### The Iron's manager pens his latest notes as we welcome Sutton United to the Sands Venue Stadium for the first time today...

**Good afternoon and welcome to the Sands Venue Stadium for our second home game of the season, taking on Sutton United this time around. I extend that to Matt Gray, his players, staff, officials and all their fans visiting us for the first ever time today.**

It's been a packed couple of weeks since my last set of notes, with the first of the matches coming against Swindon Town a fortnight ago. After an even first half during which we suffered two injury setbacks, we went ahead through a penalty from Lofty. The next ten minutes were important for us as we looked to hold onto our lead and build from that position, but they soon got a penalty themselves, then got another goal and saw the game out after seizing the momentum.

Since then, we've played three away games and the performances have got better by each match. We deserved more in the Carabao Cup at Barrow but were beaten by a great finish, although we could have dealt with the long throw it came from better. We also had chances to be ahead before then, while we battled right up until the end to get a leveller.

At Rochdale, though it ended 0-0, it was a lively end-to-end game and our first clean sheet and point of the season. The lads worked so hard and we could have even nicked a result at the

end. It was brilliant to see over 400 of you there, spurring the group on.

Despite having numerous players out by that point, the Walsall game saw an even better performance and I think all of the 200 fans who travelled on a Tuesday night despite the game being available to watch on iFollow will have gone home happy with the effort, aggression channeled in the right manner and endeavour they saw from us to keep battling, and finally get that equalising goal in the 90th minute through Beest.

It was a game from which we deserved more, and that performance and feeling of elation after scoring late on is a good springboard to go into the game today with. I'm sure you'll get behind the lads, I have no doubts they'll give everything they can and growing up as a supporter of the club, I know that's what you want to see - a team of characters who'll battle and give it a real good go. Hopefully we can get that first win at home in front of you, our supporters, this afternoon.

### IRON COMPLETE JAKE SCRIMSHAW LOAN SIGNING

**Scunthorpe United is delighted to have completed the signing of striker Jake Scrimshaw on a season-long loan from Championship side Bournemouth.**

The 20-year-old's move to the Sands Venue Stadium is subject to EFL ratification and he will take the No 18 shirt. The forward joined Bournemouth in 2015 and has since experienced time out on loan with Poole Town, Eastleigh and, more recently, fellow Sky Bet League Two outfits Walsall and Newport County, where he made ten starts in total and scored five goals.

First team manager Neil Cox told **iFollow Iron**: "We're over the moon to get him in. It's been a long one and that's understandable as things have to be done right, and he's been involved in their squads and playing games.

"He's a centre forward who wants to play on the shoulder and run in behind, and wants to be in the penalty box to score goals. We'll be patient with him and encourage him but I'm sure he'll be an excellent signing for us."





### SEASON STARTS WITH LOSS TO SWINDON

After going ahead, the Iron were beaten 3-1 by Swindon Town in the Sky Bet League Two season opener a fortnight ago.

After a first half in which both sides had chances, the first goal came three minutes after the interval as Ryan Loft fired the Iron into the lead from the penalty spot.

Jack Payne's own spot kick levelled matters soon after, before Ben Gladwin's rocket and Harry McKirdy's tap-in won it for Ben Garner's side.

After a scrappy opening it was the visitors who had the game's first chances through McKirdy and Ellis landolo, but they struck just wide. Loft fired over the bar, while Alfie Beestin had an effort brilliantly saved before the break.

Scunthorpe debutant Tyrone O'Neill came off with a knee injury after half an hour, before Neil Cox was forced into another change at the break as goalkeeper Tom Billson was also withdrawn through a knee issue.

Loft won a penalty under the challenge of Jojo Wollcacott in the 48th minute, which he coolly fired home, whilst Payne equalised in the same vein nine minutes later after Kaine Kesler-Hayden was fouled.

Gladwin's unstoppable strike nestled into the far corner to give Swindon the lead in the 68th minute, before McKirdy sealed the points from close range after Tyreece Simpson's initial shot was parried. Prior to then, Loft and Devarn Green (twice) had come close.

Cox said afterwards: "They came right back at us with nothing to lose, and we defended poorly, losing the momentum to them. We didn't pass it well enough and weren't brave enough today.

"It was a disappointing second half performance really where we made a couple of



mistakes and it cost us the result on the day. We need to learn from it."

### IRON EXIT CARABAO CUP AT BARROW

Youngster Dimitri Sea's second-half stunner secured Barrow's Carabao Cup first round progression at the expense of United 11 days ago.

The hosts squandered a few first-half chances, with the returning Jamie Devitt forcing Rory Watson into a good save before Mark Ellis struck wide.

At the other end, Harry Bunn left Paul Farman stranded with a powerful strike.

Then, Ryan Loft was kept out by the hosts' keeper after doing well to find space to shoot, before Farman pulled off a great save to tip Myles Hippolyte's effort past a post.

The hosts took the lead five minutes into the second half as Ellis flicked on a long throw for Sea to slam an overhead kick into the roof of the net.

Watson kept the visitors in the game as he tipped debutant Offrande Zanzala's strike over the crossbar, while United probed late on and almost levelled through Tom Pugh and substitute Devarn Green.

"I'm disappointed with the result and the way we conceded the goal from a long throw, and a bit of a flick-on, although to be fair it was a great finish for an overhead kick," said Neil Cox.

"There was not too much difference in terms of possession, and we had some great opportunities in the first half with their goalkeeper making really good saves (from Loft and Hippolyte), and we had more chances to go in 1-0 or maybe even 2-0 at half-time but didn't take them."

## **SPECIAL IRON KIT TO REMEMBER RAY CLEMENCE MBE**

**Just before the new season started, Scunthorpe United announced details of a bespoke goalkeeper kit to be worn in honour of legendary goalkeeper Ray Clemence MBE this campaign.**



A traditional green colour with buttons and a collar, the design has been based on shirts back from when Ray began his incredible football career playing for the Iron back in the 1960's. The shirt has been produced by Macron and will be worn as the Iron's first choice goalkeeper kit for the duration of the 2021/22 season.

Ray, who went on to play for Liverpool, Tottenham Hotspur and England in a historic career, sadly died from prostate cancer in November last year after a long fight with the disease.

The club have also been granted permission to wear a special edition version of the shirt at a dedicated fixture to remember Ray on November 13th 2021 when the Iron host Salford City, which will be almost one year on from his passing.

Iron Chief Executive Officer, Leanne Mayo, said: "The fixture in November will be an opportunity for supporters to come together and show their respects to remember Ray, who was an important member of the Iron's football family as a former player and Vice President. Relatives of his family will be in attendance as guests of the board on the day, while we will also be partnering with Prostate Cancer UK, a charity Ray supported and one that his family continue to help raise awareness."

One man dies every 45 minutes from prostate cancer; it's the most common cancer in men in the UK and Ray worked tirelessly to promote the dangers of the disease as an ambassador for Prostate Cancer UK.

His son Stephen will be walking alongside Jeff Stelling in the Sky Sports presenter's latest March for Men to raise funds and awareness for Prostate Cancer UK. He will walk the third day which ends at Liverpool FC, the club Ray joined from the Iron in 1967.

He said: "Scunthorpe United always had a special part in my dad's heart and he never

forgot the special times he had at the club right at the start of his career, and we as a family are touched by this wonderful gesture from the club.

"Prostate cancer is devastating. It was something my dad suffered with for more than a decade and a half. We are an incredibly close family, and it was so hard for all of us seeing him suffer, but he never moaned, never complained. He was the strongest man I've ever known.

"I think prostate cancer is a subject that is more talked about now, thanks to dad, Jeff and many others. It's so important it stays on the agenda, and we are all aware of our risk. This disease affects one in eight men, one in four if you are black, and your risk intensifies if, like me, it's been in your family.

"I know what this disease can do to families. That's why the great work from Prostate Cancer UK must continue. There is a long way to go but I know vital progress continues to be made and it's brilliant that Scunthorpe are supporting that."

## **IRON PARTICIPATE IN EFL SEASON LAUNCH**

Speaking following the launch at the Sands Venue Stadium, Cox said: "It was brilliant to meet Chris and listen to his story about what he's trying to do for charity (Friends of Pakati).

"We're all looking forward to fans coming back in and hopefully filling the stadiums up, being safe, enjoying their day out and watching some football again. I can't wait for fans to come back in. We've definitely missed them."

Meanwhile, Chris added: "I can't wait, I've got my season ticket picked up and I'm really looking forward to coming back in. What's nice about it is I'll be seeing a lot of people that I've not seen for quite some time. What's going to be exciting this time is there are lots of new players that I've not seen play before."

# IRON ROUND-UP

## UNDER-18S KICK OFF SEASON WITH RESOUNDING VICTORY

The Iron's Under-18 side ensured their season got off to the perfect start a fortnight ago, as they defeated Bradford City 6-2 in the EFL Youth Alliance League.

The Iron took a deserved lead on 10 minutes through midfielder Jack Moore-Billam. The number seven cleverly reacted quickly to Cribb's initial effort which cannoned back of the post to convert the rebound.

Just 12 minutes later their lead was doubled with thanks again to some superb work down the right flank from Harvey Cribb. The full back's low cross flashed across the Bradford six-yard area only to be met and coolly converted by captain Ben Franklin.

The visitors then got themselves back into the game just five minutes later, a smart header from the Bradford right midfielder narrowly crossed the line despite the best attempts of Iron defender Oliver Lobley.

But the hosts restored their two goal advantage in the 20th minute, with Tyrell Sellars-Fleming notching after some good work in the area to keep the move alive from strike partner Harrison Poulter.

The goals then kept on coming for Tony Daws' side and on 35 minutes, Poulter stepped up to convert his first goal of this season, smashing a penalty low to the right of the Bradford keeper.

The same player scored again from the spot on 40 minutes and, just after half-time, a swift counter attack down the left hand side resulted in Poulter getting his season off to the perfect start, netting his hat-trick as he swept home at the back post to make it 6-1.

Bradford netted the last goal of proceedings, with the visitors finishing smartly following a well worked move down the right hand side.



# PLAYER INTERVIEW

# ALEX KENYON

**The experienced summer arrival from Morecambe talks about his and the Iron's start to the season, and how he's looking to make a big positive impression in claret and blue this season...**

Summer signing Alex Kenyon is pleased with the way he's settled into life at the Sands Venue Stadium and believes his team can only get better the more the players get used to one another.

The 29-year-old signed in June after eight years at Morecambe, and was one of eight summer additions by manager Neil Cox.

The seasoned campaigner, who has made more than 300 career appearances, believes there is more to come from the Iron and that there are elements to be encouraged by so far.

He said: "On a personal note, I'm happy to have started in the first three game, though unfortunately I had to come off on Saturday (at Rochdale) due to a hamstring issue.

"Unfortunately we haven't had that win just yet, but I'm sure it will come. The displays have got better in each of the games as we've gone along, so hopefully we can keep improving them and then that win will come. We will then look to kick on and go from there.

"I think there is a solid base there and we're all new to each other really, working on things and realising how each other plays, and working out one another's strengths. I think we'll get better as we go along.

"Just as an example, Thommo (Lewis Thompson) at left-back and Pughy (Tom Pugh) at right-back both made their league debuts against Swindon a fortnight ago, so for me we will only get stronger."

Looking ahead to this afternoon's match against EFL newcomers Sutton United, the midfielder knows it will be a battle but one Scunthorpe can come out on top of.

He said: "They came up last season, winning the National League and fully deserve their place. I'm sure they will put in a battling performance and they'll want to prove to everyone that they more than deserve to be in this league, and will give it a right good go. We have to stand up to that and take the game to them."

It's the first of three home games in the space of a week, including the Papa John's Trophy game against Manchester City U21s on Tuesday night, and an opportunity to lay down a marker at the Sands Venue Stadium.

Kenyon said: "Hopefully we can pick up some wins this week, as it will be fantastic for us - especially in front of the home fans."

Talking about his time at the club so far, he commented: "I'm enjoying it. The lads have helped me settle in well, while the staff have been class. It's been really enjoyable.

"It's a club that wants to improve on last season and finish as high as it can. Hopefully I can bring my experience and help all the lads out.

"I'm someone who will give 100 per cent every game and don't mind putting my foot or head where it hurts. I'll win the ball and keep it simple, but I'll give my all and put myself about. Hopefully that will come across to the fans that I'm that sort of player who will put everything into all I do.

"As soon as the gaffer called me about the move here, I was interested and it sounded like something that would be fantastic for me and hopefully I can show my qualities this season."

# SUTTON UNITED IN OPPOSITION



**Ryan Payne introduces us to a team making their first visit to our stadium, while also picking a star man and profiling the boss...**

It's an historic season for all those at Sutton United. Following last season's Vanarama National League title win, the club is now playing in the Football League for first time in their 123-year history.

After a 15th-placed finish in the fifth tier of English football during the curtailed 2019/20 season, Matt Gray's side went on to do the unthinkable the next season.

Finishing four points ahead of closest challengers Torquay United, the U's were crowned champions following a 3-0 win over Hartlepool United in May.

Now, they begin life in the fourth tier.

Manager Gray has already brought in new talent to bolster the squad ahead of the new campaign. Joe Kizzi joined from Bromley, Ricky Karboa signed from Northampton Town, and Alistair Smith swapped Altrincham for Sutton.

Also joining the U's were Donovan Wilson, Enzo Boldewijn, and Richie Bennett from Bath City, Notts County, and Stockport County respectively.



Ahead of a huge season for everyone at Gander Green Lane, pre-season started with a 2-0 victory away at Chesham United. A 4-0 win away at Haringey Borough was followed up by a fantastic 6-0 win over Brighton and Hove Albion Under-23s, before back-to-back defeats to Aldershot Town and Dartford. Sutton did end their pre-season campaign with a win, beating Barnet 2-1.

Sutton's first-ever Sky Bet League Two season started with an away trip to Forest Green Rovers, where a 91st minute goal from Forest Green's Ebou Adams broke hearts as Rovers finished as 2-1 winners. Following a 3-2 defeat to Cardiff City in the Carabao Cup, the U's picked up their first ever point in the Football League, drawing 0-0 away to Salford City at the Peninsula Stadium.

A memorable campaign is in store for Sutton United, as they embark on League Two for the very first time, and this is their first ever visit to the Sands Venue Stadium today.

## ONE TO WATCH: OMAR BUGIEL

The scorer of Sutton United's first-ever goal in the Football League, Omar Bugiel is the visitors' dangerman up front.

He began his youth career with 1860 Munich, before moving to England at the age of 16.

He was part of the youth system at Chichester City, before playing in non-league for Selsey, Burgess Hill Town, and Worthing.

Bugiel then moved to Forest Green, and was part of the side that won promotion to League Two during the 2016/17 season.

The 27-year-old joined Bromley on loan in January 2018, and signed for the side permanently after his release from Forest Green.

After a single season with the Ravens, the Lebanese international signed for Sutton. He played 37 times as the side were National League winners last season.

## MANAGER: MATT GRAY

As a player, Matt Gray performed at both Tottenham Hotspur and Cardiff City in his youth, before having spells at Barnet, Hayes, and Havant & Waterlooville. He retired at 25 due to injuries, and pursued a career in coaching.

His first such role was with Eastleigh, being the club's assistant manager. Gray also had stints in the same role at both Aldershot Town and Crawley, before joining Sutton's coaching team in December 2018.

After the departure of Paul Doswell in 2019, he was appointed interim manager for the final fixture of the 2018/19 season.

In May 2019, he became the club's full-time manager, guiding the side to a 15th-placed finish in his first season.

He became a club legend the following campaign, as he managed the side to the National League title and promotion out of non-league for the first time in their 123-year history.

Talking about the challenge ahead this term, he said: "We have recruited really well and still have time to get one or two more if needed. If I get the right group of players with ability, hunger, fitness and energy and we can get them organised with our style of play to hurt and also stop teams, it's a good recipe for success."




## IRON PICK UP FIRST POINT OF SEASON AT ROCHDALE

# EMMANUEL ONARIASE INTERVIEW

## Feeling the benefit of a full pre-season this time around, the central defender talks about his and the Iron's start to 2021-22...

### How pleased were you to get the first point on the board at Rochdale last Saturday?

She's been so good and has helped me a lot to get my recovery and sleep so I can perform to my best on the pitch day in, day out.

### How have you felt in the games you've played so far?

I've felt good in my body. I feel closer to 100 per cent compared to last season, having had a full pre-season. I'm feeling good and getting around the pitch better. I just need to keep building on that and stay fit. Last season was very stop-start for me, so I was happy to get through pre-season strong with all the fitness work, and I feel good and well.

### You had an operation at the end of last season, so how has your summer been?

I spent a lot of summer working on getting fit with my six week rehabilitation programme, so only had two weeks off. I was training with the physios and staff but I feel it's been a great benefit to me and I feel good. I'm thankful to the staff for getting me back ready and fit. I'm looking forward to staying on the pitch.


