, the 1st exit onto Pilgrim Way.

CAR PARKING

The parking spots available at the stadium are for corporate and season permit holders. There is plenty of on-street parking is available in the surrounding area.

ALTERNATIVE TRAVEL

The nearest railway station to the Jakemans Community Stadium is located in Boston.

It would take around five minutes on a taxi from the railway station to the ground.

It is around a 35-minute walk for those who do not want to use a taxi.

FACILITIES

There are no pubs relatively close to the stadium but food and drinks are served within the ground.

A wide range of hot and cold snacks and beverages will be available at The Jakeman's Community Stadium.

BISHOP'S STORTFORD

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 28TH, 2023 - 3PM KICK-OFF

The Iron next host a league fixture at the weekend where they will face Bishop's Stortford at Glanford Park to end October's home fixtures.

The fixture is set to be an enticing one, with the Blues stepping onto unknown soil, as it will be the first competitive meeting between two sides which has, and will be, a recurring theme over the course of the National League North season.

Bishop's Stortford earned promotion into the Vanarama National League North last season after gaining promotion from the Isthmian League Premier Division and narrowly snatching the title from challengers Hornchurch before the term's end. The Blues have competed numerous times at Step Two of non-league but have plied their trade in the National League South, but this year have been allocated to the Northern section of the step as a result of being the 24th most northerly team.

So far this term, the Blues have struggled to adapt to life within the league as they sit 22nd having amassed 10 points from their opening 13 fixtures. Despite the recent form of four straight defeats, Bishop's Stortford began the season with a positive 2-0 opening day victory at Woodside Park against the highly tipped Chester. Since then, the Blues have only been able to obtain a further seven points which came from wins against strugglers Darlington and play-off hopefuls Boston.

They faced Warrington Town on Saturday, losing 4-1 at home, with the game slipping away from them when they were reduced to ten men.
